PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of December, 1947, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Redditch in the county and diocese of Worcester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the Right Honourable Other Robert For, Earl of Plymouth (hereinafter called 'the said Earl of Plymouth'), is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Earl of Plymouth desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Worcester for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same).

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said William, Bishop of Worcester and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised, by the Bishop of Worcester for the time being"

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Worcester

"Whereas we are satisfied that the President and Scholars of the College of Saint Mary Magdalen in the University of Oxford (hereinafter called the 'said President and Scholars') are entitled to three one-sixth parts or shares of and in the advowson of the said benefice, that Maria Thereza Eugenie Plummer of the Red House, Rickmansworth Road, Northwood, in the county of Middlesex, Widow, is entitled to two one-sixth parts or shares of and in the advowson of the said benefice and that the Warden and Scholars Clerks of Saint Mary College of Winchester near Winchester in the county of Southampton otherwise known as Winchester College (hereinafter called the 'said Warden and Scholars Clerks') are entitled to the remaining one-sixth part or share of and in the advowson of the said benefice"
