

WATER ACT, 1945

KENT AREA

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by section 14 of the Water Act, 1945, proposes to make an order defining an area consisting of the county borough of Canterbury, and (in the county of Kent) the boroughs of Chatham, Deal, Dover, Faversham, Folkestone, Gillingham, Gravesend (part), Hythe, Maidstone, Margate, Queenborough, Ramsgate, Rochester and Sandwich, the urban districts of Ashford, Broadstairs and Saint Peter's, Herne Bay, Northfleet (part), Sheerness, Sittingbourne and Milton, and Whitstable, the rural districts of Bridge-blean, Dover, East Ashford (part), Eastry, Elham, Hollingbourn (part), Maidstone (part), Malling (part), Sheppey, Strood (part), Swale, Tonbridge (part), and West Ashford (part), as an area to which the provisions of the said section 14 shall apply.

order will be published in the issues of the Rochester, Chatham and Gillingham Journal and Chatham Standard on the 18th and 25th February, 1948, in the Faversham Times and Mercury and North East Kent Journal, the Kent Messenger, the Kent Messenger and Canterbury Telegraph, the Kent Messenger and Dover Telegraph, the Kent Messenger and Gravesend Telegraph, the Kent Messenger and Ashford Examiner, the Isle of Thanet Gazette and Thanet Times, the Sheerness Times and Guardian, The East Kent Gazette, the Kent and Sussex Courier and Southern Counties Herald, and the Kentish Express on the 20th and 27th February, 1948, and in the Folkestone, Hythe and District Herald on the 21st and 28th February, 1948.
