In pursuance of Section 129 of the Factories Act, 1937, and the Second Schedule thereto, the Minister of Labour and National Service hereby gives notice that he proposes to make Special Regulations under Section 60 of the Factories Act, 1937, applying to factories in which is carried on the process of "blasting" (i.e., the cleaning, smoothing, roughening or removing of part of the surface of any article by the use as an abrasive of a jet of sand, metal shot, or grit or other material, propelled by a blast of compressed air or steam or by a wheel).

The draft Special Regulations, which take the place of an earlier draft published in 1945, are entitled the Blasting (Castings and Other Articles) Special Regulations, 1949. INDUSTRIAL AND STAFF CANTEEN UNDERTAKINGS
WAGES BOARD.
