WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 20th day of April, 1949 (C.W. 6033/49) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 27th day of April, 1948, revised rates of pay, Marriage and other allowances were laid down:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the rates of Marriage Allowance require revision:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council to sanction the revised rates of Marriage Allowance as set out in the Schedule annexed hereto, with effect from the 24th November, 1948.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

" SCHEDULE.

" 1. Married officers of any rank, aged 25 or over, and officers under 25 who were receiving marriage allowance on 30th June, 1946 (or who would have been receiving it had not their families been occupying official quarters), except National Service entrants who entered, or who enter, for compulsory service on or after 1st January, 1947, to be eligible for marriage allowance at the following standard rates instead of the rates stated in paragraph 2, Schedule III of Order in Council dated the 27th day of April, 1948:—

" 2. An abatement of 3s. 0d. a day to be made from the above rates at Admiralty discretion.

" 3. Married officers under the age of 25 who were not in receipt of officer's marriage allowance on 30th June, 1946, except National Service entrants

who entered, or who enter, for compulsory service on or after 1st January, 1947, to be eligible to receive a marriage allowance of 56s. 0d. a week until they reach the age of 25.

" 4. National Service entrants who entered, or who enter, for compulsory service on or after 1st January, 1947, and who are commissioned, to be eligible to receive the rates of marriage allowance as laid down in paragraphs 2 and 4, Schedule III of Order in Council dated the 27th day of April, 1948.

" 5. All the allowances specified in this Schedule to be paid in such circumstances and under such conditions as may be agreed between the Admiralty and the Treasury."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of April, 1949 (P.M.3103/49), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And Whereas, by Order in Council dated the 11th February, 1913, as amended by Order in Council dated the 21st December, 1920, provision was made for the promotion of Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men to Commissioned rank in the Royal Marines:

"And Whereas, by Order in Council dated the 26th June, 1923, provision was made for the number of such commissions granted annually to be reduced at our discretion:

"And Whereas, by Order in Council dated 14th October, 1947, provision was made for Commissions from the ranks in Your Majesty's Marine Force to be granted at our absolute discretion, without any restriction upon the number of such Commissions:

"And Whereas, in consequence of the additional commitments undertaken by the Corps, it has been necessary to provide for additional Royal Marine

Officers by promotion of specially selected non-commissioned officers to Lieutenant, Royal Marines:

"And Whereas we are of opinion that such officers should be treated, in regard to their conditions and emoluments on retirement, similarly to specially selected Warrant Officers promoted to Lieutenant, Royal Navy, as provided in Order in Council dated the 25th May, 1939.

"We beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, to sanction the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule, with effect from the 3rd September, 1939.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"1. Officers placed on half pay to be paid on the scale laid down for direct entry Officers.

"2. Officers to come under the same rules for retirement as laid down for direct entry officers, but to be eligible for rates of retired pay laid down in Clause 4 below.

"3. Pensions and gratuities for widows and allowances to children and other dependent relatives to be paid at the rates and under the conditions laid down for other Commissioned Officers, except that the period of qualifying service to be that laid down for Officers who are promoted after service in the ranks of the Royal Marines.

"4. Retired Pay and retiring gratuities to be at the following rates and under the following conditions:—

"I. Retired Pay on retirement:—

(a) at the age of 45;

(b) if invalidated, or otherwise compulsorily retired, after attaining the age of 40;

(c) at own request, after completion of 20 years' reckonable service:—

£250 a year with additions or deductions of £12 a year for each full year in excess or short of 15 years' service. Reckonable service for this purpose to be the whole of service in Commissioned Rank, and one half of service in the ranks of the Royal Marines from age 18.

"II. Retired Pay on retirement when under the age of 40 if invalidated or otherwise compulsorily retired:—

<p>Minimum on promotion to Lieutenant</p> <p>The minimum of the Warrant Officers' scale plus an addition of £9 a year.</p>	<p><i>Addition for each complete year's service in the ranks of Lieutenant and Captain</i></p> <p>£9 a year</p>
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The minimum rate of retired pay on promotion to Captain will be:—

(i) on the invaliding scale, £190 a year. Additions for each complete year of subsequent service as above.

(ii) If compulsorily retired under Orders in Council of 21st April, 1922, or 15th August, 1941, £172 a year. Additions for each complete year of subsequent service as above.

"III. Gratuities to Officers permitted to retire at own request with less than 20 years' reckonable service, provided that a minimum of five years' service has been rendered since promotion to the rank of Lieutenant. After 10 years' reckonable service—£1,000, plus £100 for each additional complete year of reckonable service subject to a maximum gratuity of £1,900. For this purpose service to reckon as under I above.

"IV. Officers promoted to the rank of Major or above to receive retired pay on the age and service scale, counting service in Commissioned Rank only.

"V. The term 'service' in this Schedule shall mean service reckoning for retired pay or pension as laid down in the Naval Regulations from time to time."

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of April, 1949 (C.W.2416/49), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Order in Council dated the 22nd day of January, 1920, and subsequent Orders in Council, authorised *inter alia*, various alterations in the rules governing the conditions of Service and promotion of officers of the Medical, Dental and Instructor Branches of the Royal Navy:

"And whereas Order in Council dated the 27th day of April, 1948, sanctioned, *inter alia*, revised rates of pay for officers of the Medical, Dental and Instructor Branches of the Royal Navy with effect from the 1st day of July, 1946:

"And whereas we consider that the conditions of service and promotion of officers of the Medical, Dental and Instructor Branches of the Royal Navy require revision:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by your Order in Council to sanction the proposals in the Schedules annexed hereto, with effect from the 1st day of July, 1946, and in substitution of the provisions previously authorised:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals:

"SCHEDULE.

"Part I.

"Medical and Dental Officers.

"1. Royal Naval Medical and Dental Officers to be entered on a Short Service engagement in the rank of Acting Surgeon Lieutenant or Acting Surgeon Lieutenant (D) and to be confirmed in rank after one year's satisfactory service.

Such officers who leave the service at the end of the Short Service engagement or whose employment is terminated earlier as a result of invaliding for causes not due to their own default, or in other circumstances approved by the Admiralty, to be eligible for gratuities at such rates and under such conditions as may be laid down by Order in Council.

"2. *Counting of Civil Hospital time.*—The seniority of officers to be that of their confirmation as Surgeon Lieutenant or Surgeon Lieutenant (D) but officers who held an appointment as resident medical or surgical officers in recognised civil hospitals or in suitable dental appointments, prior to entry into the service to be granted, at Admiralty discretion, an antedate of seniority in respect of time served in the civil hospital appointment, subject to a maximum of 12 months. This antedate of seniority to take effect on completion of 12 months' service and to count during an officer's short service commission for the purpose of determining

(a) his seniority and

(b) his eligibility for increases of pay and for no other purpose.

If a Short Service Officer is transferred to the Permanent List this antedate of seniority to count also for the purpose of promotion.

"3. *Emergency List.*—Officers leaving the service on completion of their Short Service engagement to be placed on an Emergency List and to be liable for service in war or emergency during the subsequent four years.

"4. *Transfers to the Permanent List.*—Officers who so desire to be transferred to the Permanent List at Admiralty discretion.

"5. *Promotion.*—

*Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander*

*and*

*Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander (D).*

A Surgeon Lieutenant or Surgeon Lieutenant (D) to be promoted to the rank of Surgeon Lieutenant-

Commander or Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander (D), at the discretion of the Admiralty provided he

(a) has attained seven years' seniority as a confirmed Surgeon Lieutenant or Surgeon Lieutenant (D),

(b) has completed 2 years' sea service (Surgeon Lieutenants only)

(c) is recommended for advancement.

*Surgeon Commander, Surgeon Commander (D) and above.*

Promotion to the rank of Surgeon Commander or Surgeon Commander (D), and above to be by selection.

"6. *Compulsory retirement for Age.*—  
Surgeon Vice Admiral (Medical Director-General) On ceasing to hold the appointment or on attaining the age of 65 if not superseded before.

*" Instructor Officers.*

"1. Officers to be entered in two grades but to be on a common seniority list. The grades to be distinguished as:—

(a) Instructor Officers (Dagger) to be selected from candidates possessing First or Second Class Honours Degrees, and

(b) Instructor Officers.

"2. Instructor Officers (Dagger) to be entered in the rank of Acting Instructor Lieutenant and to be confirmed in rank on completion of six months' preliminary training. On confirmation their seniority to be antedated to a date 2 years from date of entry. This antedate of seniority to count during the Officer's Short Service for the purpose of determining

(a) his seniority, and

(b) his eligibility for increases of pay and for no other purpose.

If a Short Service Officer is transferred to the Permanent List this antedate of seniority to count also for the purposes of promotion.

"3. Instructor Officers (without dagger) to be entered in the rank of Instructor Sub-Lieutenant and to be promoted to the rank of Instructor Lieutenant after one year's service.

"4. All Instructor Officers to be entered, initially, on a Short Service engagement for a period of 3, 4 or 5 years. Officers who leave the service at the end of the Short Service engagement or whose employment is terminated earlier as a result of invaliding for causes not due to their own default, or in other circumstances approved by the Admiralty, to be eligible for gratuities at such rates and under such conditions as may be laid down by Order in Council.

"5. *Emergency List.*—Officers leaving the service on completion of their Short Service engagement to be placed on an Emergency List and be liable for service in war or emergency during the subsequent four years.

"6. *Transfers to the Permanent List.*—Officers who so desire to be transferred to the Permanent List at Admiralty discretion.

*"7. Promotion.*—

*Instructor Lieutenant-Commander.*

An Instructor Lieutenant to be promoted to the rank of Instructor Lieutenant-Commander, at the discretion of the Admiralty, provided he

(a) has attained eight years' seniority as Instructor Lieutenant

(b) is recommended for promotion.

*Instructor Commander and above.*

Promotion to the rank of Instructor Commander and above to be by selection.

"8. *Compulsory retirement for Age.*—  
Instructor Captain ... .. At age 55.  
Instructor Commander ... .. At age 52.  
Instructor Lieutenant-Commander ... At age 48."

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 24th day of March, 1949, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parish of Saint John, Wembley, and of the parish of Greenford (or Great Greenford), hereinafter referred to as the parish of Greenford, both in the diocese of London, and for constituting parts of those parishes so altered together with a part of the parish of Saint Andrew, Sudbury, in the same diocese, a new parish:

"SCHEME

"Whereas, we the Church Commissioners are satisfied (1) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parish of Saint John, Wembley and of the parish of Greenford should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and as delineated on the map hereto annexed and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is within the area described in Part II of the said Schedule a consecrated church known as the church of All Hallows, North Greenford, which has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the Bishop of London by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the twenty-first day of December, 1948, and made pursuant to section 9 of the New Parishes Measure, 1943:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme (a) the boundaries of the said parish of Saint John, Wembley and of the said parish of Greenford shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the said Schedule and as delineated on the map annexed hereto and (b) the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map shall be a new parish.

"2. The Church of All Hallows, North Greenford aforesaid shall be the parish church of the parish.

"3. The name of the parish shall be 'The Parish of All Hallows, North Greenford'.

"4. The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Middlesex and in the rural deanery of Ealing.

"THE SCHEDULE

"Part I

"The territory (shown by the green colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Saint John, Wembley:—

"All that portion of the parish of Greenford which lies to the northeast of the Piccadilly railway line of the London Transport Executive and is contiguous to the said parish of Saint John, Wembley.

"Part II

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the parish of Greenford, the parish of Saint Andrew, Sudbury and the parish of Saint John, Wembley (shown by the pink, blue and brown colours respectively on the map) which taken together are bounded upon the southeast by the parish

of Perivale and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the said parish of Perivale from the parish of Saint John, Wembley, in the middle of Bridgewater Road and continuing thence north-westwards along the middle of Bridgewater Road to a point in the middle of the bridge which carries Bridgewater Road over the Piccadilly railway line of the London Transport Executive and continuing thence north-westwards along the middle of the said railway line to a point in the middle of the bridge which carries Greenford Road over the said railway line and continuing thence south-westwards firstly along the middle of Greenford Road and then along the middle of Oldfield Lane to a point in the middle of the bridge which carries Oldfield Lane over the Paddington Branch of the Grand Junction Canal and continuing thence generally south-eastwards along the middle of the said canal to a point on the boundary which divides the said parish of Greenford from the said Parish of Perivale."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Shepperton; Littleton; Sunbury; Saint Saviour, Upper Sunbury; Ashford; and Feltham, all in the diocese of London.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William Bishop of London consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Shepperton; Littleton; Sunbury; Saint Saviour, Upper Sunbury; Ashford; and Feltham, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory (coloured blue on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Shepperton:—

"All that portion of the parish of Littleton which lies to the south of the middle of the stream flowing from Laleham Park to Pool End.

"2. The territory (coloured pink on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Littleton.

"(a) All that portion of the parish of Shepperton which is bounded upon the north-east by the parish of Sunbury, upon the north and west by the parish of Littleton and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Littleton from the parish of Shepperton in the middle of the stream flowing from Laleham Park to Pool End and continuing thence south-eastwards along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 37

chains or thereabouts to the middle of the bridge carrying the footpath or track leading from Shepperton Green to the township of Shepperton across the said stream and continuing thence north-eastwards in a straight line for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the south-western end of the track running along the south-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Inglenook, Laleham Road and continuing thence north-eastwards along the middle of the said track to the boundary which divides the parish of Shepperton from the parish of Sunbury.

"(b) All that portion of the parish of Sunbury which lies to the north-west of the middle of the line of the Thames Valley branch of the British Railways (Southern Region).

"3. The territory (coloured green on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Saint Saviour, Upper Sunbury.

"(a) All that portion of the parish of Littleton which lies to the north-east of the middle of Ashford Road.

"(b) All that portion of the parish of Ashford which lies to the south-east of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Ashford from the parish of Littleton in the middle of Ashford Road and continuing thence north-westwards along the middle of Ashford Road to a point in the middle of Staines Road and continuing thence south-eastwards along the middle of Staines Road to a point opposite to the south-western end of Hughes Road and continuing thence north-eastwards along the middle of Hughes Road to the boundary which divides the Urban District of Staines from the Urban District of Sunbury and continuing thence firstly south-eastwards and then north-eastwards along the said Urban District boundary to the boundary which divides the parish of Feltham from the parish of Ashford.

"(c) All that portion of the parish of Feltham which is bounded upon part of the west by the parish of Ashford, upon the south by the parish of Saint Saviour, Upper Sunbury, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Saviour, Upper Sunbury from the parish of Feltham in the middle of Vicarage Road, and continuing thence firstly north-westwards along the middle of Vicarage Road and then north-eastwards along the middle of Feltham Hill Road to a point opposite to the middle of the eastern end of the footpath leading from Feltham Hill Road to Chertsey Road and continuing thence generally south-westwards along the middle of the said footpath to the middle of Chertsey Road and continuing thence southwards along the middle of Chertsey Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Feltham from the parish of Ashford.

"4. The territory (coloured brown on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Sunbury.

"All that portion of the parish of Saint Saviour, Upper Sunbury, which lies to the south-east of the middle of Nursery Road."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have

prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of South Mimms and Potters Bar, both in the diocese of London.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is within the said area a consecrated church known as the church of King Charles the Martyr which has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the Bishop of London by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the 22nd October, 1948, and made pursuant to section 9 of the New Parishes Measure, 1943.
