"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Cuddington and Ewell in the diocese of Guildford and out of

the parish of Saint Philip, Cheam Common in the diocese of Southwark.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas, we, the Church Commissioners are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is within the said area a consecrated church known as Saint John the Baptist, Stoneleigh, which has been approved by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the Bishop of Guildford by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the 18th March, 1948, and made pursuant to section 9 of the New Parishes Measure, 1943:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Guildford and the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony thereof they have set their hands and affixed their episcopal seals to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Constitution.*

(a) As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a new parish.

(b) The Church of Saint John the Baptist, Stoneleigh, aforesaid shall be the parish church of the parish.

(c) The name of the parish shall be 'The Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Stoneleigh'.

"2. *Diocese, Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.*

The parish shall be in the diocese of Guildford, in the Archdeaconry of Dorking and in the rural deanery of Epsom.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

All those contiguous portions of the parishes of Cuddington; Ewell; and Saint Philip, Cheam Common, which are bounded by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Cuddington from the parish of Saint Philip, Cheam Common, at a point in the middle of the railway bridge over the Wimbledon and Epsom line of the Southern Region of the British Railways and extending thence eastwards to and along the middle of the passage way running between Nos. 160 and 162 Stoneleigh Avenue and extending thence across the last mentioned Avenue to and along the middle of the passage way running between Nos. 155 and 157 Stoneleigh Avenue and extending thence southwards along the middle of the passage way at the back of No. 157 Stoneleigh Avenue to a point opposite to the middle of the passage way running between Nos. 140 and 142 Bridgewood Road and extending thence eastwards to and along the last mentioned passage way to its eastern end and extending thence first to and

then southwards along the middle of Bridgewood Road to a point opposite to the middle of the western end of the passage way running between Nos. 135 and 137 Bridgewood Road and extending thence to and along the middle of the last mentioned passage way to its junction with the western wall or fence of Cuddington Recreation Ground and extending thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the north eastern end of the southern wall or fence of the said Recreation Ground and extending thence south eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the north western end of the wall or fence which divides Nos. 75 and 77 Sparrow Farm Road and extending thence along the last mentioned wall or fence to its south eastern end and extending thence south eastwards to and along the middle of Sparrow Farm Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Philip, Cheam Common, from the parish of Cuddington and extending thence first south eastwards and then north eastwards along the last mentioned boundary, to a point opposite to the north western end of the wall or fence which divides Nonsuch Park from the houses on the south western side of Wickham Avenue and extending thence south eastwards along the north eastern boundary of Nonsuch Park to the boundary which divides the parish of Cuddington from the parish of Cheam and then following south eastwards along the last mentioned boundary to its junction with the boundary which divides the parish of Cuddington from the parish of Ewell and extending thence first south westwards and then north westwards along the last mentioned boundary to a point in the middle of Briarwood Road opposite to the north western end of the south western wall or fence of the house No. 12, Briarwood Road and then continuing north westwards along the middle of Briarwood Road to a point opposite to the middle of the north eastern end of Glenwood Road and extending south westwards first along the middle of Glenwood Road and then, passing the south eastern end of Calverly Road, to and along the middle of Park Avenue West to its junction with the Ewell By-Pass and extending thence first to and then north westwards along the middle of the said By-Pass under the railway line and then continuing in the same direction to and along the middle of Kingston Road to a point opposite to the middle of the south western end of Mavis Avenue and extending thence north eastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned Avenue to its junction with Walsingham Gardens and extending thence first to and then south eastwards along the last mentioned Gardens for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the public footpath and extending thence north eastwards to and along the said footpath between Nos. 120 and 122 Walsingham Gardens crossing between Nos. 27 and 29 and 30 and 32 Amberley Gardens, then between Nos. 113 and 115 and 114 and 116 Seaforth Gardens then between Nos. 105 and 107 Newbury Gardens across the last mentioned Gardens and then to and along the middle of The Byways to its junction with Westways then continuing in a straight line across Westways and then between Nos. 29 and 31 Westways and 36 and 38 of Cunliffe Road and extending thence first to and then south eastwards along the last named road crossing between Nos. 204 and 206 Stoneleigh Park Road to the middle of the Wimbledon and Epsom railway line of the Southern Region of the British Railways and extending thence northwards along the middle of the said railway line to the boundary which divides the parish of Cuddington from the parish of Saint Philip, Cheam Common."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said Dioceses of Guildford and Southwark.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is no consecrated church within the area and the Church of All Saints therein has been approved by us as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Joseph Wellington, Bishop of Truro (in testimony whereof has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:

1. *Constitution* (a) as from the licence thereto of a minister the area defined in the subjoined schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes until the consecration of the Church of All Saints therein situated and (b) as from the date of the consecration of the said church the area shall become a new parish and (c) the name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of All Saints, Carbis Bay.'

2. *Archdeaconry and rural deanery*. The said district and parish shall be in the archdeaconry of Cornwall and in the rural deanery of Penwith.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:—

"We, the Church Commissioners for England, have prepared and now lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme pursuant to the Episcopal Endowments and Stipends Measure, 1943, for vesting in us, the said Church Commissioners, all endowments and other property belonging to, or held in trust for, the Bishopric of Exeter or the Bishop thereof and for securing to the said Bishop the reduced stipend deemed to us appropriate:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Charles Bishop of Exeter was in occupation of the See at the date of the passing of the aforesaid Measure and has requested us, the said Church Commissioners, to prepare a Scheme with respect to the See:

"And whereas we have prepared this Scheme accordingly after consultation with the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese of Exeter who have offered no objection thereto:

"And whereas the said Charles Bishop of Exeter has approved the Scheme and in testimony of such approval has appended his signature to the Scheme:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Clement Richard Atlee, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has signified to us his consent to the preparation and submission of the Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the endowments and property belonging to the See of Exeter or held in trust therefor or for the Bishop thereof are described and referred to in the Schedule hereunder written:
