The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 19 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, Section 9 of the Finance Act, 1932, Section 9 of the Finance Act, 1933, and Section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz. —

The Silk Duties (Drawback) (No. 2) Order, 1948, which amends the rate of drawback payable on the exportation of made up articles in respect of imported artificial silk tissues used in their manufacture, and also revises certain silk drawback rates as a result of the changes in the duty chargeable made in accordance with the agreement on Tariffs and Trade concluded at Geneva in 1947
