TEMPORARY (RECONSTRUCTION) REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF RESEARCH ASSISTANTS, GRADE II, IN THE VICTORIA AND ALBERT MUSEUM UNDER THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION.

*Qualifications.*

1. The competition will be open to both men and women.

2. Candidates must have attained the age of 19 and must not have attained the age of 32 on the 1st January of the year in which the competition is held.

3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:

(a) If natural born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4.—(a) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their department to apply for appointment.

(b) Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

(c) No person who is undergoing a course of study with the aid of a grant from public funds shall be eligible to compete before the completion of the course, unless he or she has previously obtained permission to do so from the authority which administers the grant.

5. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in the Commissioner's opinion, fits them for the post. The requirements of certain of the Museum Departments differ in detail as described in the notices, but in general candidates should possess a University degree (preferably in an Arts subject) although this requirement may be waived by the Commissioners if satisfied on other grounds as to the candidates' educational fitness. A reading knowledge of at least one modern language will be desirable in all candidates. The Civil Service Commissioners may submit any or all of the candidates to a qualifying examination to test their educational fitness.

6. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

#### *Application.*

7. The Ministry of Education will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

8. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Director and Secretary of the Victoria and Albert Museum, and shall be made on the appropriate form. He will examine the candidates' credentials and take such other steps as seem good to him to ascertain their qualifications, and will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the best qualifications for any existing or prospective vacancy to the Ministry of Education for approval of their candidature. The papers of candidates thus approved will be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, in the Forces or otherwise.

#### *Competition.*

10. Candidates who are recommended by the Ministry of Education and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Civil Service Commissioners in consultation with the Ministry of Education, who shall be represented on the Selection Board. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' records of experience and education and any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at this interview, and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions. The Selection Board will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, having regard to the requirements of paragraph 5

of the Regulations and to the number and ability of the competitors. The decision will be final.

11. If a qualifying examination is held, each candidate subjected thereto will be required to pay a fee of 5s. A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £1, towards which the fee paid at the qualifying examination (if any) will count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.

The Commissioners may submit any or all of the candidates to a qualifying examination to test their educational fitness.

6. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

7. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' records of experience and education and any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at this interview, and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions. The Selection Board will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, having regard to the requirements of paragraph 5 of the Regulations and to the number and ability of the competitors. The decision will be final.

#### Fees.

11. If a qualifying examination is held, each candidate subjected thereto will be required to pay a fee of 5s. A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £1, towards which the fee paid at the qualifying examination (if any) will count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.
