The KING has been graciously pleased, on the advice of His Majesty's Australian Ministers, to approve the award of the British Empire Medal (Military Division), in recognition of gallant and distinguished services whilst a prisoner-of-war in Japanese hands (prior to September, 1945) to:—
No VX 51176 Signaller Graham CHISHOLM, Australian Military Forces.

The KING has been graciously pleased to give and grant unto Arthur Edward William Sandbach, of Green Lodge, Westholme, Orpington in the County of

Kent, Esquire, Captain the Buffs (East Kent Regiment), His Royal Licence and Authority that he may take and henceforth use the surname of Farish in addition to and before that of Sandbach, that he may bear the Arms of Farish quarterly with his own family Arms, and that such surname and Arms may in like manner be taken borne and used by his issue; the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms otherwise the said Royal Licence and Permission to be void and of none effect And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in the College of Arms (237)

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1 The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 27th February, 1948, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 1st March, 1948, to Saturday, the 6th March, 1948, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3 The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England

4 Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates

5 Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker

6 The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated

7 Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8 Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England

9 The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
