Note

Section 17 (3) and section 18 of the Crown Proceedings Act, 1947, provide as follows:—

17 (3). Civil proceedings against the Crown shall be instituted against the appropriate authorised Government department or if none of the authorised Government departments is appropriate or the person instituting the proceedings has any reasonable doubt whether any, and if so, which of those departments is appropriate, against the Attorney General.

18. All documents required to be served on the Crown for the purposes of or in connection with any civil proceedings by or against the Crown shall, if those proceedings are by or against an authorised Government department be served on the Solicitor, if any, for that department, or the person, if any, acting for the purposes of this Act as Solicitor for that department, or if there is no such Solicitor and no person so acting or if the proceedings are brought by or against the Attorney General, on the Solicitor for the affairs of His Majesty's Treasury.
