A PROCLAMATION

Revoking a Proclamation, dated the 11th day of July, 1949, declaring the existence of a State of Emergency for the purposes of the Emergency Powers Act, 1920.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by virtue of Our Proclamation, dated the Eleventh day of July, nineteen hundred and forty-nine. We did declare the existence of a state of emergency for the purposes of the Emergency Powers Act, 1920:

And whereas it appears to Us that the state of emergency has now ceased to exist, and that it is expedient that the said Proclamation should be revoked accordingly:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain that the said Proclamation of the Eleventh day of July, nineteen hundred and forty-nine, is revoked.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, and in the thirteenth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of July, 1949, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein

mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Saint Mary, Edge Hill, in the diocese of Liverpool.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the Right Reverend Algernon Augustus Markham, Bishop Suffragan of Grantham, is the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Algernon Augustus Markham desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Liverpool for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof he has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Clifford, Bishop of Liverpool, (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said Clifford, Bishop of Liverpool, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Liverpool for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.
