Warfaw, March 4. N. S. The Cardinal Primate of Poland, and the Crown General, took their Leaves of the King this evening, in order to go to their Country Houses, and most of the Senators that are in Town are preparing to do the like. The Princes of the House of Sapieba have complained to the King, That notwithstanding the Agreement lately concluded with the Confederated Nobility of Lizhuania, the faid Nobility do still keep in Arms, and destroy the Houses and Estates of those who are in the Interests of Prince Sapieha; And according to the last Accounts from Lithuania, Prince Wisnowisky had got together near Gradno a confiderable Body of the Confederated Nobility, and expected a Reinforcement of Muscovites under the Command of the Sieur Oginsky, who upon the Defeat he received fome time ago from the Swedes, retired to Museowy to desire the Czar's Assistance. The King of Sweden continues to march this way with his Aimy; but 'tis faid he intends to stop upon the Frontiers, to receive the Ambaffadors who are fent to him on the part of the Re-publick, to fee if Matters can be brought to an Ac-

Firma, March 8. The Emperor declared yesterday the King of the Romans General silimo of his Forces on the Rhine, and that Prince Lewis of Basen should command under him. Several Regiments of Horse and Foot, which are to be employed in that Service, are marching thither from the Emperor's Hereditary Countries, and the other necessary Preparations are made with all possible diligence for an early Campagne. The 6. Regiments of Hulfarr lately ordered to be raifed are very near compleated, and 'tis said's of them will march to the Risine, and the other to Italy. It is reported, that Orders will flortly be given for demolifhing the Fortifications of Alia Regain, Agria, Cafeham, and iome other Places in Hungary, that the Forces which are in Garriton there may be more ultifully employed. They write from Intelly, that our Forces there have received confiderable Supplies of Provisions from the Countries of Finili and Crantia, and that a great quantity of C an and Hay is bought up for their use in the Pope's Territories.

Francfort, March 15. The Deputies of the Circles of Franconia, Smalia, and the Upper Rhine, are met at Norlingen to confult together about making Provision for their Common Safety and Defence. Prince Lewis of Baden has lately been to view the new Lines near Spires, and the Fortifications of Germersheim, near which last place 'cis faid a comiderable number of the Emperor's Forces will shortly be drawn together. The Imperial Troops which lay in the Brisgau are marching towards Philipsburgh; and the Forces of the Circles of Smalia and Franconia have Crders to be in a readiness to march. Guards are posted all along the Rhine, and all possible care is taken to prevent the carrying of any Hor-
