

on the Selection Board. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' records of experience and education and any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at this interview, and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions. The Selection Board will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, having regard to the requirements of paragraph 5 of the Regulations and to the number and ability of the competitors. The decision will be final.

11. Of the candidates next in order of merit to those declared successful in any competition a certain number at the discretion of the Commissioners may be classified as reserve candidates and considered for appointment in conjunction with the results of a later competition.

12. If a qualifying examination is held, each candidate subjected thereto will be required to pay a fee of 5s. A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £1, towards which the fee paid at the qualifying examination (if any) will count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.

SPECIAL ENACTMENTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1940.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, the effect of which will be that three existing roads comprising part of Wyle Cop, High Street and Pride Hill in the Borough of Shrewsbury in the County of Salop will become trunk roads on the first day of April next after the date on which the Order takes effect.
