Lieutenant-Commander Tom Peter BAILLIE-GROHMAN, D.S.C., Royal Navy.

For distinguished services as King's Harbour Master at Haifa during the last weeks of the British occupation of Palestine. His sound judgement, restraint and consistent disregard for his own safety under difficult and provoking conditions were important factors in maintaining the essential services of the port at a critical time.
