BY THE KING
A PROCLAMATION

IN ORDER TO THE ELECTING A PEER OF SCOTLAND.
GEORGE R.I.

Whereas the Right Honourable Archibald Alexander, Earl of Leven and Melville, was duly elected and returned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland to sit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and is since deceased: In order to the Electing a Peer of Scotland to sit in his room, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at the Palace of Holyroodhouse, at Edinburgh, on Tuesday, the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, at twelve o'clock Noon to nominate and choose a Peer of Scotland to sit and vote in the House of Peers in this present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, in the room of the said Archibald Alexander, Earl of Leven and Melville, deceased, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law); and the Lord Clerk Register or the Principal Clerk of Session or, in the absence of both these Officers from any cause, such person as may be designated for the purpose by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, is hereby required to attend such Meeting, and to take the Votes of the said Peers, and immediately after such Election made and duly examined to certify the Name of the Peer so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Ten Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such Election.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this eleventh day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, and in the eleventh year of Our Reign.

PRESENT

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st

day of May, 1947 (N.3392/47) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider it necessary to improve the provision of shorthand facilities in the Fleet and in Shore Establishments by the creation of a new branch in the Royal Navy to be known as the Stenographer Branch:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty by Your Order in Council may be graciously pleased to give Your sanction accordingly, the rates of pay for men of the new branch to be in accordance with those sanctioned in Your Order in Council dated 26th June 1946:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (which is a Section in Part XI of that Act) it is (amongst other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council fix the establishment to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities on account of the services of lighthouses, buoys and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of those establishments:

And whereas by Section 738 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is (amongst other things) enacted that where His Majesty has power under that Act or any Act thereafter to be passed amending the same to make an Order in Council, His Majesty may from time to time make the Order in Council and by Order in Council revoke, alter or add to any Order so made:

And whereas by Section I of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (amongst other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas, by the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1936 (printed in the London Gazette 14th July, 1936), as varied by the Northern Lighthouse Board (Variation of Establishment) Order, 1941 (printed in the London Gazette 14th October, 1941) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), the Establishment to be maintained by the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the salaries to be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund in respect of that establishment were duly fixed:

And whereas it is expedient that the sums so fixed to be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund to the holder of the post of Secretary, Deputy Secretary and Accountant respectively should be altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of Section I of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him as aforesaid and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf and by and with the advice of His Privy Council doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1947, and shall come into operation on the date of publication in the London Gazette.

2. In place of the salary specified in the principal Order for the holder of the post of Deputy Secretary and Accountant respectively the salary shall be £825 per annum rising by annual increments of £30 to a maximum of £1,060 and £680 per annum rising by annual increments of £25 to a maximum of £840 respectively.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal Order the salary specified in this Order for the post of Deputy Secretary and Accountant respectively may be paid to the present holders of the said posts as from the 1st May, 1943.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal Order, the salary of Mr. J. Glencorse Wakelin, C.B.E., at present Secretary, shall be £1,650 per annum with effect from the 1st January, 1946.

5. The sums payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

6. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

COUNTY COURT, ENGLAND, FUND RULES.

1. 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

TEMPORARY (RECONSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS FOR FILLING VACANCIES IN THE GRADES OF VETERINARY INSPECTOR, RESEARCH OFFICER, AND ASSISTANT VETERINARY INVESTIGATION OFFICER UNDER THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

1. Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

2. In order to be eligible, a candidate must have been born on or after the 2nd August 1907 and have attained the age of 23 by the 1st January of the year in which he or she competes.

3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that

they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4 (a) Candidates for appointment as Veterinary Inspector must have graduated as a Member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons and have had at least one year's practical experience in some recognised branch of the veterinary profession after such graduation.

(b) Candidates for appointment as Research Officer or Assistant Veterinary Investigation Officer should normally be members of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons but in exceptional cases this qualification may be dispensed with in view of the special requirements of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries and the special qualifications of a candidate. Preference will be given to those candidates who have had post-graduate experience in laboratory research work or in some other recognised branch of the veterinary profession.

5. Candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

The Commissioners reserve the right to give such preference to disabled persons or particular classes of disabled persons as may be necessary in order to give effect to any general policy regarding the employment of such persons which may be adopted by His Majesty's Government, provided that the disability is not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post.

6. No person who is undergoing a course of study with the aid of a grant from public funds shall be eligible to compete under these Regulations before the completion of the course, unless he or she has previously obtained permission to do so from the authority which administers the grant.

7. Every candidate must apply on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given by the Commissioners.

8. Candidates who are recommended by the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the best qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, which will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment the candidates who appear to them to be most suitable. The Selection Board may also recommend that a certain number of candidates shall be classed as reserve candidates and considered by the Commissioners for appointment in conjunction with the results of a later Board. The decision of the Commissioners will be final. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and education, any recommendations that may be obtained from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on its estimation of the above evidence the Board will frame its recommendations.

9.
