"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the share exercisable by the said Bertha Charlotte Conway of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Charles, Bishop of Exeter and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be

vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Exeter for the time being." And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.
