The KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal to David Brown in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

An explosion occurred in the Burngrange Shale Mine, West Calder, Midlothian, at about 8 p.m. on Friday, 10th January, 1947, when 53 persons were at work underground in the district. Firedamp was ignited by an open acetylene cap lamp and the initial explosion started fires which spread rapidly. David Brown, the Overman, descended the pit and proceeded with a fireman to explore the narrow workings where men were trapped. Though they encountered smoke for a time it was not sufficiently dense to prevent progress but as they passed the junction of another heading increasing smoke compelled their withdrawal. After waiting a few minutes Brown made another attempt, alone, to get inbye. He actually got in to No. 3 Dookhead, where he shouted but got no response. He saw no signs of the inbye men nor of their lights, and he was forced to withdraw again. On his way outbye, he again met the fireman, who said he had been trying to improve the atmospheric conditions in the inbye section by a partial opening of some brattice screen doors, but this step was of no avail. The atmospheric conditions were getting worse all the time, due to the spreading of the fires, the extent and seriousness of which even then were not generally realized. Brown, however, did realize the seriousness of the position in relation to the trapped men and immediately sent word explaining the position to the manager who was dealing with fires elsewhere, asking for all possible assistance and making it quite clear that there was no hope of undertaking further exploratory work without the use of rescue teams wearing self-contained breathing apparatus. He then set out to discover for himself where all the smoke was coming from.

Although the National Fire Service was never intended for fire-fighting underground in mines, nevertheless, a team at once volunteered for this duty. Two members of the team donned their one-hour Proto-Breathing Apparatus. Underground, they met the overman, Brown, who pleaded for the use of the two sets of Proto-Apparatus, so that he and another trained member of the Burngrange Mines Rescue Team could make another attempt to get into the workings beyond No. 3 Dook. Using the one-hour apparatus borrowed from the N.F.S. Brown and his companion made an unsuccessful attempt to rescue the trapped men. At 11.15 p.m. under the captaincy of Brown a fresh team wearing goggles and using a life-line again attempted to reach the men but were forced to return as the temperature was very high and the smoke so dense that their lights could not be seen. There had been a fall of stone and sounds of strata movement were heard. A further attempt along another level led to the discovery of another fire and it became certain that there was no hope of saving the men

until this was under control. The work of fire-fighting continued for four days and it was not until the night of 13th/14th January, that it was considered practicable to send a rescue team beyond the fire area. With one exception the bodies of all the 15 men who lost their lives by the effect of afterdamp and fumes were in No. 3 Dook.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR FILLING VACANCIES FOR SENIOR REGIONAL PLANNING OFFICERS, REGIONAL PLANNING OFFICERS, SENIOR PLANNING INSPECTORS, ASSISTANT REGIONAL PLANNING OFFICERS, PLANNING INSPECTORS AND PLANNING ASSISTANTS GRADE I IN THE MINISTRY OF TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING.

1. Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

2. (a) Candidates for the post of Senior Regional Planning Officer must be at least 35 years of age on the 1st January, 1948; for the posts of Regional Planning Officer, Senior Planning Inspector, Assistant Regional Planning Officer and Planning Inspector at least 30 years of age on the 1st January, 1948; and for the posts of Planning Assistant, Grade I, at least 28 and under 40 years of age on the 1st January, 1948.

(b) No upper age limit is specified for the five senior grades, but, in general, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service, and accordingly weight may be given to this factor in considering candidates for these posts who are over 50 years of age.

3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either (i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or (ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. (1) Candidates must have at least one of the qualifications (a) to (d) below. (The Civil Service Commission will accept as eligible under this Regulation only those candidates who have the specified qualifications on the date when they sign their

application forms, up to the last day for the receipt of applications.):

(a) Architects—Registered Architect.

(b) Civil Engineers—(i) Corporate Membership of the Institution of Civil Engineers or

(ii) Have passed examinations recognised by that Institution as granting exemption from Sections A and B of their examination for Associate Membership.

(c) Municipal and County Engineers—(i) Corporate Membership of the Institution of Municipal and County Engineers or

(ii) Have passed examinations recognised by that Institution as granting exemption from their examination for Associate Membership.

(d) Estate Surveyors and Land Officers—Corporate Membership of:—

(i) Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (any Sub-Division) or

(ii) Chartered Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute or

(iii) Land Agents' Society or, as an alternative to the above,

(iv) Have passed examinations qualifying for a University degree in Estate Management (B.A. Camb. or B.Sc. London).

(2) In addition to the possession of professional qualifications as detailed in the preceding paragraph, candidates must have practical experience in town and country planning, either in private practice or in central or local government. Preference will be given to corporate members of the Town Planning Institute.

5. Every candidate must satisfy the Commissioners as to health and character before appointment.

6. No person undergoing a course of study with the aid of a grant from public funds shall be eligible to compete before the completion of the course, unless he or she has previously obtained permission to do so from the authority which administers the grant.

7. Every candidate must apply on the appropriate form within the time and in the manner of which notice is given by the Commissioners. Candidates must state on the application form the grade or grades for which they wish to be considered.

8. Candidates will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board which will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment those candidates who appear to be most suitable. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, summon only those whose qualifications and experience are considered to be specially suitable. The Board will take into consideration the Candidates' record of education, training and experience, with due regard to loss of opportunity of those who have served in the Forces, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview, and on their estimation of all the above facts will frame their recommendations. The Selection Board will recommend for appointment to a particular grade those candidates who apply, and are eligible, for more than one grade; where there are two types of post in one grade (e.g. Regional Planning Officer and Senior Planning Inspector) the Board will recommend the type of post to which successful candidates will be assigned. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

9. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g. the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment. The Interviewing Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at School, at the University, in the Forces or otherwise.

11. Every successful candidate will be required to pay a certification fee of £1.

## WARNING SIGNALS TO DENOTE THE PRESENCE OF SUBMARINES.

Former Notice.—No. 8 of 1947; hereby cancelled.

1. Attention is drawn to the following warning signal which is in use to denote the presence of submarines:—

British vessels fly a rectangular red flag to denote that Submarines, which may be submerged, are in the vicinity. Vessels are cautioned to steer so as to give a wide berth to any vessel flying such a flag. If from any cause it is necessary to approach her, vessels should proceed at slow speed until warning is given of the danger zone by flags, semaphore or megaphone, &c., a good look-out being kept meanwhile for Submarines whose presence may be only indicated by their periscopes showing above water.

A Submarine submerged at a depth too great to show her periscope, may sometimes indicate her position by releasing a "smoke candle" which gives off a considerable volume of smoke on first reaching the surface. Her position may sometimes be indicated by red-and-white or red-and-yellow buoys or floats, which tow on the surface close astern.

2. Under certain circumstances warnings that Submarines are exercising in specified areas may be broadcast by a General Post Office W/T station.

3. It must not be inferred from the above that Submarines exercise only when in company with escorting vessels.
