Plymouth, June 29.

Hisday arrived here a Fleet of 26 fail of English Merchant ships from Galipolis and other placeq within the Streights, bound for London, *Tarmouth*, and other pirts; this morning they left two ships belonging to this Harbour off the Start; homewards bound from Smirna, with feveral others bound to the Bastwards.

Vienna, June 23. On Saulida fir the Avening Arrired fiers a thip from Landia 4, bringing, home the Body of the lately decealed Roveditor Extraordin ty Cavalier 6 at tarin Cornaro I this Vefiel departed from Candia about the 21th of May laft, co fi ming to us the former News of the Affaults made by the Vilier upon the Town 5 telling us, that the Captain General Morefini is within the Town, by his Courage and Vigilaricy encouraging the Garrifon to continue their defence; vifi ing all places with much diligence, and ordering and taking care for all eue reparations; changing the Guards as he finds occifion, the better to prevent any under-hand dealing, and private intelligence with the Enemy.

Adding that upon the arrival of the Brunfwick fuccors, the faid Captain General entertained the Captains and O'ficers with much relpect and honour, di'poling of the foldiers into convenient Quarters for their repole, and ordering them to be well familifit with all neceffary refreshments after their Voyage; that the foldiers feem with impatiency to define to flow their Valour upon the Enemy, by fome fally or other attempt, for which the General has promifed to give them a fair occasion a and that with this addictional force the Gatrifon is faid to confift of about 14 thousand able foldiers, a sufficient number (as 'cis hoped) to entertain the Visier upon any assaults i.e shall make upon it.
