PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Hedon, in the County of the East Riding of Yorkshire, 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Hedon in the said County of the East Riding of Yorkshire, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as follows, viz —

Hedon—Forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of the Parish Church of Saint Augustine, Hedon, Provided that—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave

(c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave

Now, Therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 23rd day of August next

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 23rd day of August.

Candidates should also have aptitude for the profession of Building Surveyor.
Quantity Surveyors	Professional Associateship of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (Quantities Section) or, for certain posts in the Admiralty, Air Ministry and the Ministry of Works, a wide experience of not less than seven years in quantity surveying (covering the preparation of estimates, analysis of prices, measuring work, variation and ordering of materials), and a course of study in a recognised school.

NOTE Candidates declared successful for the Admiralty, the Air Ministry or the Ministry of Works with this relaxed qualification will not be confirmed in their appointment unless within two years they pass the final examination for the A.R.I.C.S. (Quantities Section) or pass such other
