A PROCLAMATION

Granting Prize Money and regulating its distribution GEORGE R.

GEORGE R. Whereas by the Prize Act, 1948, it is provided that if We are pleased by Proclamation or Order in Council to signify Our intention to make a grant of prize money out of the proceeds of prize captured in the late war, there shall be paid into the Royal Naval Prize Fund the sum of, or sums amounting in the aggregate to, four million pounds, and into the Royal Air Force Prize Fund the sum of, or sums amounting in the aggregate to, one million two hundred and fifty thousand pounds, and further that sums of such respective amounts as We may by the said Pro-clamation or Order in Council determine shall be dis-tributed out of the Royal Naval Prize Fund, in such manner as We may so determine, to such persons who are or have been members of any of Our naval and marine forces, or of the crews, raised as men-tioned in the said Act, of any of Our ships of war, or in the case of their death to their representatives, as We may so determine: as We may so determine:

And whereas by the said Act it is provided that persons who during the late war were members of the Royal Artillery and served as such in any ship or vessel for the purpose of defending it against enemy attack shall be deemed to have been members of the said naval forces:

of the said naval forces: And whereas by the Naval Agency and Distribu-tion Act, 1864, it is provided that money distributable among the officers and crews of any of Our ships of war in respect of awards made in the several cases therein mentioned, so far as full provision respecting the distribution thereof is not made by or under any Act of Parliament other than that Act, shall be distributed under the direction of the Lords Com-missioners of the Admiralty in the shares in that behalf specified in any Royal Proclamation or Order in Council.

in Council: We do therefore now make known to all Our loving subjects, and to all others whom it may concern by this Our Proclamation by and with the advice of Our Privy Council that Our Royal Will and Pleasure is and We do hereby order and direct that a grant of prize money shall be made out of the proceeding of prize contraction is between ord We do proceeds of prize captured in the late war and We do hereby determine that the sum or sums to be paid as aforesaid into the Royal Naval Prize Fund shall be distributed at such time as the Admiralty may direct

(a) to such of the persons referred to in sec-tion 2 of the Prize Act, 1948, as are specified in the following regulations or, in the case of their death, to their representatives; and (b) in such shares and proportions as are men-tioned in those regulations:

1.—(a) Participation shall be allowed to each in-dividual officer and man who performed service at sea for a period of not less than 180 days between 3rd September, 1939, and 2nd September, 1945, and

who notifies the Admiralty of his claim to participate not later than 12 months from the date on which applications are invited by the Admiralty. (b) Irrespective of actual time served at sea, par-ticipation shall be allowed in all cases in which officers or men were killed in action at sea, died of wounds received in, or from causes directly attributable to, action at sea, were lost at sea, or died at sea of injury or illness attributable to service afloat, provided that when the death occurred or the wounds, injury or illness were sustained, the officer or man was serving in a sea-going ship of war on or convoy duties or in a mer-chant ship as a member of the gun's crew or for the chant ship as a member of the gun's crew or for the purpose of operating or maintaining naval aircraft.

2. For the purposes of these regulations service at sea means service performed by persons

(a) while borne for pay on the books of a sea-

going ship of war; (b) while borne for pay on the books of a non-seagoing ship or Admiralty establishment for ser-

(c) while borne for pay on the books of a non-seagoing ship for service in operational Coastal Force craft;

Force craft; (d) who went to sea as members of the regular crews of Combined Operations craft while borne for pay on the books of a commissioned non-seagoing depot ship for service in the Combined Operations organisation; (e) while borne for pay on the books of offensively armed auxiliary vessels or on the books of a non-seagoing ship for service in offensively

of a non-seagoing ship for service in offensively armed auxiliary vessels;

(f) while borne for pay on the books of a non-seagoing ship under T.124 agreements or variants thereof or under commissioned Admiralty cable-ship agreements for service in a seagoing ship of war

(g) while borne for pay on the books of a non-seagoing ship for convoy duties; (h) while serving in a merchant ship as members of the gun's crew or for the purpose of operating or maintaining naval aircraft.

3. Each individual officer and man shall be allotted 3. Each individual officer and man shall be allotted the number of shares attributed by the scale ap-pended to Regulation 9 to the rank or rating held by him on 2nd September, 1945, or on the date of his release, discharge or death, if earlier. Officers, ratings and other ranks holding higher paid tem-porary, acting temporary, probationary or acting rank on such date shall be treated as though they had been confirmed in that rank.

4. Members of the Navy, Army and Air Force Institute canteen staff who were entered in the Naval Canteen Service will be eligible for prize money under these regulations and shall be entitled to reckon service in canteens in Our seagoing ships from 3rd September, 1939, towards the qualifying period. September, 1939, towards the qualitying period. Subject to the regulations governing misconduct, members of the Navy, Army and Air Force Institute canteen staff who died, were invalided or otherwise ceased to serve after serving the qualifying period but before transfer to naval ratings in the Naval Canteen Service shall be treated as though they had entered the Naval Canteen Service with rating relative to their grade in the Navy, Army and Air Force Institute Canteen Service at the time when they ceased to serve.

they ceased to serve. 5. Persons who, having been members of the naval and marine forces raised by the Government of the United Kingdom, were before 3rd September, 1945, permanently transferred to the naval or marine forces of a fully self-governing country of the British Commonwealth of Nations, shall not be entitled to prize money under these regulations if on transfer to those forces they have become entitled to any prize money or equivalent benefits granted to naval or marine forces of that country. Persons who, having been members of the naval and marine forces raised by the Government of a fully self-governing country of the British Commonwealth of Nations, were on or after 3rd September, 1945, permanently transferred to the naval or marine forces raised by the Government of the United Kingdom shall not be entitled to prize money under these regulations. entitled to prize money under these regulations.

6. Members of the Section Belge shall not be entitled to prize money under these regulations.

7. No person who has incurred forfeiture of prize money under the Naval Discipline Act, or who has been dismissed from Our service or whose services have been terminated for misconduct shall be entitled to prize money under these regulations.

8. In the event of any difficulty arising with respect to any of these regulations, or if any case should occur not herein provided for, the Admiralty shall be competent to issue such directions thereon as may appear just and expedient.

9. The distribution is to be made so that each officer, rating and other rank entitled to participate shall receive shares according to his rank, rating, age or seniority as set forth in the following scale, or if not so laid down as determined by the Admiralty.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of January, 1949, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pur-suance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have pre-pared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cyril, Archbishop of York (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effect-ing the union of the benefice of Sunk Island and the benefice of Ottringham both situate in the Diocese of York.

" SCHEME.

"1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Sunk Island and the benefice of Ottringham shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Sunk Island with Ottringham', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day where any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this. Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend William Owesen Allingham Passmore if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Ottringham shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. Parsonage house. Upon the union taking effect (a) the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Ottringham shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and (b) the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Sunk Island and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually

occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Church Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us for the benefit of the united benefice.

"4. Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benfices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Sunk Island having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union."

"Whereas, we, the Church Commissioners are satis-fied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting

hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish: "And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided: "And whereas there is within the said area a con-secrated church known as the church of the Holy Innocents, which has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the Archbishop of Canterbury by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the 12th of August, 1948, and made pursuant to section 9 of the New Parishes Measure, 1943: "Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his archiepiscopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that

BYE-LAWS OF THE INSTITUTE OF CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

Appended to the Royal Charter of the 21st Decem-ber, 1948, and approved by His Majesty the King in Council on the 26th November, 1948.

CHAPTER I.--PRELIMINARY.

Commencement of bye-laws.

1. These bye-laws appended to the Supplemental Royal Charter (hereinafter referred to as "the Supplemental Charter") and constituted by the Supplemental Charter the bye-laws of the Institute shall take effect on the date when the Supplemental Charter shall have been granted and any bye-laws made thereunder subsequent to the said date shall take effect from the date when the same shall have been allowed by the Lords of His Majesty's

Most Honourable Privy Council. In these bye-laws "the Royal Charters" mean the Royal Charter of the eleventh day of May 1880 and the Supplemental Charter.

Meaning of words used in bye-laws.

2. Words in these bye-laws have the same mean-ing as in the Royal Charters; and references herein to members, fellows, associates and meetings shall, unless the contrary intention appear, be construed as having reference to members, fellows, associates and meetings respectively of the Institute. *Articled clerk* means a clerk serving under articles with a member of the Institute in practice. *Metropolic* means the London Postal Area as may

Metropolis means the London Postal Area as may be designated from time to time by His Majesty's Postmaster-General.

Postmaster-General. Principal means a member of the Institute in prac-tice in England or Wales with whom an articled clerk is serving under articles. Principal place of business means the place of business registered by a member with the Institute or where more than one place of business is regis-tered by him the place of business indicated by him as being his principal place of business. as being his principal place of business.

Secretary means the Secretary or any Deputy or Assistant Secretary appointed by the Council or any person acting as Secretary by the direction of the Council.

Forms.

3. The forms set forth in the schedule to these bye-laws and such other forms as the Council may from time to time authorise shall be used in the cases to which they are applicable with such altera-tions or additions thereto as the Council may from time to time determine; and all notes and directions therein shall be deemed to be part of the forms and the observed accordingly be observed accordingly.

Notices to members.

4. All notices required by the Royal Charters and these bye-laws to be given or sent to members shall be sent by post in the case of a member in practice to his principal place of business and in the case of a member not in practice to the address last notified by him to the Secretary as his address for communications and in proving that such notice has been given or sent it shall be sufficient to prove that such notice was properly addressed and posted such notice was properly addressed and posted.

CHAPTER II.-THE COUNCIL. Members of the Council.

5. The number of the members of the Council shall be forty-five of whom nine shall retire at each annual meeting of the Institute but shall be eligible for re-election. Subject to the provisions of bye-law 13 the retiring members at each annual meeting shall be those who have been longest in office since their date of election or last re-election.

Retiring members of the Council deemed to be nominated.

6. Every retiring member of the Council shall, unless he shall have signified to the Council in writing not later than five weeks before the annual meeting his desire not to offer himself for re-election, be deemed to be nominated for re-election.

Nomination of candidates for Council.

Nomination of candidates for Council. 7. Nomination of candidates for election to the Council other than those deemed to be nominated under bye-law 6 shall be made by notice in writing signed by ten members and received by the Secre-tary not later than five weeks before the date of the annual meeting. Such notice shall be accompanied by an intimation in writing from each candidate of his willingness to serve if elected. If after such notice shall be given as aforesaid the annual meet-ing be called for a date (other than the first Wedness-day in May) less than five weeks from the date of the receipt by the Secretary of such notice the said the receipt by the Secretary of such notice the said notice shall be deemed to have been received by the Secretary more than five weeks before such meeting.

Notice of nomination of candidates for Council.

8. Notice of the names of all candidates nominated 8. Notice of the names of all candidates nominated or deemed to be nominated under the last two pre-ceding bye-laws shall be sent to all members at least fourteen days before the annual meeting. If more candidates are nominated, including those deemed to be nominated, than there are vacancies to be filled the members of the Institute shall at the

annual meeting fill the vacancies by election from the said candidates. If no more candidates are nominated, including those deemed to be nominated, than there are vacancies to be filled those nominated, or deemed to be nominated, shall at the annual meeting be declared elected to the Council. If sufficient candidates are not elected at an annual meeting the resulting vacancies may be filled by the Council at a meeting of the Council summoned with notice of the object. notice of the object.

notice of the object. Election of members of Council at annual meetings, and postal ballots. 9. Any election of members of the Council at an annual meeting shall be either by a show of hands or by ballot of those present whichever may appear to the chairman of the meeting to be the more convenient. Each member present at the meeting shall have as many votes as there are vacancies to be filled but shall not give more than one vote to any one candidate. Those candidates, to the number of the vacancies to be filled, who receive the most votes shall be elected but in the event of an equality of votes between two or more candidates the chair-man shall have a casting vote or votes. The declara-tion of the chairman as to the result of the election shall be final save that upon such declaration being made a postal ballot may be demanded in writing

shall be final save that upon such declaration being made a postal ballot may be demanded in writing at the meeting by not less than twenty-five members. If a postal ballot be so demanded ballot papers setting out the names of all candidates nominated, or deemed to be nominated, shall be sent to all members entitled to vote together with all necessary notes and directions within fourteen days of the meeting. As far as is practicable the provisions of bye-laws 98 to 101 relating to the taking of a poll shall apply to a postal ballot. Until the result of a postal ballot shall have been reported by the scrutineers appointed to act in respect of such ballot (or, where necessary, the chairman shall have declared the result of the postal ballot) the retiring members of the Council shall continue to be members of the Council and may act accordingly.

act accordingly.

Vacation of office of member of Council.

10. The office of a member of the Council is vacated:

acated: (a) If he cease to be a member of the Institute. (b) If he be excluded or suspended from mem-bership or be reprimanded or admonished under the provisions of the Royal Charters and these bye-laws.

bye-laws.
(c) If he be absent from the meetings of the Council for more than six consecutive months without the consent of the Council.
(d) If he become bankrupt, or suspend payment, or compound with or make an assignment of his property for the benefit of his creditors.
(e) If he be declared lunatic, or become of unsecuted mind

(f) If he be convicted of a felony.

Resignation of member of Council.

11. A member of the Council may tender his resignation of office by notice in writing to the Coun-cil and on its acceptance by the Council, but not until then, he shall cease to be a member of the Council.

Removal of member of Council.

12. The Institute may, by a resolution passed at a meeting specially convened with notice of the object (and for which resolution not less than two-thirds of the members present and voting shall vote), remove any member of the Council from his office before the expiration of his period of office: Provided that if a poll be demanded as to the resolution for removal a majority of not less than two-thirds of those voting shall be necessary on the taking of the poll for the carrying of that resolution. A vacancy created by the removal of a member of the Council shall be filled by the Council under bye-law 13. law 13.

Vacancies in Council.

13. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the Council between two annual meetings the vacancy may be filled by the Council at a meeting of the Council summoned with notice of the object but such an appointment shall be subject to confirmation at the next succeeding annual meeting. Any person so becoming a member of the Council shall hold office only during the time the member of the Council in whose place he is appointed would have been en-titled to hold office but he shall be eligible for re-election.

CHAPTER III.—PROCEEDINGS AND POWERS OF THE COUNCIL.

Meetings of Council.

14. The Council shall meet at the Institute on the first Wednesday in each month. or at such other times and places as it may determine.

Meetings of Council, how called.

15. A meeting of the Council may at any time be called by order of the President or Vice-President, or at the request in writing, addressed to the Secre-tary, of five members of the Council.

Notice of meetings of Council.

16. Notice in writing of a meeting of the Council shall be delivered or sent to each member of the Council at least three clear days before such meet-ing, excluding the day on which the notice is delivered or sent and the day on which the meeting is to be held. The notice shall contain as far as is practicable a statement of the business to be transacted at such a statement of the business to be transacted at such meeting. It shall not be necessary in any case to prove that such notice has been delivered or sent but the same shall be taken as duly delivered or sent unless the contrary be shown and the non-receipt of any notice by any member shall not affect the validity of the proceedings of any meeting: Provided that when the President or Vice-President ordering a meeting certifies in writing that an emergency exists notice in writing as aforesaid need be delivered or notice in writing as aforesaid need be delivered or sent only one clear day before such meeting, exclud-ing the day on which the notice is delivered or sent and the day on which the meeting is held and in such a case the non-existence in fact of the supposed emergency shall not affect the validity of the pro-ceedings of the meeting.

Chairman of Council.

17. At all meetings of the Council the President, or in his absence the Vice-President, shall be chair-man; or, in the absence of both, the chairman shall be elected by those present and voting from among these present and voting from among their number.

Voting at meetings of Council.

18. At all meetings of the Council the vote of the bare majority of those present and voting shall pre-vail (except where otherwise required by the Royal Charters or these bye-laws) and in case of equality of votes the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his original vote.

Adjournment of meetings of Council.

19. Subject to the provisions of these bye-laws the chairman of any meeting of the Council may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn the meeting from time to time and from place to place but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meet-ing from which the adjournment took place ing from which the adjournment took place. No notice need be given of an adjourned meeting unless it be so directed in the resolution for adjournment.

Quorum of Council.

20. Except where otherwise required by the Royal Charters or these bye-laws, seven members of the Council shall form a quorum.

Election of President and Vice-President.

21. At the first meeting of the Council after every annual meeting the members of the Council present shall choose one of the members of the Council as President and another as Vice-President and the members so chosen shall hold the office of President and Vice-President respectively until the first meeting of the Council held after the next succeeding annual meeting. Any vacancy in either of those offices shall be filled at the next meeting of the Council.

Minutes of meetings of Council.

22. Proper minutes shall be recorded of all resolutions and proceedings of meetings of the Council and of the committees thereof; and every minute signed by the chairman of the meeting to which it relates, or by the chairman of a subsequent meeting, shall be sufficient evidence of the facts therein stated.

Receipts and payments.

23. All moneys received by the Institute shall be paid into an account of the Institute at its bankers and cheques drawn upon its bankers shall be signed by two members of the Council or by a member of the Council and the Secretary.

Investment and employment of funds.

24. All funds of the Institute not needed immediately for the ordinary purposes of the Institute may be invested by the Council in the name of the Institute:

(a) in any securities in which trustees are or may by Act of Parliament be authorised to invest and also in—

(i) the stock or other securities of any local authority in the United Kingdom or the Dominion of Canada or any province forming part thereof or the Commonwealth of Australia or any state forming part thereof or the Dominion of New Zealand or the Union of South Africa. South Africa

(ii) the stock, shares or other securities of any (11) the stock, snares or other securities of any statutory undertakers, that is to say, a local authority, company or other body or person authorised by or under an Act of Parliament or an Order having the force of an Act of Parliament to construct, work or carry on a railway, canal, inland navigation, dock, harbour, tramway case electricity water sewage disposal

raniament to construct, work or carry on a railway, canal, inland navigation, dock, harbour, tramway, gas, electricity, water, sewage disposal or other public undertaking; (iii) the debentures or debenture stock or the preference or wholly or partially guaranteed stock or shares of any company incorporated by a special Act of or provisional Order con-firmed by or by or under a public general Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom, or of the Dominion of Canada, or of the Common-wealth of Australia, or of the Dominion of New Zealand, or of the Union of South Africa, or by Royal Charter, being a company which has paid dividends upon its ordinary capital at an average rate of not less than three per cent. for at least the ten years next before the time of investment (of which fact a letter purporting to be signed by the secretary of the company or by a banker or member of a firm of bankers or by the secretary or manager of a joint stock bank or of any branch thereof shall be sufficient evidence); (iv) the ordinary or other stock or shares of

bank or of any branch thereof shall be sufficient evidence); (iv) the ordinary or other stock or shares of any company incorporated in manner set out in sub-paragraph (iii) above being a company which has paid dividends upon its ordinary capital at an average rate of not less than four per cent. for at least the ten years next before the time of investment (of which fact such a letter as aforesaid shall be sufficient evidence):

Provided that the power conferred by this bye-law shall not extend to any stocks shares or other securities issued to bearer or subject to any liability

securities issued to bearer or subject to any hability for calls or other payments. (b) on mortgage of leasehold property situated in Great Britain having not less than sixty years unexpired at the time of investment with or with-out collateral security by way of sinking fund policy or policies or otherwise. (c) in the purchase of freehold or leasehold pro-perty in Great Britain, the latter having not less than sixty years unexpired at the time of nurchase

than sixty years unexpired at the time of purchase.

The Council may at its discretion from time to time vary or sell any of the investments of the Institute and may invest the proceeds of such sale in any of the stocks, shares, securities, mortgages or property hereinbefore set out. The Council may also at its discretion place any money of the Institute on deposit with bankers, build-ing societies or other financial institutions to be selected by the Council.

Borrowing powers.

25. The Council may from time to time borrow money for the purposes of the Institute and may pay interest thereon out of the funds of the Institute.

Expenses of members of Council.

26. The Council may pay out of the funds of the Institute to any member of the Council whose principal place of business is not within the Metro-polis the first-class return railway fare from his principal place of business to London and a reason-able subsistence allowance on each occasion of such member attending a meeting of the Council or any committee or sub-committee of the Council or of the Institute held in the Metropolis. Where such meeting is not held within the Metropolis the Council may pay to any member of the Council whose may pay to any member of the Council whose principal place of business is not within five miles of the place where the meeting is held the first-class

return railway fare from his principal place of business to the place where the meeting is held and a reasonable subsistence allowance. The Council business to the place where the meeting is held and a reasonable subsistence allowance. The Council may also pay out of the funds of the Institute the expenses reasonably and properly incurred by the President, Vice-President or any member of the Council when acting in his official capacity for or on behalf of the Institute.

Publication of list of members.

27. The Council shall from time to time publish or cause to be published at the expense of the In-stitute a list of the members of the Institute together with such other particulars concerning the Institute, its members or its objects as the Council may deem advisable and such publication shall be supplied to members and others gratuitously or at such prices as the Council shall from time to time determine.

Appointment of committees.

28. Subject to the provisions of the Royal Charters and these bye-laws the Council may appoint com-mittees from among its members and may give power mittees from among its members and may give power to such committees to co-opt other members of the Institute and may fix the quorum thereof and may delegate any of its powers to such committees and may lay down rules for regulating the proceedings of such committees: Provided that nothing contained in this bye-law shall affect the provisions set out in these bye-laws with regard to the Investigation Disciplinary and Appeal Committees. The President and Vice-President shall by virtue of their offices be members of all committees save that they shall not be members of the Investigation Committee or Dismembers of the Investigation Committee or Dis-ciplinary Committee.

Custody of Common Seal.

29. The Common Seal shall be kept in such custody as the Council may from time to time determine.

Use of Common Seal.

30. The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any instrument except by order of the Council and in the presence of two members of the Council; and every such instrument shall be signed by the two members of the Council in whose presence the Seal is affixed and by the Secretary.

CHAPTER IV.—MEMBERS.

Admission and election of members.

31. All admissions of associates and elections of fellows shall be by the Council. Every applicant for admission as associate or for election to fellowship shall satisfy the Council of his having fulfilled the conditions specified by the Royal Charters and these bye-laws in such manner as the Council shall require and shall produce such evidence of his fitness to be so admitted or elected as the Council shall deem necessary. The Council may in its absolute dis-cretion, by resolution passed at a meeting of the Council (at which meeting there shall be present and voting not less than twelve members of the Council and for which resolution not less than three-fourths of the members present and voting shall vote), refuse to admit or to elect any person whom it shall consider not to be a fit and proper person to be so admitted or alocited or elected.

Age of admission.

32. No person shall be admitted to membership before he has attained the age of twenty-one years.

Member to be bound by Royal Charters and bye-laws.

33. Every person before becoming a member shall undertake to be bound by the Royal Charters and by the bye-laws in force at the time of his admission or which may thereafter from time to time be made.

Certificates of admission, election and practice.

34. Upon a person being admitted an associate and upon his commencing to practise and upon his being elected to fellowship he shall in each event be entitled to a certificate to that effect under seal.

Particulars to be supplied by members.

35. Within 28 days of being admitted, an associate shall send to the Secretary full particulars of his name, address and place of business or employment, if any, (and where there is more than one place of

business indicating which is his principal place of business) stating whether he is in practice. It shall be the duty of each member to inform the Sccretary of any change of address, place or places of business or employment, or if he begins or ceases to practise. It shall further be the duty of each member to supply the Council with any other information relative to his practice or employment which the Council may reasonably require for carrying out the provisions of the Royal Charters or these bye-laws.

Admission of members in special cases.

36. The Council may admit as an associate any person in whose favour any exemptions or modifica-tions under bye-law 63 shall have been made or granted: Provided that he shall otherwise have com-plied with the provisions of the Royal Charters and these bye-laws applicable in his case.

Election to fellowship if practice not continuous.

Blechon to fellowship if practice not continuous. 37. The Council may, by resolution passed at a meeting specially convened with notice of the object (and for which resolution not less than two-thirds of the members present and voting shall vote), elect as a fellow any person who would have been eligible for such election but for the fact that the period of practice required by clause 6 of the Supplemental Charter has, on account of ill-health or for other causes satisfactory to the Council, not been continuous.

Resignation of membership and re-admission.

Resignation of membership and re-admission. 38. Any member may tender his resignation of membership by sending notice in writing to the Council and on its acceptance by the Council, but not until then, he shall cease to be a member: Provided that any member whose notice of resigna-tion shall not have been received prior to the 1st February in any year shall remain liable for any fee or subscription in respect of that year save that in any case in which it may seem reasonable so to do the Council may remit the whole or any part of such fee or subscription. The Council may, by resolution passed at a meeting specially convened with notice of the object (and for which resolution not less than two-thirds of those present and voting shall vote), re-admit to membership, subject to such shall vote), re-admit to membership, subject to such terms and conditions as to the Council may seem fit, any person who has resigned.

Admission fee.

39. Each person who is admitted an associate shall pay an admission fee of £10 10s.

Fellowship election fee.

40. Each associate who is elected a fellow shall pay a fellowship election fee of £5 5s.

Admission or election void if fee unpaid.

41. The admission of any person an associate or the election of any person a fellow shall be void unless the admission fee or fellowship election fee as the case may be is paid within two months of such admission or election.

Annual subscriptions.

42. Each member shall pay to the Institute the annual subscription applicable to him in accordance with the following scale:

(b) Where, after the first day of January in any year, a member is elected to fellowship or commences to practise or changes his residence or principal place of business so as to increase the amount of the subscription applicable to him he shall pay for that year any additional subscription necessary to increase his subscription to the amount then applicable to him under the foregoing scale; except that where the election to fellowship, commencing to practise, or change of residence or principal place of business takes place after the last day of June, one-half only of the said additional subscription shall be payable.
(c) Where a person is admitted to membership after the last day of June in any year he shall pay one-half only of the subscription otherwise applicable to him for that year.
(d) Where, after the first day of January in any year, any member ceases to practise or changes his residence or principal place of business so as to reduce the amount of the subscription applicable to him no reduction of the subscription

applicable to him no reduction of the subscription

shall be made for that year. (e) Where a fellow gives notice to the Council of his desire to cease to be a fellow and become of his desire to cease to be a fellow and become an associate and such notice is received by the Council not later than the 31st January in any year he shall pay for that year the subscription applicable to an associate; but if the said notice is received after the 31st January in any year the member shall pay for that year the subscrip-tion applicable to a fellow.

Reduction of annual subscription in certain cases.

43. Notwithstanding anything contained in the last preceding bye-law the Council may at its discretion on the application of any member reduce to £1 1s. the subscription payable for any year by such member provided that

(a) the said member is not less than 60 years (b) the said member is not less than to years
of age and has been a member for not less than
30 years; and
(b) the said member has retired from practice
and other business activities.

In special cases the Council may at its discretion so reduce the annual subscription notwithstanding that the member has not complied with these provisions.

Annual subscriptions, when payable.

44. All annual subscriptions, when payable. 44. All annual subscriptions payable under these bye-laws shall be due and payable on the first day of January in each year or, in the case of members admitted after that date, on the date of admission; and all additional subscriptions provided for in bye-law 42 shall be due and payable on the date of election to fellowship or of commencing to prac-tise or of change in residence or principal place of business as the case may be: Save that no sub-scriptions under these bye-laws shall become due and payable before the first day of January next succeeding the date when these bye-laws come into operation. operation.

Whole-time national service, power to remit or refund annual subscriptions.

refund annual subscriptions. 45. Notwithstanding anything contained in these bye-laws relating to the payment of annual sub-scriptions the Council may in its absolute discretion remit or refund the annual subscription of any member for any year in which the member, during war or any period of national emergency, shall serve for four months or more in His Majesty's Forces or who shall be engaged for four months or more in other whole-time national service. For the purposes of this bye-law the Council shall decide what constitutes a state of war or national emer-gency or whole-time national service and the decision of the Council shall be conclusive.

Certificate of practice.

46. Every member in practice shall make applica-tion to the Council for a certificate of practice.

Restrictions as to the use by firms of description and distinctive letters.

47. A member of the Institute practising under the title of a firm in partnership with any person not a member of the Institute or of any institute or society of chartered accountants in the British Commonwealth of Nations approved by the Council shall not use after the title of that firm the initials F.C.A. or A.C.A. or describe the firm in any way whatever as chartered accountants.

CHAPTER V.-ARTICLED CLERKS.

No person under sixteen to be articled. 48. No person who is under sixteen years of age shall be articled to a member of the Institute.

Evidence required of having passed or obtained exemption from the Preliminary examination.

49. Before a member of the Institute shall receive a person to serve with him under articles he shall require of such person a certificate issued in accord-ance with these bye-laws or other documentary evidence signed by the Secretary to the effect that such person has passed the Preliminary examination of the Institute or has been exempted therefrom.

Articles to be registered.

50. The articles of every articled clerk shall within 50. The articles of every articled clerk shall within one month after execution thereof (or within such longer period as the Council in its discretion may allow in any particular case) be lodged with the Institute to be registered, together with an unstamped copy of the articles for retention by the Institute and with such evidence as to age as may be required. The Institute may, in any case in which it seems to the Council in its absolute discretion desirable so to do, refuse to register articles lodged for registration.

Council may prescribe provisions to be included in articles.

51. The Council may from time to time prescribe provisions which shall be included in articles and all articles executed after the date of such prescription arucies executed after the date of such prescription shall include the said provisions and no articles not containing the said provisions shall be registered by the Institute: Provided that the Council may in its discretion and on the application of the parties or proposed parties to the articles waive the in-clusion of some or all of the said provisions and register the articles notwithstanding that some or all the said provisions are not included therein.

Transfer of articles.

52. Articles may, by agreement between the parties thereto, be transferred to another member competent to take an articled clerk. The transfer shall be lodged with the Institute for registration within one month of its execution or within such longer period as the Council in its discretion may allow in any particular case.

Ineligibility for examinations unless articles are registered.

53. An articled clerk shall not be admitted to the Intermediate or Final examination unless there has been due compliance with the provisions of these bye-laws respecting registration.

Principal must be in practice.

54. A member shall be competent to take or retain an articled clerk only if he is in practice and such practice is his main occupation (upon which the decision of the Council shall be conclusive). No member who is or becomes a clerk to a public accountant (whether a member or not) and no person while he is suspended from membership may take or retain an articled clerk.

Fresh articles or transfer to another principal on death, &c., of member.

55. If the principal shall cease to practise or resign from membership the articles may be trans-ferred to any other member competent to take an articled clerk. In the like events or if the prin-cipal shall die or be excluded or suspended from membership the articled clerk may enter into fresh articles for the remainder of his term of service: Provided that where fresh articles are entered into the Council may in its discretion allow service with two or more members to be deemed to be continuous service on such terms and conditions as it may think fit.

Number of articled clerks permitted each member.

56. No member shall have in his service at the that an articled clerk shall not for the purposes of this bye-law be deemed to be in the service of a

(a) articles have been entered into with, the member (a) articles have been entered into with, the member under the provisions of the last preceding byelaw or

(b) an articled clerk, three years of whose term of service shall have expired, shall have graduated at a university in the United Kingdom after taking one of the degree courses approved by the Council for the purposes of bye-law 62.

Articled clerks may not practise or have other business.

57. No articled clerk shall during his term of service practise as a public accountant or engage in any other business or occupation except in so far as he may be permitted so to do by his principal and by the express permission granted by the Council, whose discretion shall be absolute. Per-mission of the Council to practise as a public accoun-tant may be given only where the main occupation of the articled clerk applying for such permission was that of public accountant immediately prior to the commencement of his term of service.

Service under articles.

58. An articled clerk shall throughout his term of service serve in his principal's office (or wherever in England or Wales he may be directed by his principal) on his principal's business of public accountant: Provided that an articled clerk may with

accountant: Provided that an articled clerk may with the consent of his principal—

(a) Have leave of absence from his principal's office or business for periods not exceeding twelve months in all for the purpose of studying for the examinations of the Institute;
(b) Serve for periods not exceeding six months in all on his principal's business of public accountant elsewhere than in England or Wales save that nothing herein contained shall entitle an articled clerk to commence his service elsewhere than in

clerk to commence his service elsewhere than in England or Wales; (c) Spend periods not amounting to more than six months in all in such industrial, commercial or other suitable organisation as the Council may approve and subject to such conditions and control or the Council may as the Council may impose or exercise:

Provided further that the total period allowed under (a), (b) and (c) hereof shall not exceed one-third of the term of service.

Articles to be subject to Royal Charters and bye-laws.

59. All articles executed after the date when these bye-laws come into force shall be subject to the Royal Charters and bye-laws which may from time to time be in force and the articles shall contain express provision to that effect.

Registration of articles cancelled if articled clerk declared not fit to become a member.

60. In any case in which in manner provided in these bye-laws an articled clerk shall have been declared not fit to become a member of the Institute, the articles under which he has been serving shall for the purposes of the Royal Charters and these bye-laws be deemed to be at an end and the registra-tion thereof shall be cancelled. Thereafter no member shall retain or take him as an articled clerk without the express permission of the Council which shall be given only for special reasons and upon such terms as the Council shall in its discretion think fit. think fit.

Reduction in period of service in special cases.

61. The Council may, by resolution at a meeting specially convened with notice of the object (at which meeting there shall be present not less than twenty-four members of the Council and for which resolution not less than three-fourths of those present and voting shall vote), in the case of a person who has passed or has been exempted from the Prelimi-nary examination under the provisions of these bye-laws and who has at the date of such meeting been for ten years continuously in employment as a clerk to a member in practice or has had experience which in the opinion of the Council (whose decision shall the period for which such employment, reduce the period for which such person must serve under articles to not less than three years or, where such person is a graduate of a university of the United Kingdom, to not less than two years.

Approved universities degree courses.

62. The Council may, by a resolution passed at a meeting specially convened with notice of the object (and for which resolution not less than two-thirds of those present and voting shall vote) approve for

the purposes of this bye-law the degree courses at universities and university colleges in England and Wales mentioned in such resolution and may from time to time as it shall consider desirable by resolution passed in like manner add to or vary the

tion passed in like manner add to or vary the degree courses so approved. An articled clerk may, with the consent of his principal, during his period of service attend a uni-versity or university college for the purpose of taking one of the degree courses so approved. If the articled clerk shall graduate after taking such degree course the Council in its discretion may permit the whole or such part as it considers desirable of the period during which the articled clerk so attended at such university or university college to be deemed to be service under articles: Provided that no such articled clerk may present himself for the Final examination until he has completed at least three years' service in the principal's office or business of public accounin the principal's office or business of public accountant and for this purpose periods not exceeding one that and all spent in manner set out in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of bye-law 58 shall be deemed to be service in the office or business of his principal save that the total period of leave of absence under the said paragraph (a) shall not exceed six months.

Whole-time national service, exemptions and concessions.

63. The Council may, by resolution passed at a meeting specially convened with notice of the object (at which meeting there shall be present not less than twenty-four members of the Council and for which resolution not less than three-fourths of those present and voting shall vote), provide that in the cases and circumstances and subject to the conditions set out in such resolution the Council may, in the case of any person who purposes to become a candi-date for admission and who during war or any other period of national emergency has served or is serving in His Majesty's Forces or has been or is engaged in any other whole-time national service, engaged in any other whole-time national service, make such of the following exemptions from and modifications of the provisions of the Royal Charters

modifications of the provisions of the Royal Charters and these bye-laws as may seem reasonable in the circumstances of his case (that is to say):

(a) That the candidate shall be exempt from the Preliminary examination upon payment of such fee, if any, as the Council may determine.
(b) That any period of service by the candidate in His Majesty's Forces or of engagement in any other whole-time national service after the date of his articles, or any specified portion of such period, shall be deemed equivalent to service under articles articles

articles.
(c) That, in the case of a candidate whose articles are dated before the expiration of one year after the termination of his service in His Majesty's Forces or other whole-time national service (or within such later period as the Council in its absolute discretion having regard to any special circumstances may think fit), the candidate's period of service under articles shall be reduced to such a period as the Council may decide: Provided that such reduced period of service shall not be less than three years.
(d) That the candidate shall be exempt from the Intermediate examination.
(e) That the candidate may sit for any examina-

the Intermediate examination. (e) That the candidate may sit for any examina-tion at any time specified by the Council although not otherwise qualified to sit at that time. (f) That the certificates of service required by bye-laws 84 and 89 or either of them be modified as the circumstances of the case require.

Any of the aforesaid exemptions or modifications Any of the aloresaid exemptions of modifications in favour of a candidate shall be made without prejudice to the power of the Council to make in his favour such other of the said exemptions or modifications as may be permitted by such resolution. For the purposes of this bye-law the Council may decide what constitutes a state of war or national exercise and in the

emergency or whole-time national service and in the case of each candidate whether he is a person to whom the said resolution shall apply and whether he has complied with the provisions of the said resolution and the decision of the Council shall be. conclusive.

CHAPTER VI.-EXAMINATIONS.

Appointment of Examination Committee.

64. The Council shall appoint for the ensuing year not less than seven of its number to be the Examina-tion Committee of whom three shall form a quorum.

Examination Committee may issue regulations.

65. The Examination Committee, with the approval of the Council, may from time to time issue regulations for holding the examinations and, under and subject to the provisions of these bye-laws, for the conduct of the examinations.

Conduct of examinations.

66. The Examination Committee shall conduct the examinations with the assistance (so far as it may think fit) of such qualified persons as the Council may from time to time appoint.

Appointment of examiners and moderators.

67. The Examination Committee shall (from its members or from the qualified persons appointed by the Council under the last preceding bye-law) appoint examiners and moderators who shall, with such other assistance as the Council may approve, examine the candidates by written papers and orally or by written papers alone and shall report upon such examina-tions to the Examination Committee. The Council may at any time remove any examiner or moderator may at any time remove any examiner or moderator by a resolution passed at a meeting at which there shall be present not less than twelve members of the Council and for which resolution not less than threefourths of the members present and voting shall vote.

Remuneration and expenses of examiners and moderators.

68. There shall be paid out of the funds of the Institute to each examiner and moderator such remuneration as the Council may from time to time determine together with a sum to reimburse the examiner or moderator for reasonable expenses incurred by him in attending examinations or meetings in connection therewith.

Member to invigilate.

69. A member of the Institute appointed by the Examination Committee shall invigilate in each examination room on each day on which an examina-tion is held and shall receive for so doing such remuneration as the Council shall determine.

Notice to be given and fee to be paid by candidates.

70. No candidate shall be admitted to any examination unless he shall have given written notice to the Institute in such form as may be prescribed of his desire to be examined and shall have paid the or ins desire to be examined and shall have paid the fee payable in respect of such examination, such notice and fee to be received by the Institute at least 35 days before the date which shall have been announced for the commencement of such examina-tion. Candidates for the Intermediate or Final examination shall send with the said written notice such evidence of service as may be required by these bye-laws.

Refund of candidate's fee.

71. If after payment of an examination fee a candidate withdraws his entry or fails to present himself for examination the examination fee may be returned at any time at the discretion of the Examination Committee.

Council to prescribe candidates' fees.

72. The Council shall from time to time prescribe the fee payable in respect of each occasion on which a candidate desires to present himself for examination.

Persons failing to pass may again present themselves.

73. Any person who has failed to pass an examination to the satisfaction of the Examination Committee may present himself again on any subsequent occasion save that the Examination Committee may in its discretion (but subject to an appeal to the Council) refuse to allow any such person to present himself.

Examination results and certificates.

74. The Examination Committee shall consider the 74. The Examination Committee shall consider the reports of the examiners and moderators on each examination and may accept them or reject them or may accept them subject to any modification or alteration which may seem desirable. The Examina-tion Committee may, if authorised by the Council so to do, send to each candidate, before the result of an examination has been reported to the Council, notice of whether or not he has passed the examina-tion to the satisfaction of the Examination Com-mittee. The Examination Committee shall report to

the Council the result of each examination and upon the adoption by the Council of the report of the Examination Committee a certificate to the effect that Examination Committee a certificate to the effect that he has passed such examination shall, unless with-held for any reasonable cause, be issued to every person who has passed such examination to the satisfaction of the Examination Committee. Such certificate shall be signed by a member of the Council and the Secretary and the Secretary.

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION.

Preliminary examination.

75. Every person who desires to become an articled clerk shall, unless he has been granted exemption therefrom under these bye-laws, pass a Preliminary examination to test his general education.

Time and place of Preliminary examination.

76. Preliminary examinations shall be held at such times as the Council may from time to time direct and at such place or places as the Examination Committee shall from time to time appoint.

Subjects of Preliminary examination.

77. The Preliminary examinations shall be con-ducted in such subjects as the Council shall from time to time determine.

Persons eligible for exemption from Preliminary examination.

78. The following persons shall be eligible for exemption from the Preliminary examination:
(a) Graduates of any university in the United Kingdom or of any other university approved by the Course?

the Council. (b) Persons who can produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Council of success in any examination which shall be recognised by the Council as providing a satisfactory test of general education.

The Council shall from time to time publish a list of the universities so approved and of the examinations so recognised.

Any person who at any time has passed an examination which under the then existing bye-laws of the Institute would have made him eligible for exemption from the Preliminary examination or which at the time of such passing was recognised by the Council under this bye-law, shall be eligible for exemption from the Preliminary examination pro-vided he can produce to the satisfaction of the Council evidence of such success Council evidence of such success.

Exemption from Preliminary examination in special cases.

79. The Council may, by resolution passed at a meeting specially convened with notice of the object (at which meeting there shall be present not less than twenty-four of the members of the Council and for which resolution not less than two-thirds of those For which resolution hot less than two-thirds of those present and voting shall vote), grant exemption from the Preliminary examination to a person not being under thirty years of age who at the date of his application for exemption shall have been for ten years continuously in employment as a clerk to a member or members in practice.

Exemption from Preliminary examination and fee. 80. Every person eligible for exemption from the Preliminary examination shall be exempted from such examination upon application by him in such manner and on payment of such fee as the Council shall from time to time prescribe.

INTERMEDIATE EXAMINATION.

Intermediate examination, when taken.

81. Every articled clerk, unless he is exempted from so doing under any of these bye-laws, shall, after the expiration of one-half of his term of service, but before his articles expire, present himself for an Intermediate examination to test the progress he has made in professional knowledge: Provided that the Council may, in any case in which it considers that there are exceptional circumstances, allow the articled clerk to present himself for the Intermediate that there are exceptional circumstances, allow the articled clerk to present himself for the Intermediate examination before the expiration of one-half of the said term of service. For the purpose of this bye-law the Council may deem service to have commenced on the first day of the calendar month in which it in fact commenced.

Time and place of Intermediate examination.

82. The Intermediate examination shall be held at such times as the Council may from time to time direct and at such place or places as the Examination Committee shall from time to time appoint.

Subjects of Intermediate examination.

83. The Intermediate examination shall be con-ducted in such subjects as the Council shall from time to time determine.

Certificate of service and fitness.

84. Every articled clerk intending to present him-self for the Intermediate examination shall produce to the Council a certificate from his principal to the effect that he is a fit and proper person to be admitted to the examination and specifying, in such form as the Council may require, the period of service which he has duly served (allowance being made in the case of illness for leave of absence not exceeding six months); or failing such certificate shall produce such other evidence as the Council may require.

Exemption from Intermediate examination.

85. The Council may in its discretion grant exemption from the Intermediate examination as follows:

(a) To any articled clerk, or any person whose articles have expired, who has graduated in any university in the United Kingdom after having taken one of the degree courses approved by the Council under bye-law 62.

(b) To any articled clerk who at the date of his entry into service had been for ten years con-tinuously in employment as a clerk to a member in practice or had had experience which in the opinion of the Council (whose decision shall be frach is equivalent to such employment final) is equivalent to such employment.

FINAL EXAMINATION.

Final examination, when taken.

86. Save as otherwise provided by the Royal Charters and these bye-laws, a person shall not present himself for the Final examination earlier than a date within the last three months of his service and, unless he has been exempted from the Intermediate examination, until a period of two years has elapsed since he passed the Intermediate examination or, in the case of a person whose term of service is three years, until one year has elapsed since he passed the Intermediate examination. Provided that—

(a) The Council may in special circumstances in its absolute discretion allow a person to present himself for the Final examination at any time after the completion of his term of service;

(b) The Council may in its discretion allow a person to present himself for the Final examina-tion notwithstanding any informality in respect of his articles;

(c) If at any time the date of the Final examina-(c) If at any time the date of the Final examina-tion be changed from that previously announced with the result that a person who but for such change would have been entitled to present him-self, but who by reason of such change is not so entitled, the Council may in its discretion allow such person to present himself for that examination.

Time and place of Final examination.

87. The Final examination shall be held at such times as the Council shall from time to time direct and at such place or places as the Examination Com-mittee shall from time to time appoint.

Subjects of Final examination.

88. The Final examination shall be conducted in such subjects as the Council shall from time to time determine.

Certificate of service and fitness.

89. Every person intending to present himself for 89. Every person intending to present himself for the Final examination shall produce to the Council a certificate from his principal to the effect that he is a fit and proper person to be admitted to the examination and specifying, in such manner as the Council may require, the period of service he has duly served (allowance being made in the case of illness for leave of absence not exceeding six months); or failing such certificate shall produce such other evidence as the Council may require.

CHAPTER VII.—MEETINGS OF THE INSTITUTE.

Annual meeting.

90. The annual meeting of the Institute for trans-action of the ordinary annual business of the Institute (namely the election of members of the Council, the appointment of auditors and the reception and conappointment of auditors and the reception and con-sideration of the annual report of the Council and accounts of the Institute with the auditors' report thereon) shall be held in London or elsewhere in England or Wales on the first Wednesday in May in every year or on such other day as the Council may from time to time appoint: Provided that a meeting shall be held in every calendar year and that not more than fifteen months shall have elapsed since the date of the previous annual meeting.

Special meeting.

91. The Council may whenever it thinks fit con-vene a special meeting of the Institute and shall do so within twenty-one days from the receipt by the Secretary of a requisition in writing signed by not less than one hundred members and stating the object of the proposed meeting.

Notice of motion to be given.

92. A member wishing to bring before the annual

32. A memory wishing to omig before the annual meeting any motion not relating to the ordinary annual business of the Institute may do so provided:
(a) that notice in writing of the proposed motion be sent or given to the Secretary and be received by him not later than five weeks before the date of the annual meeting; and
(b) that not less than ten members entitled to write the provided to the secretary below the se

vote at the annual meeting shall have sent or given notice in writing to the Secretary to be received by him not later than four weeks before the date of the annual meeting expressing their desire that the proposed motion should be brought before the annual meeting; and

(c) that the proposed motion relates to matters feeting the Institute or the accountancy affecting profession.

If after such notices or any of them shall have been given the annual meeting be called for a date (other than the first Wednesday in May) less than five weeks or four weeks respectively after the date of the receipt by the Secretary of such notices the said notices shall be deemed to have been given more than five or four weeks respectively before the date of such meeting.

Notice of meetings to be given.

93. The Secretary shall, not less than fourteen days or more than twenty-one days before any annual or special meeting of the Institute, send to each member a notice giving the day, hour and place of the meeting and the business to be transacted thereat. In the case of the annual meeting the Secretary shall send to each member with such notice a copy of the annual report of the Council and a copy of the accounts of the Institute with the auditors' report thereon, a list of persons nominated or deemed to be persons the function of the Council and a copy of the auditors and particulars of all motions to be brought before the meeting under the last preceding bye-law. The non-receipt by any member of such notice or of any of the aforesaid documents shall not invalidate the proceedings of any meeting.

Chairman of meeting.

94. At all meetings of the Institute the President of the Institute or in his absence the Vice-President of the Institute shall be chairman. In the absence of both the chairman shall be elected from among the members of the Council present or in the absence of all of them then from among the members present.

Quorum at meeting.

95. Unless twenty members be present at the annual meeting within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for the meeting, the meeting shall stand adjourned for a fortnight to be held at the same hour and place or, if such place shall not then be available, at such other place as the Council may determine. On the date to which the meeting was adjourned the meeting shall proceed to business not-withstanding that there may be less than twenty members present. At a special meeting, unless thirty members be present within fifteen minutes of the time appointed for the meeting the meeting shall be dissolved. dissolved.

Adjournment of meeting.

96. Subject to the provisions of these bye-laws the chairman of any meeting of the Institute may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn the meeting from time to time and from place to place but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place. No notice need be given of an adjourned meeting unless it be so directed in the resolution for adjournment.

Voting at meeting and demand for poll.

97. Every resolution and amendment proposed and 97. Every resolution and amendment proposed and seconded at a meeting of the Institute shall be put to the meeting by the chairman and decided by a show of hands: Provided that in the event of an equality of voting the chairman shall have a casting vote. The declaration of the chairman as to the declaration being made a poll of all members may be demanded in writing by at least twenty-five mem-bers present and entitled to vote at the meeting; but a poll shall not be taken on any resolution or amendment relating to the election of a chairman, the appointment of scrutineers or the adjournment of a meeting. of a meeting.

Procedure when poll demanded.

98. On a poll being so demanded the chairman shall forthwith, or as soon as is reasonably practic-able after the conclusion of the meeting at which the poll is demanded, state the resolution or amend-ment in the form of propositions which in his opinion will be most suitable to ascertain the sense of the members upon the substance of such resolu-tion or amendment and upon the manner of so stating the resolution or amendment the chairman's decision shall be final. Voting papers setting out the propositions so stated, together with any necessary notes and directions, shall within fourteen days after the meeting be issued by the Council to all members the meeting be issued by the Council to all memoers entitled to vote at the meeting at which the poll was demanded. All members wishing to vote on the propositions or any of them must do so by voting in the manner indicated in the said directions and sending the said voting papers to the Institute addressed to the scrutineers so as to be received by them not later than twenty-one days after the meeting meeting.

Appointment of scrutineers.

99. At every meeting of the Institute at which a poll is demanded the meeting shall appoint five of their number as scrutineers, any three of whom shall be competent to act.

Meeting of scrutineers and result of poll.

100. Where a poll has been demanded, the scrutineers shall meet not less than twenty-two days scrutineers shall meet not less than twenty-two days or more than twenty-nine days after the meeting at which the poll was demanded and shall examine the voting papers. Envelopes containing the voting papers may be opened either before or at such meeting of the scrutineers but may only be opened in the presence of at least one of the scrutineers. The scrutineers shall reject the vote of any member who, at the date of such meeting, was in arrear with any subscription or other sum payable by him under these bye-laws and may in their discretion reject any vote in which a member has failed to observe the notes and directions relating thereto or any other vote which in their view ought properly to be rejected. The scrutineers shall as soon as practicable report the result of the voting to the chairman of the meeting and shall include in such report a statement of the number of votes rejected chairman of the meeting and shall include in such report a statement of the number of votes rejected by them and the reasons for such rejection. The chairman shall send a copy of such report to each member as soon as practicable and, where there is an equality of voting, the chairman shall have a casting vote and in such a case shall declare when casting vote and in such a case shall declare when so sending the report to members the manner in which his casting vote is given and the result of the voting. The report of the scrutineers as to the result of the voting (or where given such declara-tion of the chairman) shall be conclusive. The voting shall take effect from the date of the report of the scrutineers scrut that where a of the scrutineers save that where a meeting was adjourned to receive the report of the scrutineers the voting shall take effect from the date when such report was presented to such adjourned meeting. Where for any reason a chairman is unable to exer-cise any powers granted to him under this bye-law

the power shall be exercised by any member of the Council who was present at the meeting and who is deputed by the Council to exercise such powers.

Demand for poll not to prevent other business.

101. The demand for a poll at a meeting shall not prevent the transaction of any business other than that on which the poll has been demanded.

Minutes of meeting.

102. Proper minutes shall be recorded of all resolutions and proceedings of meetings of the Institute and every minute signed by the chairman of the meeting to which it relates or by the chairman of a subsequent meeting shall be sufficient evidence of the facts therein stated.

CHAPTER VIII.-EXCLUSION OR SUSPENSION. Appointment of Investigation and Disciplinary Committees.

Committees. 103. There shall be appointed in each year by the Council from among its members an Investigation Committee consisting of not more than nine members (of whom three shall be a quorum) and a Disciplinary Committee consisting of not more than nine mem-bers of whom five appointed by such Committee shall hear and consider any matter brought before it in accordance with these bye-laws and shall exer-cise the functions and powers granted to such com-mittee by these bye-laws. No member of the Council shall at the same time serve on both the Investiga-tion and the Disciplinary Committees.

Matters to be laid before Investigation Committee.

104. It shall be the duty of the Secretary and the right of any member or of any aggrieved person to lay before the Investigation Committee any facts indicating:

(a) that a member has become liable to exclu-

sion, suspension, reprimand or admonishment under any provision of the Royal Charters, or (b) that an articled clerk has been guilty of felony or misdemeanour or has been declared by a competent court to have been guilty of fraud or has been guilty of an act or default of such a nature as to render him unfit to become a member of the Institute.

Where any complaint has been received by the Institute, the Council or the Secretary, that any member has become liable as aforesaid or that any articled clerk has been guilty as aforesaid the com-plaint shall forthwith be laid before the Investigation Committee.

Duties of Investigation Committee.

105. It shall be the duty of the Investigation Committee to consider the facts or complaint laid before it under the provisions of the last preceding bye-law and where it is of opinion that the facts or the complaint require further investigation it shall prefer a formal complaint to the Disciplinary Committee. The Investigation Committee may at the request of

any member or articled clerk advise such member or articled clerk in regard to any matter of professional conduct.

Duties of Disciplinary Committee.

106. The Disciplinary Committee, on receipt of a formal complaint in pursuance of the last preceding bye-law, shall forthwith give to the member or articled clerk notice of its intention to consider the complaint. The Disciplinary Committee shall give such member or articled clerk an opportunity of being heard before it and shall, if the member or articled clerk so desire, permit such member or articled clerk to be represented before it by counsel or by a solicitor or by a member of the Institute. The Investigation Committee may request a member of the Institute (who may be a member of the In-vestigation Committee) to support the formal com-plaint before the Disciplinary Committee or may instruct a solicitor to support or to brief counsel to support such complaint. formal complaint in pursuance of the last preceding support such complaint.

Powers of Disciplinary Committee.

107. If the Disciplinary Committee is of opinion that a formal complaint has been proved it shall make a finding to that effect and thereupon it shall have full power to order that the member con-cerned be excluded from membership or suspended for a period not exceeding two years from membership or to declare that the articled clerk is not fit to become a member of the Institute: Provided always that if in the opinion of the Disciplinary Committee the complaint shall have been proved but the member or articled clerk shall not have been guilty of conduct sufficiently serious to be visited in the case of a member by exclusion or suspension or in the case of an articled clerk by such a declaration, it shall have full power to reprimand or admonish the said member or articled clerk. Notice of the finding and decision of the Disciplinary Committee shall forthwith be given to the member or articled clerk concerned and the decision shall thereupon take effect.

Right of appeal and Appeal Committee.

108. A member who has been ordered by the Dis-108. A member who has been ordered by the Dis-ciplinary Committee to be excluded or suspended from membership or an articled clerk who has been declared by the Disciplinary Committee to be not fit to become a member of the Institute or a member or articled clerk who has been ordered to be reprimanded or admonished, may within twenty-one days of the date of the notice to him of the de-cision of the Disciplinary Committee appeal to the Council. The notice of such appeal shall state the grounds of such appeal and the grounds so stated shall not be amended after the date of the delivery of such notice save by the leave of the Appeal

shall not be amended after the date of the denvery of such notice save by the leave of the Appeal Committee set up under this bye-law. The Council shall as soon as practicable after the receipt of such notice of appeal set up an Appeal Committee to determine the appeal. The Appeal Committee shall consist of the President, Vice-President and three other members of the Council: Provided that no member of the Investigation Comm Provided that no member of the Investigation Comrovided that no member of the Investigation Com-mittee or Disciplinary Committee who investigated the matters or heard or considered the complaint in respect of which the appeal is brought shall be eligible for appointment to such Appeal Committee. If at the time of the appointment of such Appeal Committee the Council considers it impracticable to appoint the President or Vice-President the Council may appoint another member or other members in may appoint another member or other members in his or their place. If any member of the Appeal Committee so appointed is unable to act because of ill-health, absence from the country or other reason or if he shall before the date fixed for the determinaof it he shall before the date fixed for the determina-tion of the appeal have ceased to be a member of the Council, the remaining members of the Appeal Committee shall have full power to co-opt any mem-ber of the Council eligible for appointment.

Powers and duties of Appeal Committee.

109. The Appeal Committee may determine the appeal after consideration of the record of the evidence given before and documents produced to the Disciplinary Committee, but shall have full dis-cretionary power to rehear any witness called before the Disciplinary Committee or on special grounds to receive fresh evidence. The Appeal Committee shall give the member or articled clerk concerned an opportunity of being heard before it and shall, if the member or articled clerk shall so desire, permit him to be represented before it by counsel or a solicitor or a member of the Institute. The Investivation Committee may re-

the Institute. The Investigation Committee may request a member of the Institute (who may be a member of the Institute (who may be a member of the Investigation Committee) to support the decision of the Disciplinary Committee or may instruct solicitors to support or to brief counsel to support such decision.

Support such decision. The Appeal Committee shall have full power to affirm vary or reverse the finding and decision of the Disciplinary Committee. Notice of the finding and decision of the Appeal Committee shall forthwith be given to the member or articled clerk concerned and the decision shall thereupon take effect.

Record of findings and decisions.

110. All findings and decisions of the Disciplinary Committee and the Appeal Committee shall be re-ported to the Council and the Council shall cause the same to be duly recorded.

Publication of findings and decisions.

111. Where the Disciplinary Committee finds that a formal complaint has been proved the Council shall cause to be published in such newspapers and jour-nals as it shall think desirable the finding and deci-sion of the Disciplinary Committee: Provided that such publication shall not be made before twenty-two

days after the date of the notice to the member or articled clerk concerned of the decision of the Disciplinary Committee and where the member or articled clerk concerned has within twenty-one days appealed clerk concerned has within twenty-one days appealed to the Council such publication shall not be made, but if in such a case the Appeal Committee affirms the finding of the Disciplinary Committee that the complaint has been proved, the Council shall cause to be published in such newspapers and journals as it shall think desirable the finding and decision of the Appeal Committee as soon as practicable after such finding and decision are pronounced. The publication shall in all such cases include the name of the member or articled clerk concerned unless in a particular case the Disciplinary Committee or the

name of the member or articled clerk concerned unless in a particular case the Disciplinary Committee or the Appeal Committee, as the case may be, considers that there exist special circumstances which justify the omission of the name from such publication. Where the Disciplinary Committee finds that a formal complaint has not been proved or where on appeal the Appeal Committee so finds, the Council may make such publication (if any) as in the circum-stances of the case it considers desirable.

Return of certificates in event of exclusion or suspension.

112. In the event of the suspension or exclusion of a member every certificate of membership, fellowship or practice then held by him shall be delivered up by him to the Secretary, in the case of suspension to be retained during the period of suspension or, in the case of exclusion, to be cancelled.

Power to make regulations.

113. The Investigation Committee, the Disciplinary Committee and the Appeal Committee shall each have power to make such rules and regulations (not inconsistent with the Royal Charters and these bye-laws) as may be considered by them necessary for the performance of their respective functions.

CHAPTER IX.-AUDIT.

Appointment of auditors.

114. The members at each annual meeting shall appoint two auditors who shall be members in practice, at such remuneration if any as the meeting shall determine. No member of the Council shall shan determine. No member of the Council shall be eligible for appointment as auditor. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the office of auditor between two annual meetings or in the event of a vacancy not being filled at an annual meeting, the said vacancy may be filled by the Council at a meet-ing summoned with notice of the object: Provided that during such vacancy the continuing auditor may act alone.

Retirement of auditors.

115. The auditors shall retire at the next annual meeting after their appointment, but shall be eligible for re-appointment.

Nomination of auditors.

116. Each auditor shall be nominated by two members of the Institute and such nomination shall be signed by the members nomination and by the candi-date and shall be sent to the Secretary to be re-ceived by him at least five weeks before the annual meeting. If after such nomination shall have been made as aforesaid the annual meeting be called for a date (other than the first Wednesday in May) less a date (other than the first Wednesday in May) less than five weeks after the date of the receipt by the Secretary of such nomination the said nomination shall be deemed to have been received more than five weeks before the date of such meeting. The auditors who are in office shall be deemed to be nominated for re-appointment unless they have intimated in writing their desire not to be so nominated. Notice shall be given to members and specifically to the retiring auditors of the names of all other persons nominated for appointment. nominated for appointment.

Removal of auditors.

117. The Institute may, by a resolution passed at a meeting specially convened with notice of the object (and for which resolution not less than three-fourths of those present and voting shall vote), remove any auditor from his office before the expiration of his period of office and may, by a resolution passed by a majority of the votes of members present and voting at that meeting, appoint in his stead another member in practice: Provided that if a poll be demanded as to the resolution for removal, a majority of not less than three-fourths of those present and voting shall be necessary on the taking of the poll for carrying that resolution. If no auditor is appointed at such special meeting the Council may at a meeting sum-moned with notice of the object appoint an auditor in the place of the auditor so removed.

CHAPTER X.—INDEMNITY.

Indemnification of members of Council and others.

118. The members of the Council, officers and auditors shall be indemnified by the Institute from all losses and expenses incurred by them in or about the discharge of their respective duties, except such as happen from their own respective wilful default, or in the case of an auditor his own rediscut or in the case of an auditor his own negligence or wilful default or that of any partner or employee of such auditor.

Members of Council and others not to be liable for losses.

119. No member of the Council, officer or auditor 119. No member of the Council, officer or auditor shall be liable for any other member of the Council, officer or auditor, or for joining in any receipt or document, or for any act of conformity, or for any loss or expense happening to the Institute, unless the same happen from his own wilful default, or in the case of an auditor from his own negligence or wilful default or that of any partner or employee of such auditor auditor.
