PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of March, 1948, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Christ Church; Paignton in the county of Devon and in the diocese of Exeter.

" SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is within the said area a consecrated church known as Saint Paul which has been approved by us as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the Bishop of Exeter by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the 27th November, 1947, and made pursuant to Section 9 of the New Parishes Measure, 1943.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. *Constitution*

(a) As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a new parish.

(b) The church of Saint Paul aforesaid shall be the parish church of the parish.

(c) The name of the parish shall be 'The Parish of Saint Paul, Preston, Paignton.'

" 2. *Archdeaconry and rural deanery.*

The parish shall be in the archdeaconry of Totnes and in the rural deanery of Ipplepen.

" THE SCHEDULE

"The area comprising:—

All that portion of the parish of Christ Church, Paignton which is bounded upon the north-east by the parish of Cockington upon the north and upon the west by the parish of Marldon and upon the south and south-west by an imaginary line commencing at the southern end of the eastern wall or fence of East Down Plantation where the urban district boundary and the boundaries of the said parish of Marldon and of the said parish of Christ Church, Paignton, all meet and extending thence south-eastwards along the walls or fences which divide the closes numbered 41, 47 and 48 from the closes numbered 229, 42 and 49 for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts and extending thence in the same direction, thereby crossing the southern wall or fence of close numbered 49, to a point in the middle of Occombe Valley Road and extending thence south-eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to its junction with Shorton Valley Road and extending thence north-eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to its junction with Coombe Road and extending thence south-eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to its junction with Old Torquay Road and extending thence to and then south-westwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to its junction with Upper Manor Road and extending thence to and then south-eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road crossing Torquay Road to Manor Road continuing along the middle of the last mentioned road crossing the junction of Upper Morin Road with Morin Road crossing under the British Railway (Western Region) and continuing eastwards along the middle of the said Manor Road crossing (in the same direction and in a straight line) Marine Drive and Preston Green to the Sea."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

Whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of March, 1948, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for the dissolution of the district of Saint James, Upton, Torquay, in the county of Devon and in the diocese of Exeter, and for the incorporation of the area of that district in the parish of Upton (Saint Mary Magdalene), in the said county and diocese:

" SCHEME

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 28th day of November, 1910, and published in the London Gazette on the 6th day of the following month, all that part of the said parish of Upton (Saint Mary Magdalene) which is delineated upon the plan annexed hereto and thereon coloured pink was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes under the name of 'The District of Saint James, Upton, Torquay':

"And whereas the area of the said district is and remains the same as it was at the date of the constitution of the district:

"And whereas no church approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church has been provided for the said district and we are satisfied that no such church is likely to be provided:

"And whereas the endowment of the said district consists of (a) the sums of Stock and cash hereinafter referred to, and (b) grants amounting to £133 os. od. per annum made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, out of our Common Fund of which £86 os. od. per annum will be withdrawn upon the dissolution of the district, and the remaining £47 os. od. per annum will be transferred to the augmentation of the benefice of Upton (Saint Mary Magdalene) during the subsistence of the hereinafter-mentioned yearly payment of £47 os. od. and will thereupon be withdrawn:

"And whereas there is not at present a minister of the said district:

"And whereas a yearly payment of £47 os. od. has become charged upon the revenues of the said district in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board upon the resignation of the Reverend Edward Andrew Lane, the former minister of the district:

"And whereas the patronage of the said district is now vested in the Church Patronage Society and the patronage of the benefice of Upton (Saint Mary Magdalene) is now vested in Simeon's Trustees and the said Society and the said Trustees have agreed to the patronage proposals hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Upon the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the said district of Saint James, Upton, Torquay, shall be dissolved and the area of the said district (as delineated on the plan annexed hereto and thereon coloured pink) shall be incorporated for ecclesiastical purposes wholly in the parish of Upton (Saint Mary Magdalene).
