CATERING WAGES ACT, 1943.**UNLICENSED RESIDENTIAL ESTABLISHMENT WAGES BOARD.**

The Unlicensed Residential Establishment Wages Board hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals (1) for fixing intervals for rest and the remuneration to be paid to certain male and female workers in relation to whom the Wages Board operates and (2) for allowing holidays and fixing holiday remuneration in respect of those workers.

Particulars of the proposals may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Board at the address given below or to any local office of the Ministry of Labour and National Service.

The Wages Board will consider any written representations with respect to the above-mentioned proposals which may be sent to it within six weeks from 8th February, 1949. Any such representation should be signed by the person making the same (adding his or her address) and sent to the Secretary, Unlicensed Residential Establishment Wages Board, Queen Anne's Chambers, 28, Broadway, London, S.W.1. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise grounds of their objections.
