RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS OF ASSISTANT EXPERIMENTAL OFFICERS IN VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS

1 There will be three Methods of entry, Method I, Method II and Method III, but a candidate may apply to compete by one Method only in this competition. Regulations 2 and 3 relate to Method I, Regulations 4 and 5 to Method II and Regulations 6 and 7 to Method III, the remaining Regulations relate to all three Methods

METHOD I

2 Eligibility

(i) Candidates must be at least 17½ years and under 18½ years of age on 1st August, 1948, i.e., they must have been born on or after 2nd February, 1930, and on or before 1st February, 1931

(ii) No specific educational qualifications are required of candidates competing under Method I.

3 Subjects of Examination

(i) The examination consists of —

METHOD II

4 Eligibility

(i) This method of entry is restricted to candidates who are ineligible for Method I (Regulation 2 above) and

(a) will have completed their period of compulsory service in H M Armed Forces under the National Service Acts not later than 1st August, 1948, and

(b) after deducting such period of service from their actual age at 1st August, 1948, would be under 18½ years of age at that date

(ii) No specific educational qualifications are required of candidates competing under Method II

METHOD III

6 Eligibility

(i) Age—Candidates must be at least 20 years and under 26 years of age on 1st August, 1948, i.e., they must have been born on or after 2nd August, 1922, and on or before 1st August, 1928. But a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular or short service engagement in H M Forces may for

this purpose deduct his period of such service from his actual age

(ii) Education—Every candidate must either

(a) have obtained a university degree in a scientific or engineering subject or in Mathematics, or

(b) have obtained associateship of the Royal Institute of Chemistry or graduate membership of any other professional institution accepted by the Commissioners as appropriate, or

(c) have obtained the Higher National Certificate, or

(d) have obtained the Higher School Certificate with Mathematics or a science subject as a principal subject, or an equivalent qualification

(e) Candidates not in possession of such a certificate or equivalent qualification may be admitted by the Commissioners, at their discretion, if they can produce evidence of suitable experience such candidates currently serving in a Government Department must be certified by that Department as being worthy of consideration

7 Competition

(i) The Commissioners may at their discretion summon candidates to a preliminary informal interview

(ii) A certain number of the candidates will be chosen on the basis of the information available, to appear before a Selection Board appointed by the Commissioners

(iii) The decision of the Commissioners will be final

THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS RELATE TO ALL THREE METHODS

8 Sex and Marriage

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and are appointed under these Regulations to situations in certain Departments which render them eligible for pension and other benefits under the Superannuation Acts, and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid

9 Nationality

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions —

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject, or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment

(b) If naturalized British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour
