The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS OF THIRD CLASS VALUERS IN THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

1. Candidates must (save as provided below) be at least 25 and under 35 years of age on the 1st July, 1949.

But, exceptionally for the year 1949, candidates who are 35 years of age or over on that date will be eligible, without any upper age limit. In general, however, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service, and accordingly the Commissioners reserve the right to give weight to this factor in considering candidates for these posts who are over 50 years of age.

2. (i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Candidates must, on the closing date for the receipt of applications, have passed the Final Examination of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors, or of the Chartered Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute, or of the Land Agents' Society, or hold a University Degree (e.g., B.Sc. (Estate Management) London, or B.A. (Estate Management) Cambridge) which gives exemption from the examinations of any one of these bodies. They must have had at least four years' professional experience before or after qualifying in:—

(a) the office of a F.R.I.C.S., F.A.I., F.L.A.S., or any Government or municipal service; or

(b) the office of any other surveyor, estate agent, or land agent which in the opinion of the Commissioners and the Department gives an adequate experience.

Time spent on agricultural subjects at a University or approved Agricultural College and followed by the obtaining of a degree or diploma may count up to two out of the required four years.

For posts involving the valuation of minerals, four years' mining experience will be required in place of the professional experience specified above, and for these posts possession of a First Class Certificate of Competency (Mine Managers) or the passing of the Final Examination of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors in the Mining subdivision will be accepted as professional qualifications.
