

he sees occasion, may issue out fresh Summons to the Nobility to mount on Horseback for the Defence of their Country; That the King and the Cardinal Primate shall write to the Emperor, and the other Guarands of the Peace of *Oliva*, to desire their Mediation for accommodating the Differences between the Crowns of *Sweden* and *Poland*; or if the former refuses it, to pray the Assistance of His Imperial Majesty, and the rest of the said Guarands; That a Treaty shall be entered into with the King of *Prussia*, in order to the Republick's acknowledging him King, provided he complies with some Demands they have to make to him; and that to this end the Cardinal Primate shall immediately enter into Conference with the said King's Envoy, and if they can adjust Matters, an Ambassador shall be sent to that Prince; That the Cardinal Primate shall in like manner confer with the *Muscovite* Ambassador, and examine his Proposals for making an Alliance with this Republick; That as to the augmenting of the Army of the Crown, that Matter shall be referred to the next General Diet; And that the King shall lay his Commands upon the Starost of *Cracow* to take the necessary Precautions for the Security of this City. According to our freshest Accounts from *Lithuania*, the King of *Sweden* was at a Place called *Rosnum*, within three Miles of *Grodno*, and had not yet appointed a Day for giving Audience to the Ambassadors of the Republick of *Poland*: He continues his Resolution of marching hither very soon, and in the mean time has put his Forces into Quarters of Refreshment in several Towns belonging to Prince *Wiesnowski*, who is at the head of a Body of 15000 Men of the Nobility and other Inhabitants of *Lithuania*, and is said to have lately got some Advantage over the *Swedish* Forces that are in Garison in the City of *Wilna*. The Forces of the Crown have their Rendezvous at *Lemberg*, where they are ordered to be by the 26th Instant. The King of *Poland* has sent his Servants to *Cracow*, but it is not yet known when he himself designs to go thither.

Portsmouth, May 21. Admiral *Allemonde* came yesterday in the evening to *Spithead* with a large Squadron of *Dutch* Men of War, and divers Transport Ships, having on board several Regiments of Land Forces; the Particulars whereof we do not yet know; and in few days they expect a *Dutch* Flag, and several Men of War more.

Colonel *Fox's* new-raised Regiment of Marines arrived here yesterday, and were shipped off for the Isle of *Wight*, where the Forces that are to serve on board Her Majesty's Fleet have their Rendezvous, and are ordered to encamp.

Her Majesty's Ships the *Orford* and *Essex* came yesterday to *Spithead* from the Islands of *Jersey* and *Guernsey*, and each of them sent hither a *French* Prize, which they had taken in their way.

St. James's, May 21. Her Majesty in Council was this day pleased to declare, That She had appointed His Royal Highness Prince George of Denmark Lord High Admiral of *England*, and *Ireland*, and the Dominions and Islands of the said Kingdoms, and of all other Her Majesty's Plantations, Dominions and Territories, in Parts beyond the Seas, possessed by any of Her Majesty's Subjects.

The Rt. Hon. George Earl of Northampton was, by the Queen's Command, Sworn of Her Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

St. James's, May 23. His Royal Highness Prince George of Denmark has appointed Sir George Rooke Kt. Vice-Admiral of *England*, and Admiral of Her Majesty's Fleet, Sir David Mitchell Kt. George Churchill Esq. Admiral of the Blue Squadron of Her Majesty's Fleet, and Richard Hill Esq. to be his Council as Lord High Admiral of *England*, &c. who accordingly were Sworn before His Royal Highness this morning at *St. James's*.

There are Two Mails due from Holland, to-day that of Friday last.

Whereas on Tuesday the 12th of this Instant May, a Riot was committed in *May-Fair*, in which (amongst other Disorders) John Cerper, of *St. James's Parish*, Carpenter, being with other Constables and Officers employed in putting in Execution Her Majesty's Proclamation for the Encouragement of Piety and Virtue, and for the Preventing and Punishing of Vice, Prophaneness, and Immorality, he (amongst others) was dangerously wounded, whereof he is since dead; Her Majesty, for the Encouragement of all such Persons as shall discharge their Duty in the Execution of Her Majesty's Proclamation aforesaid, is graciously pleased to promise Her Pardon, and, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of 50 l. to any of the Persons concerned in this Riot, who shall discover the Person that committed this barbarous Murder, and shall cause him to be apprehended and brought to Justice.
