"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The territory (shown by the pink colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of South Kyme, in the said diocese comprising:—

All that detached portion of the parish of Billingham which is bounded on the east and north east by the extra-parochial place known as Harts Grounds upon the south east and south west by the parish of Holland Fen and on the remaining sides by the parish of South Kyme."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of March, 1948, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Alvaston; Boulton; Saint Bartholomew, Derby; and the extra-parochial place called or known as Sinfyn Moor, all in the county and diocese of Derby.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is within the said area a consecrated church known as Saint Edmund which has been approved by us as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the Bishop of Derby by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the 27th November, 1939, and made pursuant to the Church Building Acts, 1845 and 1848:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Derby (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution.*

"(a) As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a new parish.

"(b) The Church of Saint Edmund aforesaid shall be the parish church of the parish.

"(c) The name of the parish shall be 'The Parish of Allenton and Shelton Lock'.

"2. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.*

"The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Derby and in the rural deanery of Melbourne.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"All those portions of the parish of Alvaston, the parish of Boulton, the parish of St. Bartholomew, Derby, and the extra-parochial place called or known as Sinfyn Moor which is bounded on all sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of Sinfyn Lane Level Crossing on the

Derby and Melbourne branch of the Midland Region of British Railways and extending thence south eastwards along the middle of the said railway for a distance of 41½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said extra-parochial place Sinfyn Moor and a detached portion of the said parish of Alvaston and then following the last mentioned boundary in a south easterly direction to a point in the middle of the railway where it again crosses the said railway and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the said railway for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said extra-parochial place Sinfyn Moor from the parish of Chellaston (thereby crossing to the south eastern bank of Derby Canal) and continuing north eastwards along the last mentioned boundary to its junction with the boundary which divides a detached portion of the said parish of Boulton from the said parish of Chellaston and extending thence in an easterly and north easterly direction for a distance of 50 chains or thereabouts along the last mentioned boundary to its junction with the boundary which divides the said parish of Chellaston from the said parish of Alvaston and extending thence first north eastwards and then northwards along the last mentioned boundary thereby crossing Derby Canal and then continuing north eastwards along the said boundary to the middle of the said Canal and extending thence northwards along the middle of the said Canal for a distance of 80 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the northern hedge, wall or fence running along the back of Simpson Street and Evans Street and extending thence north westwards in a straight line for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts crossing Cockayne Street and then continuing in the same direction in a straight line for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts along the hedge, wall or fence passing the northern ends of Hutton Street and Whitehurst Street to the boundary which divides a detached portion of the said parish of Boulton from the parish of Osmaston and extending thence south westwards along the last mentioned boundary to the middle of Osmaston Road upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Alvaston from the said parish of St. Bartholomew, Derby and extending thence in a southerly direction along the last mentioned boundary (crossing Osmaston Park Road) to a point in the middle of Lord Street opposite to the northern wall or fence of the house known as No. 6 Lord Street and extending thence westwards along such wall or fence until it meets the north eastern end of the eastern wall or fence of the Municipal Sports Ground and extending thence south westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to a point where it meets the boundary which divides the said parish of Alvaston from the said parish of St. Bartholomew, Derby, and extending thence generally southwards along the last mentioned boundary until it meets the boundary which divides the said parish of St. Bartholomew, Derby, from a detached portion of the parish of Boulton and extending thence first westwards and then south westwards along the last mentioned boundary to the middle of Sinfyn Avenue and extending thence westwards along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to where such boundary turns south eastwards and extending thence westwards along the middle of Sinfyn Avenue for a further 6 chains or thereabouts to a point where the last mentioned Avenue is crossed by the boundary which divides the said parish of St. Bartholomew, Derby, from the said extra-parochial place Sinfyn Moor and extending thence first north westwards and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary to the point where the before mentioned imaginary line commenced in the centre of Sinfyn Lane Level Crossing on the Derby and Melbourne branch of the Midland Region of British Railways."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.
