SUPPLEMENTARY RECONSTRUCTION REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF SECOND AND THIRD CLASS VALUERS IN THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

- 1. Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.
- 2. In order to be eligible, a candidate must have attained the age of 25 by the 1st January, 1947.
- 3. Candidates must be British subjects. must also satisfy one of the following conditions:

 (a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

 (i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or
 (ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their

last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;
(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.
(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Candidates must have passed the Final Examin-

4. Candidates must have passed the Final Examination of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors, or of the Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute or of the Land Agents' Society or hold a University Degree (e.g. B.Sc. (Estate Management) Cambridge). Ondon, or B.A. (Estate Management) Cambridge which gives exampted from the commissions of the which gives exemption from the examinations of any one of these bodies. They must have had at least four years' professional experience in:—

6. No person who is undergoing a course of study with the aid of a grant from public funds shall be eligible to compete under these Regulations before

the completion of the course, unless he or she has previously obtained permission to do so from the authority which administers the grant.

7. Every candidate must apply on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given by the Commissioners.

8. Those candidates who are recommended by the
