In this, and in the drill and bearing of the Steadfast Sea Cadets whom I have just inspected, as well as in the Great Power Station which lies before us, lies clear proof that for Kingston the past, however proud, is not enough. Your citizens, both young and old, are only content when they can keep themselves in the forefront of the nation's progress.

It was in 1863 that electricity was used as a new form of lighting to illuminate London Bridge in celebration of the Wedding of my Grandparents. During the eighty-five years which have passed since that innovation electricity has become a vital factor in our national well-being. Wherever we look—in industry, agriculture, transport and commerce; in science and medicine; in the home; in peace and war—we see its ever increasing use. The growing demand in recent years has outstripped the capacity of existing stations. But for the fire which destroyed the former Kingston plant, this Borough would have helped to carry the load which other stations have been bearing. This new Power Station, which was planned before the war, will make a real contribution towards increased supplies. In a few moments I shall declare the Kingston Power Station open. We shall then make a short tour of inspection, but I want now to take this opportunity to congratulate all who have been responsible for the planning, construction and equipment of this fine example of British enterprise, skill and workmanship.

## WAGES COUNCILS ACT, 1945.

### BAKING WAGES COUNCIL (ENGLAND AND WALES).

The Baking Wages Council (England and Wales) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for the revocation of the Baking Wages Council (England and Wales) Wages Regulation (No. 2) Order, 1947 (Order B.K.(28)) as amended by the Baking Wages Council Wages Regulation (No. 3) Order, 1947 (Order B.K.(34)) and for the fixing of statutory minimum remuneration in substitution for the statutory minimum remuneration at present in operation.
