**THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868**

THE GOVERNING BODY OF RUGBY SCHOOL having on the 10th day of June, 1948, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above named Act, made a Statute in the terms appended hereto amending the existing Statutes of the said School, the said Statute is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute

**STATUTE** made by the Governing Body of Rugby School on the 10th day of June, 1948

The existing Statute XXXVII to be deleted in toto and a new Statute to be, and it is hereby enacted, as follows:—

**XXXVII**

Every Exhibition shall be tenable for four years, during which time the holder, having left the School shall pursue such studies at such University or other place of further education as may be approved by the Governing Body, and shall be held upon such other terms as the Governing Body may from time to time provide by Regulation Provided that the Governing Body shall have power to deprive of his Exhibition any Exhibitioner who shall in their opinion have been guilty of lack of industry or serious misconduct

1 The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd July, 1948, at 1 p m for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000

2 The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000 They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 26th July, 1948, to Saturday, the 31st July, 1948, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date

3 The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England
