SPECIAL ENACTMENTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1940.

Whereas the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Sheffield (hereinafter called "the Corporation") are authorised by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Sheffield Corporation Act, 1939 (hereinafter called "the local Act") to acquire compulsorily lands for the purposes of (i) street improvements and (ii) the improvement, benefit and development of frontages &c., which purposes are more fully described in paragraph (a) of the said subsection;

And whereas the Minister of Health (hereinafter called "The Minister") by the Sheffield (Extension of Time) Order (No. 3), 1943 extended the period limited for purpose (ii) referred to above by two years, that is to say until the thirty-first day of December, 1944, and later by the Sheffield (Extension of Time) Order (No. 6), 1944 extended by three years the time so limited for purposes (i) and (ii) mentioned above, that is to say, until the thirty-first day of December, 1947;

And whereas the Corporation have made application to the Minister for an Order under the Special Enactments (Extension of Time) Act, 1940 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1940") to extend by three years the time as now limited for the purchase of the lands in respect of both purposes (i) and (ii), that is to say until the thirty-first day of December, 1950;

And whereas in relation to purpose (i) (street improvements) the Minister is, with the concurrence of the Minister of Transport, deemed to be "the appropriate Minister" for the purposes of section 3 of the Act of 1940;

Notice is hereby given that the Minister will consider any objection or representation made to him

in writing before the fifteenth day of September, 1947 by any person or body interested in the subject-matter of the said application. Any such objection or representation relating to lands for purpose (i) will be considered in consultation with the Minister of Transport.

SPECIAL ENACTMENTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1940.

And whereas the period limited by section 10 of the local Act for the purposes of section 6 (d) of the local Act was extended by the Minister, with the concurrence of the Minister of Transport, firstly by the Sheffield (Extension of Time) Order (No. 4), 1944 and secondly by the Sheffield (Extension of Time) Order (No. 2), 1947 until the thirty-first day of December, 1949.
