WE THE GOVERNING BODY OF ST PETER'S COLLEGE, WESTMINSTER, commonly called Westminster School in virtue of the powers vested in us by the Public Schools Act 1868 and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf do hereby make the following Statute amending the Statute sealed with our Corporate Seal the 28th day of July 1871 approved by the Queen in Council the 6th day of November 1871 and amended the 26th day of March 1878 the 26th day of February 1880 and the 19th day of October 1939

STATUTE

In place of the Chapter numbered 2 in the Statutes sealed on the 28th day of July 1871 which was deleted by the amending Statute of the 16th day of October 1939 the following new Chapter numbered 2 shall be inserted —

CHAPTER 2

Under Master.

"There shall be an under Master of the School who shall be the same person as the Master of the King's Scholars and shall hold office so long as he shall remain Master of the King's Scholars. He shall rank in the School immediately after the Head Master and shall in his absence act as his deputy"
