LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport proposes, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 10 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, as amended by section 63 of the London Passenger Transport Act, 1933, to make Regulations to institute one-way traffic working in the streets in the City of Westminster specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto in the direction specified in the second column of the said Schedule.

TRUNK ROADS ACT, 1946.

Walsoken Diversion.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport has made an Order under subsection (2) of section 1 of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as amended by the Special Roads Act, 1949, whereby the new road specified in Part I of the Schedule to the Order becomes a trunk road and the length of the existing trunk road specified in Part II of the said Schedule will cease to be a trunk road after the new road has been built.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as amended by the Special Roads Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Trunk Roads Act, 1946, as so amended has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the twenty-ninth day of June, 1949, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
