

" 2. After the dissolution has taken effect the right of patronage of and presentation to the benefice of Upton (Saint Mary Magdalene) shall be exercised alternately by the present patrons of the said benefice and the present patrons of the said district, the present patrons of the said benefice having the first presentation to the benefice after the dissolution of the said district.

" 3. Upon the taking effect of the dissolution of the said district, the endowments specified in the Schedule hereto (or any varied investments then representing the same) shall, subject to the aforesaid yearly payment of £47 os. od. in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board, be appropriated and held for the augmentation of the said benefice of Upton (Saint Mary Magdalene) and the fund at present held by us for the provision of a parsonage house for the said district and now amounting to £3,294 19s. 8d. shall be appropriated and held and accumulated by us for the provision of a house of residence for an assistant curate serving the said benefice of Upton (Saint Mary Magdalene); provided that, until the provision of a house as aforesaid, such part (if any) of the income arising from such fund as we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, after consulting the Bishop of the diocese, may determine shall be paid by us towards the stipend of the said assistant curate.

" 4. So soon as may be after the dissolution of the said district has taken effect (a) any moneys or funds and any documents or papers held upon this said day for the benefit of, or in respect of, the said district by the churchwarden or churchwardens or the parochial church council thereof shall be transferred, as the Bishop may direct, to the incumbent or the churchwarden or churchwardens or the parochial church council of the parish of Upton (Saint Mary Magdalene) to be used for the like purposes, as nearly as may be, as those for which the said moneys or funds and documents or papers were previously applicable, and (b) any moneys or funds held upon the said day by the sequestrators for the benefit of the said district shall be transferred to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the intent that £100 os. od. thereout (or the whole of such moneys or funds if smaller than £100 os. od.) shall be paid by us to the incumbent of the parish of Upton (Saint Mary Magdalene) and that any balance shall be held by us for the augmentation of the said parish.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Newington, in the County of Kent, 10 days'

previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Newington in the said County of Kent, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

Newington.—Forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of the Parish Church of Saint Mary, Newington, Next Sittingbourne,

Provided that—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 31st day of May next.

And His Majesty, is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 31st day of May.
