"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bristol, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the rural deaneries within the said two archdeaconries are desirable and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, there shall be formed a new rural deanery within the archdeaconry of Bristol and such new rural deanery shall be called 'The Rural Deanery of Stapleton' and shall comprise and consist of the parishes and cures the names of which are set forth in the First Part of the Schedule hereto and which are at present situate in the rural deanery of Almondsbury, the rural deanery of East Bristol and the rural deanery of Bitton, all of which rural

Age and Service.

1. Age and Service.

(ii) they must have served voluntarily in H.M. Forces (including the Women's Services) or have performed compulsory national service under the National Service Acts for a period of not less than two years two years.

2. Sex and Marriage.
