WAGES COUNCILS ACT 1945

HAT, CAP AND MILLINERY WAGES COUNCIL (ENGLAND AND WALES)

The Hat, Cap and Millinery Wages Council (England and Wales), hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals (1) for the revocation of Hat, Cap and Millinery Wages Council (England and Wales) Wages Regulation (No 2) Order, 1946 (Order H M (34)), as amended by the Hat, Cap and Millinery Wages Council (England and Wales) Wages Regulation Order, 1947 (Order H M (36)) and for the fixing of specified statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration at present in operation and (2) for the amendment of the Hat, Cap and Millinery Wages Council (England and Wales) Wages Regulation (Holiday) Order, 1946, H M (32) which relates to holidays with pay
