WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of October, 1947, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the benefice of Great Abington and the benefice of Little Abington, both situate in the diocese of Ely.

"Whereas the said two benefices of Great Abington and Little Abington are now held in plurality and have been so held continuously save during periods of avoidance under not less than three successive incumbencies:

"And whereas the said benefices of Great Abington and Little Abington are now held in plurality by the Reverend John Frederick Balley:

"And whereas only one parsonage house will be standing or remaining within or belonging to the united benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect, namely, the parsonage house belonging to the said benefice of Little Abington:

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said two benefices of Great Abington and Little Abington now belongs to one and the same patron or patrons:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme) and with the consent also of the Diocesan Committee of the diocese of Ely appointed pursuant to the first Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, (signified by a Resolution of the said Diocesan Committee dated the 4th day of February, 1947, and duly communicated to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"SCHEME

"1. Union of Benefices. The said benefice of Great Abington and the said benefice of Little Abington shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Great and Little Abington' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this

Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said John Frederick Balley if he is then incumbent of both of the said benefices of Great Abington and Little Abington shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"And whereas the said Dorothy Lynch Ramsden-Jodrell desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Chester for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Douglas Henry, Bishop of Chester, (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Douglas Henry, Bishop of Chester, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Chester for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual rights of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cures (hereinafter called 'the said two benefices') of Butleigh and Baltonsborough both in the county of Somerset and in the diocese of Bath and Wells.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the Honourable Leticia Pearson-Gregory of Queen Anne Cottage, Kings Road, Windsor, the wife of Philip John Sherwin Pearson-Gregory, a Major in Your Majesty's Army (retired), and Alfred Geoffrey Neville, of Parrises Hayne Howley, near Chard, Somerset, a Brigadier on the retired List of Your Majesty's Army, are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said two benefices in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Leticia Pearson-Gregory and Alfred Geoffrey Neville desire to transfer the advowson of the said two benefices to the Bishop of Bath and Wells for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in

the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law, other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said two benefices shall be transferred to the said William, Bishop of Bath and Wells, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Bath and Wells for the time being."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of October, 1947, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy, Bishop of Norwich (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme) have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the disunion of the united benefice of Thurgarton with Sustead and the union of (1) the benefice of Sustead with the benefice of Felbrigg with Metton and (2) the benefice of Thurgarton with the benefice of Aldborough all of which benefices are in the diocese of Norwich and the county of Norfolk.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 6th day of February, 1928, and published in the London Gazette on the following day it is directed that the benefice of Sustead and the benefice of Thurgarton shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls, but that the parishes of the said benefices shall continue distinct in all respects:

"And whereas in pursuance of the said Order and in the events which have happened the union of the said benefices took effect upon the 24th day of February, 1947.

"Now, therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Disunion of the united benefice of Thurgarton with Sustead.*

- (1) The union of the benefice of Thurgarton and the benefice of Sustead in the said united benefice of Thurgarton with Sustead shall be dissolved and the said benefices of Thurgarton and Sustead shall thereupon each become a separate benefice with cure of souls within the limits of its separate parish.
- (2) The disunion of the said united benefice shall take effect upon the date when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette.
- (3) The parsonage house at Thurgarton of the said united benefice shall belong to the benefice of Thurgarton.
- (4) The endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, the endowments and property specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Thurgarton and the endowments and property specified in Part II of the Schedule hereto shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Sustead.
- (5) The patronage of each of the benefices of Thurgarton and Sustead shall belong to the patron to whom it belonged immediately before the taking effect of the said union.

" 2. *Union of the benefices of Felbrigg with Metton and Sustead.*

- (1) The benefice of Felbrigg with Metton and the benefice of Sustead shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Felbrigg with Metton and Sustead', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.
- (2) The union shall take effect upon the date when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette and the Reverend Robert Meiklejohn if he is then incumbent of the benefice of Felbrigg with Metton shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice of Felbrigg with Metton and Sustead.
- (3) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Felbrigg with Metton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.
- (4) After the union has taken effect, the right of presentation to the united benefice shall belong wholly to the present patron (being one and the same person) of the benefices of Felbrigg with Metton and Sustead.

" 3. *Union of the benefice of Thurgarton and Aldborough.*

- (1) The benefice of Thurgarton and the benefice of Aldborough shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Aldborough and Thurgarton' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.
- (2) The union of the said benefices shall take effect upon the date when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette and the Reverend Thomas Low Forbes Beattie if he is then incumbent of the benefice of Aldborough shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice of Aldborough and Thurgarton.
- (3) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Thurgarton shall be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice.
- (4) After the union has taken effect, the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patron of the benefice of Thurgarton and the patron of the benefice of Aldborough alternately, the patron of the benefice of Thurgarton having the first presentation to be made after the union.

" THE SCHEDULE.

" PART I.

" (Endowments and property of the united benefice of Thurgarton with Sustead to be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Thurgarton upon the disunion taking effect).

" All the endowments and property which immediately before the taking effect of the union of the benefices of Thurgarton and Sustead belonged to the benefice of Thurgarton, with the exception of such part of the money appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the benefice of Thurgarton pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, as will produce £50 per annum.

" PART II.

" (Endowments and property of the united benefice of Thurgarton with Sustead to be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Sustead upon the disunion taking effect).

" (a) All the endowments and property which immediately before the taking effect of the union of the benefices of Thurgarton and Sustead belonged to the benefice of Sustead.

" (b) Such part of the money appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the benefice of Thurgarton pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, as will produce £50 per annum."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

THE GOVERNING BODY OF CHARTERHOUSE SCHOOL having, on the 17th day of October, 1947, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending the existing Statutes of the said School, the said Statute is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Charterhouse School on the 17th day of October, 1947.

THAT STATUTES numbered two, three, four, five, six, seven, nine and ten of the Statutes for the Government of Charterhouse School approved by His Majesty in Council on the sixteenth day of December One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twelve shall be repealed or amended to the extent and in the manner following:

STATUTE NUMBER TWO shall be repealed and the following substituted:

" 2.—(1) The Governing Body shall in each financial year commencing from the first day of April Nineteen Hundred and Forty-Eight set aside the sum of Four Thousand Two Hundred Pounds which shall be applied in the provision of Scholarships awarded before that date and in the provision of Foundation Scholarships and Senior Foundation Scholarships and Special Scholarships in the manner hereinafter appearing, provided that any part of the said sum not so applied in any year shall be added to the amount so set aside in the next succeeding year.

(2) There shall be such number of Foundation Scholars as the Governing Body shall determine provided that the total number of Foundation Scholars shall not be less than sixty."

STATUTE NUMBER THREE shall be amended as follows:

In line one the word "Foundation" shall be inserted before the word "Scholars".

STATUTE NUMBER FOUR shall be amended as follows:

In the last line the word "Foundation" shall be inserted before the word "Scholarships".

STATUTE NUMBER FIVE shall be amended as follows:

In line two the word "Foundation" shall be inserted before the word "Scholarships".

STATUTE NUMBER SIX shall be repealed and the following substituted:

"Every Foundation Scholar, from the date of his admission as a Scholar, shall be entitled to receive Thirty Pounds per annum so long as he remains in the School, to all other advantages and exemptions which pertain to the place of a Scholar and to such further emoluments as the Governing Body may determine, provided that the total amount awarded in any year shall not in any case exceed the amount of the full school fee."

STATUTE NUMBER SEVEN shall be amended as follows:

In line one after the word "six" the word "Foundation" shall be inserted.

The words "The Scholars" in line eight and the words following to the end of the statute shall be deleted and the following substituted:

"Each of the Foundation Scholars so selected shall be termed a Senior Foundation Scholar and shall become entitled to receive a prize in the form of books to the value of Ten Pounds."

STATUTE NUMBER NINE shall be amended as follows:

The words "In such case, and in the case of resignation of the emoluments of any Scholarship" in lines five and six shall be deleted and the following substituted:

"In such case and in the case of any balance of the said sum of Four Thousand Two Hundred Pounds remaining through the resignation of the emoluments of any Scholarship or otherwise."

STATUTE NUMBER TEN shall be amended as follows:

After the word "two" in line one the word "Foundation" shall be inserted.

After the word "awarded" in line one the words "each of the value of Thirty Pounds per annum and tenable for three years" shall be deleted.

In line four the word "Foundation" shall be inserted before the word "Scholarship".

At the end of Statute Ten the following words shall be added:

"The Governing Body may appoint either or both of the Foundation Scholars so selected, who are of sufficient merit, to be Senior Foundation Scholars. Each such Senior Foundation Scholar shall be entitled to the prize in the form of books provided for by Statute Seven above."
