A PROCLAMATION.

DETERMINING NEW DESIGNS FOR SILVER, CUPRO-NICKEL, MIXED METAL AND BRONZE COINS.

GEORGE R.

Whereas by Our Proclamation dated the twenty-second day of June, 1948, We did appoint and declare that, so far as conveniently may be, on all occasions and in all instruments wherein Our Style and Titles are used, in the Latin tongue, the words "Indiæ Imperator", and, in the English tongue, the words "Emperor of India" shall be omitted:

And whereas under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council from time to time by Proclamation to determine the design for any coin:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine new designs accordingly for the coins hereinafter specified, being certain of the silver and bronze coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, and of the cupro-nickel coins mentioned in the Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1946, and the coin of mixed metal mentioned in Our Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of March, 1937:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said section eleven and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. The designs for the said cupro-nickel, silver and bronze coins and the said coin of mixed metal shall be as follows:—

CUPRO-NICKEL COINS.

Half-Crown.—Every half-crown shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS VI D : G : BR : OMN : REX", and for the reverse the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a Shield having on each side the initial letter of Our Name in duplicate and interlaced surmounted by the Royal Crown, with the inscription "FID . DEF.", together with the words "HALF CROWN", and the date of the year. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

Florin.—Every florin shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the half-crown, and for the reverse a Rose, Thistle and Shamrock, surmounted by a Crown; and the letters "G" and "R" below; with the inscription "FID : DEF.:", together with the words "TWO SHILLINGS" and the date of the year. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

Shilling.—Every shilling shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the half-crown, and for the reverse either

- (a) Our Royal Crest of England, or
- (b) Our Royal Crest of Scotland,

with the inscription "FID . DEF." together with the words "ONE SHILLING" and the date of the year. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

Sixpence.—Every sixpence shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the half-crown, and for the reverse Our Royal Cipher surmounted by a Crown, with the inscription "FID DEF." together with the word "SIX-PENCE" and the date of the year. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

SILVER COINS.

The King's Maundy Monies.—Every Maundy silver fourpence, threepence, twopence and penny shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "GEORGIUS VI D : G : BR : OMN : REX FIDEI DEF." and for the reverse the respective figures "4", "3", "2", "1" (according to the denomination or value of the piece), in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled with an oak wreath surmounted by the Royal Crown. The coins shall have a plain edge.

COIN OF MIXED METAL.

Threepence.—Every threepence of mixed metal shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS VI D : G : BR : OMN : REX FIDEI DEF." and for the reverse impression a representation of the Plant commonly known as "Thrift", together with the words "THREE PENCE" and the date of the year. The coin shall have an edge having twelve sides.

BRONZE COINS.

Penny.—Every penny shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS VI D : G : BR : OMN : REX FIDEI DEF." and for the reverse impression the figure of Britannia seated on a rock surrounded by the sea, her right hand holding a shield which rests against the rock, while in her left hand she grasps a trident, with a Lighthouse in the distance; and the words "ONE PENNY", with the date of the year. The coin shall have a plain edge.

Half-penny.—Every half-penny shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the representation of a sailing ship, and the words "HALF PENNY" with the date of the year. The coin shall have a plain edge.

Farthing.—Every farthing shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the representation of a Wren, and the word "FARTHING" with the date of the year. The coin shall have a plain edge.

2. This Proclamation shall come into force on the first day of January One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this Twenty-second day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, and in the Thirteenth year of Our Reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of November, 1948 (G.H.300/48), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865 (28 & 29 Vict. c. 89), it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the authority to establish from time to time regulations for the admission of children into Greenwich Hospital School, shall be vested exclusively in the Admiralty, but any such regulations shall not have effect unless and until they are approved by Your Majesty in Council.

"And Whereas the existing regulations for the Admission of Boys into the School, were approved by an Order in Council of 12th December, 1883, made by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria.

"And Whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the Regulations for admission to Greenwich Hospital School. We beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty will be pleased to approve the following regulations in lieu of those previously authorised.

"REGULATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION OF BOYS TO GREENWICH HOSPITAL SCHOOL.

"1. Admission to the School will be restricted to the sons of British subjects whether by birth, by naturalisation, by registration, or by citizenship, and who are sons of (a) Commissioned Officers, Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, Petty Officers or men of the Royal Navy and Marines, (b) Officers and men of the Royal Naval Reserve and (c) Other Seafaring men, and men drowned on Lifeboat Service.

"2. Claims for admission to the School will be determined in such manner as the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty may decide, but the Selectors will give special consideration to orphans and have regard to the length and merit of the father's sea service.

"3. Boys are normally eligible for admission between the ages of 11 and 12 years.

"4. Prior to admission, candidates will be required to undergo an educational and medical examination to determine their fitness for entry.

"5. The said Lords Commissioners may issue from time to time such detailed instructions for carrying the above provisions into effect as They may decide to be necessary."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

This Order may be cited as the Greenwich Hospital School (Regulations) (Amendment) Order, 1948.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of November, 1948 (G.H. 263/47), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 2 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1883 (46 & 47 Vict. c. 32), as amended by Section 2 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1947 (10 & 11 Geo. 6. c. 5), it is enacted that the Admiralty may out of the funds of Greenwich Hospital grant pensions to widows and allowances to children of any person deceased, whether before or after the passing of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1947, while serving, or having served as a non-commissioned officer Petty Officer or man of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines or of any naval reserve force, and may out of the said funds grant gratuities to parents or other relatives dependent on any such person deceased as aforesaid so however that the total expenditure in such gratuities shall not exceed in any one year the sum of five hundred pounds, and so that pensions allowances and gratuities shall not

be granted by virtue of the said Section as amended except in accordance with regulations of the Admiralty made under Section 4 of the said Act of 1883.

"And Whereas by Section 4 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1883, it is enacted that regulations made by the Admiralty under that Act shall not have effect unless and until approved by Your Majesty in Council; we beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty may be pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following Regulations:—

"1. In cases of exceptional financial distress Pensions of 10s. 6d. per week may be granted by the Admiralty out of the funds of Greenwich Hospital to the widow of any person deceased, whether before or after the passing of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1947, while serving, or having served, as a non-commissioned officer, Petty Officer or man of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines or of any naval reserve force. Awards of these pensions will be granted only in very exceptional necessitous circumstances.

"2. Owing to the limited funds available for this benefit, the total number of awards in force at any one time will be small. Priority will be given to the following classes, and awards will normally be restricted to these classes:—

(a) Widows of men who have given not less than 22 years' service in the Royal Navy or 21 years in the Royal Marines.

(b) Widows of men who, having given a shorter period of service, died while serving, or were invalided.

Awards will be made on a temporary basis, normally for one year, with review of the pensioner's circumstances at the end of that period.

"3. A widow in receipt of a pension in respect of the attributability of her husband's death to H.M. Service will be ineligible for the above pension.

"4. If a widow re-marries her pension will cease.

"5. Pensions and allowances are tenable subject to good behaviour and are granted at the discretion of the Admiralty. They cannot be claimed as a right. Any assignment, sale or contract relating to a Pension is void.

"6. Widows without children under 15 years of age will be medically surveyed by an Admiralty Surgeon and Agent in order to ascertain the degree (if any) and probable duration of any infirmity.

"7. Widows will be required to make a declaratory quarterly or whenever it be considered necessary, before a duly authorised person, as to their continued widowhood and distressed circumstances.

"8. The number of Greenwich Hospital Widows pensions in force at any one time under this Order shall not exceed 150.

"9. In the event of men specified in paragraph 1 of these Regulations dying as widowers or without having been married, but leaving parents or other relatives dependent upon them, gratuities not exceeding £50 may be given at the discretion of the Admiralty to such parents or relatives (provided the total expenditure on such Gratuities shall not exceed in any one year the sum of £500). No gratuity will be payable in any case where the death of the man has been accepted as attributable to Service."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 6th day of December, 1948, (C.W.31180/47) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being

or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 13th day of May, 1901, authority was given for Officers who have been allowed to resign from the Royal Navy, but who volunteered for service in War or Emergency, to retain their Commissions and to be borne on an 'Emergency' List:

"And whereas consequent on constitutional changes in India, a number of British Officers formerly serving in the Royal Indian Navy have been retired from that force and such Officers have no liability for recall for further service with the Royal Indian Navy or the Royal Pakistan Navy in War or Emergency:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that such Officers would form a valuable addition to the Reserves of Your Majesty's Naval Forces and should be invited to join the Emergency List of the Royal Navy:

"And whereas this will involve the grant of commissions in the Royal Navy to those Officers who are enrolled on the Emergency List, but the commissions will not carry any pay, pension or promotion whilst the Officers are unemployed.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council to approve the enrolment, at our discretion, on the Royal Naval Emergency List, of British Officers on the Retired List of the Royal Indian Navy.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Bishops Resignation Act, 1869, a representation has been made to His Majesty by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Geoffrey Francis, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan at the instance of the Right Reverend Charles Edward, by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Exeter and as such a Bishop of a Diocese within and of the Province of Canterbury, that the said Bishop is desirous of resigning his Bishopric (such resignation to take formal effect upon the 4th day of December, 1948), by reason that he is incapacitated by age from the due performance of his duties as Bishop:

And Whereas His Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity and that the said Bishop has canonically resigned:

Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared that the said Bishopric of Exeter became vacant on the 4th day of December, 1948, and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Exeter.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of November, 1948, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty

in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Ecclesfield; Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield; Saint Mark, Grenoside; and Saint James and Saint Christopher, Shiregreen all in the diocese of Sheffield.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Ecclesfield; Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield; Saint Mark, Grenoside; and Saint James and Saint Christopher, Shiregreen, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory, shown by the pink colour on the map, to be annexed to the parish of Ecclesfield:—

All that portion of the parish of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield, which is bounded upon the northeast and part of the northwest by the parish of Ecclesfield, upon the remaining part of the northwest by the parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, from the parish of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield, at the middle of the junction of Chaucer Road and Yew Lane and continuing thence south-westwards along the middle of Chaucer Road to the point where it crosses the stream or drain known as Tongue Gutter and continuing thence generally eastwards along the middle of Tongue Gutter to the boundary which divides the parish of Ecclesfield from the parish of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield.

"2. The territory, shown by the green colour on the map, to be annexed to the parish of Saint James and Saint Christopher, Shiregreen:—

All that portion of the parish of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield, which lies to the northeast of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Ecclesfield from the parish of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield, in the middle of the footbridge known as Gregg House Bridge over Hartley Brook Dike and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the footpath leading to Hartley Brook Avenue to a point in the middle of Hartley Brook Avenue and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Hartley Brook Avenue to a point opposite to the middle of the northwestern end of Molineaux Road and continuing thence south-eastwards along the middle of Molineaux Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield, from the parish of Saint James and Saint Christopher, Shiregreen.

"3. The territory, shown by the brown colour on the map, to be annexed to the parish of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield:—

All that portion of the parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, which is bounded on the southwest by the parish of Hillsborough and Wadsley Bridge, upon the east by the parish of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, from the parish of Saint Cecilia, Parson Cross, Sheffield, in the middle of Halifax Road and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of Halifax Road to a point opposite to the southeastern end of the wall or fence forming the northeastern side of Holme Lane and continuing thence firstly northwestwards along the said wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Holme Lane Farm, then southwards, then westwards, and then southwards along the wall or fence forming the western boundary of Holme Lane Farm to and then generally westwards along the walls or fences which divide closes Number 1210, 1209 and 1208 from closes Number 1657 and 1662 to a point in the middle of Long Lane opposite to the western end of the wall or fence which divides close

Number 1208 from close Number 1662 and continuing thence firstly southeastwards and then southwestwards along the middle of Long Lane to the boundary which divides the parish of Hillsborough and Wadsley Bridge from the parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the Twenty-sixth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of a certain estate or interest in the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Stockbridge in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas under the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 4th day of November, 1938, and published in the London Gazette of the 8th day of the same month, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice became vested in Edward Rigby Kewley, D.S.O., of Little Dean House, Stockbridge, in the said county of Southampton, a Lieutenant-Colonel in Your Majesty's Army, and Eleanor Hilda Kewley, his wife, as joint tenants, and as from the decease of one of them, was directed to be transferred to the survivor for the term of his or her natural life, and as from the decease of the survivor, was directed to be transferred to the Bishop of Winchester for the time being and his successors:

"And whereas the said Edward Rigby Kewley and Eleanor Hilda Kewley desire to surrender their life interest in the advowson of the said benefice so vested in them to the Bishop of Winchester for the time being to the intent that the perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice may forthwith become exercisable by the said Bishop and his successors:

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edward Rigby Kewley and Eleanor Hilda Kewley and of the Right Reverend Mervyn, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the estate or interest of the said Edward Rigby Kewley and Eleanor Hilda Kewley in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage

of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Mervyn, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the said Bishop and his successors for ever."

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth in the diocese of Durham:

"Whereas we are satisfied that Wilfred Reay-Smith, of Green Rising, Riding Mill, in the county of Northumberland, Solicitor; and William Henry Wilson, of Blandford Forum, in the county of Dorset, Solicitor, are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Wilfred Reay-Smith, and William Henry Wilson desire to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Durham for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Durham, (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Alwyn, Bishop of Durham, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Durham for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.
