## REVIVAL OF TREATIES BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND ROUMANIA.

In accordance with Article 10 of the Treaty of Peace with Roumania signed at Paris on 10th February 1947, notice was given to the Roumanian Government on 13th March 1948 that His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom desire to keep in force or revive the following pre-war bilateral treaties and agreements, in respect of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and those other territories for which His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom are responsible, and to which the undermentioned bilateral treaties and agreements respectively applied at the time of the outbreak of war
