According to our freshest Accounts from Lithuania, the King of Sweden was at a Place called Rosnum, within three Miles of Grodno, and had not yet appointed a Day for giving Audience to the Ambassadors of the Republick of Poland: He continues his Refolution of marching hither very foon, and in the mean time has put his Forces into Quarters of Refreshment in teveral Towns belonging to Prince Wiesnowiski, who is at the head of a Body of 15000 Men of the Nobility and other Inhabitants of Lithunia, and is faid to have lately got some Advantage over the Swedish Forces that are in Garison in the City of Wilna. The Forces of the Crown have their Rendezvous at Lemberg, where they are ordered to be by the 26th Instant. The King of Poland has sent his Servants to Cracow, but it is not yet known when he himself designs to go thither.

Portsmouth, May 21. Admiral Allemonde came yesterday in the evening to Spithead with a large Squadron of Dutch Men of War, and divers Transport Ships, having on board several Regiments of Land Forces; the Particulars whereof we do not yet know; and in few days they expect a Dutch Flag, and several Men of War more.

Colonel Fox's new-raifed Regiment of Marines arrived here yesterday, and were shipped off for the Isle of Wight, where the Forces that are to serve on board Her Majesty's Fleet have their Rendezvous, and are ordered to encamp.

Her Majesty's Ships the Orford and Essex came yesterday to Spiehead from the Islands of Jersey and Guernsey, and each of them sent hither a French Prize, which they had taken in their
