**DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932**

**CANCELLATION OF SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES**

(Richard Morton Geldart)

Whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and by Regulation 5 of the Raw Opium, etc, Regulations, 1937, the Authorities granted by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, and the Raw Opium, etc, Regulations, 1937, to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply the drugs or preparations to which these Regulations apply, were by Notice published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 10th November, 1942, withdrawn from Richard Morton Geldart, M R C S Eng, L R C P Lond, then residing at Vista, Findon Road, Worthing, Sussex, who had been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts.

And whereas by the said Notice it was directed that it should not be lawful for the said Richard Morton Geldart to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

**RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS OF SENIOR GEOLOGISTS IN THE GEOLOGICAL SURVEY OF GREAT BRITAIN UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF SCIENTIFIC AND INDUSTRIAL RESEARCH.**

**1. Age**

Candidates must be at least 26 and under 31 years of age on 1st August, 1948, i.e. they must have been born on or after 2nd August, 1917 and on or before 1st August, 1922. But a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular or short-service engagement in H.M. Forces may for this purpose deduct his period of such service from his actual age

**2. Sex and Marriage.**

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

**3. Nationality.**

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions —

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment;

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

**4. Qualification.**

(i) Every candidate must have obtained a university degree in Geology with first or second class honours or an equivalent qualification

Provided that the Commissioners may at their discretion admit a candidate with high professional attainments

(2) Every candidate must have had at least three years appropriate post-graduate or other approved experience

**5. Health and Character.**

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character

**6. Competition.**

(1) The Commissioners may at their discretion summon candidates to a preliminary informal interview

(2) A certain number of the candidates will be chosen, on the basis of the information available, to appear before a Selection Board appointed by the Commissioners. The Selection Board, in making their recommendations to the Commissioners, and the Commissioners in making their final decision, will give weight to the candidates' capacity for original research or development work; and they will as a rule expect this capacity to be demonstrated in a candidate's record. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

**7. Candidates trained as Teachers.**

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

**8. Canvassing.**

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their Application Forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

**9. Fee.**

A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £1 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

10 These regulations apply to the competition of May, 1948. For subsequent competitions the regulations will be similar, except for the governing date for age in Regulation 1; this will be 1st August of the year in which the competition is held.
