CATERING WAGES ACT, 1943.

UNLICENSED PLACE OF REFRESHMENT WAGES BOARD.

The Unlicensed Place of Refreshment Wages Board hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals (1) for the revocation of the Wages Regulation (Unlicensed Place of Refreshment) Order, 1947 (Order UPR(3)), and for fixing remuneration to be paid to certain workers in substitution for the remuneration at present in operation and (2) for the amendment of the Wages Regulation (Unlicensed Place of Refreshment) (Holidays) Order, 1947 (Order UPR (4)).

The Wages Board will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within three weeks from 4th January, 1949.
