PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 18 of the Extradition Act, 1870, it is among other things enacted that if, by any law or ordinance made after the passing of the said Act by the legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession, the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British possession, His Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any foreign state, or by any subsequent Order, direct that such law or ordinance or any part thereof shall have effect in such British possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act:

And Whereas by an ordinance enacted by the legislature of the Colony of Sarawak, the short title of which is the Extradition Ordinance, 1947, it is provided that all powers vested in and acts authorised or required to be done by a Police Magistrate or any Justice of the Peace in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals in the United Kingdom under the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1932, are thereby vested in, and may in the Colony be exercised and done by, any District Court in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals under the said Acts.

And whereas it is further provided by the said ordinance that the said ordinance shall not come into operation until His Majesty shall by Order in Council direct that the said ordinance shall have effect within the Colony as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870, but that the said ordinance shall thereafter come into operation on the day on which such Order in Council is published in the Government Gazette

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the Extradition Act, 1870, and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, directs that the said ordinance shall have effect in the Colony of Sarawak without modification or alteration, as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870

This Order may be cited as the Extradition (Sarawak) Order in Council, 1948

UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923

A Statute made by the University of Oxford on the 24th February, 1948, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923"

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1 The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 12th March, 1948, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.

2 The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 15th March, 1948, to Saturday, the 20th March, 1948, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3 The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4 Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5 Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6 The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7 Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8 Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9 The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
