And whereas the said Governing Body in exercise of the Powers for this purpose conferred upon them by Section 11 of the said Act have resolved to alter Statute 4 of the said Statutes in manner hereinafter

appearing.

Be it enacted as follows:-

1. The fees payable by each boy at the Lower School of John Lyon may exceed Forty Pounds per annum but shall not exceed Sixty Pounds per annum.

2. In all other respects Statute 4 of the above mentioned Statutes shall remain in force.
