## WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1945.

### PAPER BAG WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for (1) the revocation of the Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1946 (Order P. (38)) and for the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration at present in operation and (2) for the revocation of the Paper Bag Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order, 1946 (Order P. (40)) and for the making of a wages regulation order for holidays and holiday remuneration in substitution for the provisions at present in operation.
