At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 29th day of September, 1949.

PRESENT

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865 (28 and 29 Vict., c. 73), it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in His Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient to make further provision concerning retired pay, pensions and other grants for officers; nurses and ratings disabled, and for the widows and children of officers and ratings deceased, in consequence of service during the 1914 World War, and to provide for the administration of this Order in Council by the Minister of Pensions:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Him thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following provisions of this Order in Council shall take effect accordingly and, except in the cases stated in the Order in Council of the 19th December, 1881, and except as otherwise provided by Statute, shall be established and obeyed as the sole authority in the matters herein treated of, so, however, that the terms of any other Order may, if more favourable, be applied in the case of any person eligible thereunder and that no award already made to or in respect of any person under any previous Order shall be reassessed to the disadvantage of that person.

1. *Definitions.*—In this Order the following expressions have, unless the context otherwise requires, the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them—

(1) "the 1917 (Officers) Order" means the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917 (S.R. & O. 1917 (No. 1022), p. 870), relating to commissioned and subordinate officers and nurses:

(2) "the 1917 (Warrant Officers) Order" means the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1917 (S.R. & O. 1917 (No. 1023), p. 883), relating to commissioned warrant officers and warrant officers:

(3) "the 1920 Order" means the Order in Council of the 11th June, 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920 (No. 1021) II, p. 295), relating to seamen and marines, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council, including this Order in Council:

(4) "the 1921 (Officers) Order" means the Order in Council of the 9th March, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921 (No. 360), p. 770), relating to commissioned and subordinate officers and nurses, as amended by any

subsequent Order in Council, including this Order in Council:

(5) "the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order" means the Order in Council of the 9th March, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921 (No. 361), p. 794), relating to commissioned officers from warrant rank and warrant officers, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council, including this Order in Council:

(6) "the 1924 Order" means the Order in Council of the 8th December, 1924 (S.R. & O. 1924 (No. 1390), p. 1397):

(7) "the 1925 Order" means the Order in Council of the 12th October, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925 (No. 1021), p. 1271):

(8) "the 1945 Order" means the Order in Council of the 15th June, 1945 (S.R. & O. 1945 (No. 740) I, p. 872):

(9) "child", in relation to an officer or rating, means—

(a) a legitimate child of the officer or rating;

(b) a legitimated child of the officer or rating;

(c) an illegitimate child of the officer or rating, who did not become legitimated upon the marriage of the officer or rating to the child's mother;

(d) a stepchild of the officer or rating, who, where the officer or rating is disabled, is being regularly maintained in whole or in part by him, or who, where the officer or rating is dead, was regularly so maintained by him up to the date of his death;

(e) a legally adopted child of the officer or rating:

(10) "nurse" means a person referred to in Article 23 of the 1921 (Officers) Order as a nurse:

(11) "officer" means a commissioned officer or warrant officer, and—

(a) "commissioned officer" means a person coming within the definition of "officer" in Article 30 (1) of the 1921 (Officers) Order; and

(b) "warrant officer" means a person coming within the definition of "officer" in Article 23 (1) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order:

(12) "pension", in relation to a nurse, means a disablement pension under columns (3) to (5) in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order or an addition to service pension under column (6) in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order or under column (6) in the Third Schedule to the 1917 (Officers) Order; and, in relation to a rating, means a disablement pension under Article 1 of the 1920 Order:

(13) "rating" means a person coming within the definition of "seaman or marine" contained in Article 24 (1) of the 1920 Order:

(14) "retired pay", in relation to a commissioned officer, means retired pay under columns (3) to (7) in Part I of the First Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order or additional retired pay under column (8) in Part I of the First Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order or an addition to half-pay or retired pay

under column (8) in the First Schedule to the 1917 (Officers) Order; and, in relation to a warrant officer, means retired pay under column (3) or (4) in the First Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order or an addition to service retired pay, pension or gratuity under column (5) or (6) in the First Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order or an addition to service pension under column (5) or (6) in the First Schedule to the 1917 (Warrant Officers) Order:

(15) "war service", in relation to an officer, nurse or rating, means service as such during the whole or any part of the period beginning on the 4th August, 1914, and ending on the 30th September, 1921:

(16) "wife", in relation to an officer or rating, means a woman who is legally married to the officer or rating and includes a wife whose marriage to the officer or rating took place after the receipt of the wound or injury, or after his removal from duty on account of the contraction or aggravation of the disease, for which he receives pension or after the end of his war service:

(17) "widow" means the widow of an officer or rating who died on or after the 3rd September, 1939, but shall not include a widow who was separated from her husband at the time of his death.

2. *Interpretation.*—(1) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 and 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) References in this Order to any enactment shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as references to that enactment, as amended by or under any other enactment or order, and to any other enactment substituted therefor.

(3) The Orders referred to in Article 1 shall be construed as one with this Order.

3. *Allowance in respect of a wife.*—Where an officer is in receipt of retired pay or a rating is in receipt of a pension in respect of a wound, injury or disease, he may be granted an allowance in respect of his wife of such proportion of £36 a year in the case of an officer, or of 10s. a week in the case of a rating, as corresponds to the degree of disablement at which the wound, injury or disease is assessed for retired pay or a pension:

Provided that—

(a) the award, continuance and amount of any allowance under this Article in respect of a wife who is living apart from the officer or rating shall be at the discretion of the Minister; and

(b) any allowance granted under this Article to a rating shall be in lieu of any allowance under Article 1a of the 1920 Order.

4. *Allowances in respect of children.*—(1) Where an officer is in receipt of retired pay, or a rating is in receipt of a pension, in respect of a wound, injury or disease, he may be granted in respect of a child of his, subject to the conditions set out in Article 2 of the 1920 Order (the age of 18 years being substituted therein, in relation to the child of an officer, for the age of 16 years), an allowance at such proportion of whichever of the following rates is applicable as corresponds to the degree of disablement at which the wound, injury or disease is assessed for retired pay or pension, namely—

(a) in the case of an officer's child—

(i) where an allowance is in issue in respect of a wife, £30 a year; or

(ii) where an allowance is not in issue in respect of a wife, £36 a year for the first child and £30 for each other child;

(b) in the case of a rating's child—

(i) where an allowance is in issue in respect of a wife, 7s. 6d. a week; or

(ii) where an allowance is not in issue in respect of a wife, 10s. a week for the first child and 7s. 6d. a week for each other child.

(2) A pension or allowance under this Article shall terminate when the child of an officer attains the age of 18 years or the child of a rating attains the age of 16 years but, in either case, may be awarded or continued, subject to the following provisions of this Article, after the child has attained that age if the child—

(a) is an apprentice receiving not more than nominal wages or is receiving whole-time education

at a secondary school, technical institute or university; or

(b) is incapable of self-support by reason of infirmity which arose before he attained that age; and the circumstances of the case are, in the opinion of the Minister, such as to justify the award or its continuance.

(3) Paragraph (2) of Article 2 of the 1920 Order and the figure "(2)," in paragraph (2) (iii) of Article 6 of that Order shall be deleted.

5. *Allowances for disabled officers, nurses and ratings who are unemployable.*—(1) *Eligibility.* Where an officer is in receipt of retired pay, or a nurse or a rating is in receipt of a pension, in respect of disablement so serious as to make him unemployable, he may be awarded allowances in accordance with such of the provisions of this Article as may be appropriate in his case:

Provided that—

(a) such an officer, nurse or rating may be deemed to be unemployable although in receipt of earnings which are, in the opinion of the Minister, unlikely to exceed £52 a year;

(b) such an officer, nurse or rating shall not be eligible for any award under this Article if he is in receipt of a retirement pension (not being contributory old age pension) under the National Insurance Act, 1946 (9 and 10 Geo. 6. c. 67), or under any legislation in Northern Ireland corresponding to that Act or under the law of any place outside the United Kingdom which, in the opinion of the Minister, is analogous to that Act.

(2) *Supplementation of retired pay or pension.* An officer, nurse or rating to whom the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article apply may be awarded an allowance, by way of supplement to his retired pay or pension, at the rate of £78 a year in the case of an officer or nurse, or 30s. a week in the case of a rating:

Provided that, in computing the said rates, account shall be taken, to such extent as the Minister may think fit, of any of the following benefits for which the officer, nurse or rating may be eligible—

(a) sickness or disablement benefit under the law of any place outside the United Kingdom which, in the opinion of the Minister, is analogous to benefits under the National Insurance Act, 1946 (9 and 10 Geo. 6. c. 67), or under any corresponding legislation in Northern Ireland;

(b) a contributory old age pension or a widow's basic pension under the National Insurance Act, 1946 (9 and 10 Geo. 6. c. 67), or under any legislation in Northern Ireland corresponding to that Act or under the law of any place outside the United Kingdom which, in the opinion of the Minister, is analogous to that Act.

(3) *Additional allowances for dependants.* Where an officer nurse or rating is awarded an allowance in accordance with paragraph (2) of this Article there may also be awarded to him additional allowances in accordance with the following provisions of this paragraph—

(a) where an allowance has been awarded under Article 3 of this Order or under Article 1a of the 1920 Order and the degree of the disablement of the officer or rating is less than 100 per cent. that allowance may be increased to the rate which would be appropriate if the degree of the disablement of the officer or rating were 100 per cent.

(b) where an allowance has been awarded under Article 3 of this Order or under Article 1a of the 1920 Order and the degree of the disablement of the officer or rating is 100 per cent. or where such an allowance has been increased under subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, the rate of the allowance may be increased or further increased, as the case may be by £6 a year in the case of an officer, or 6s. a week in the case of a rating, if the Minister thinks fit having regard to the financial circumstances of the person in respect of whom the allowance has been granted.

(c) where the family of an officer or rating who is not in receipt of an allowance under Article 3 of this Order or under Article 1a of the 1920 Order includes an adult dependant, or where the family of a nurse includes an adult dependant, an allowance may be awarded in respect of that adult dependant at the rate of £42 a year in the case of an officer or nurse, or 16s. a week in the case of a rating, if the Minister thinks fit having

regard to the financial circumstances of the person in respect of whom the allowance is claimed:

Provided that—

(i) the officer nurse or rating shall not be awarded an allowance in respect of more than one adult dependant;

(ii) where an additional allowance is awarded under this paragraph and an allowance is payable in respect of a first child under subparagraph (1) (a) (ii) or (1) (b) (ii) of Article 4 of this Order, or under the said subparagraph (1) (a) (ii) or (1) (b) (ii) as increased by subparagraph (d) (i) of this paragraph, or under subparagraph (d) (ii) of this paragraph, as the case may be, the aggregate of these allowances shall not exceed £72 a year in the case of an officer or 23s. 6d. a week in the case of a rating.

(d) (i) Where an allowance in respect of a child has been awarded under Article 4 of this Order and the degree of disablement of the officer or rating is less than 100 per cent., that allowance may be increased to the rate which would be appropriate under that Article if the degree of the disablement of the officer or rating were 100 per cent.

(ii) An allowance may be awarded in respect of a child to whom the provisions of paragraph (5) of this Article apply at the rate and subject to the conditions which would be appropriate if he had come within Article 4 of this Order and the degree of disablement of the unemployable officer or rating were 100 per cent.

(4) In this Article, "adult dependant" means—

(a) a person residing in the home of the officer, nurse or rating, who is related to the officer, nurse or rating in any of the following ways and fulfils the following conditions, namely—

(i) a grandfather or a father (including a stepfather) who is incapable of self-support by reason of physical or mental infirmity of a permanent or prolonged nature;

(ii) a grandmother or a mother (including a stepmother) who is either a widow or is married to a husband who is incapable of self-support by reason of physical or mental infirmity of a permanent or prolonged nature or has never been married;

(iii) a daughter (including a stepdaughter) who, in the case of an officer or nurse, has attained the age of 18 years or who, in the case of a rating, has attained the age of 16 years, or a sister (including a half-sister or stepsister) who has attained the age of 16 years and has never been married or is married to a husband who is incapable of self-support by reason of physical or mental infirmity of a permanent or prolonged nature or is a widow;

(iv) a brother (including a half-brother or stepbrother) who has attained the age of 16 years and is incapable of self-support by reason of physical or mental infirmity of a permanent or prolonged nature; or

(b) an adult female person who, in the home of the officer or rating, looks after any child of the officer or rating in respect of whom an allowance is being paid under Article 4 of this Order or under this Article;

being in each case a person who is in receipt of regular and substantial support or benefit from the officer, nurse or rating.

(5) In this Article, "child" includes any child who should, in the opinion of the Minister, having regard to the child's relationship to or connection with the officer or rating and the other circumstances of the case, be treated as covered by the provisions of this Article.

6. Allowances for lowered standard of occupation.

(1) Where an officer is in receipt of retired pay, or a nurse or a rating is in receipt of a pension, in respect of disablement the degree of which is less than 100 per cent., and the disablement is such as to render him incapable, and likely to remain permanently incapable, of following the occupation which was the most remunerative occupation which, in the opinion of the Minister, accounted for a substantial period of his employment during the period beginning with the 1st July 1944, and ending with the 1st July, 1945, and incapable of following any other occupation which is of an equivalent standard and is suitable in his case, he may be awarded an allowance at a rate not exceeding 20s. a week so,

however, that the aggregate rate of his retired pay or pension together with the allowance under this Article shall not exceed the rate of award of retired pay or pension, as the case may be, which would have been appropriate in his case if the degree of his disablement had been 100 per cent.

(2) This Article shall not apply to an officer, nurse or rating who is eligible for an allowance under Article 5 (2).

7. Allowances for disabled officers and nurses receiving approved treatment.—(1) Where, in respect of any period of approved treatment for a wound, injury or disease,—

(a) a commissioned officer is in receipt of retired pay under columns (3) to (7) in Part I of the First Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, or additional retired pay under column (8) in Part I of the First Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order or an addition to half pay or retired pay under column (8) in the First Schedule to the 1917 (Officers) Order, or a warrant officer is in receipt of retired pay under column (3) or (4) in the First Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, or an addition to service retired pay, pension or gratuity under column (5) or (6) in the First Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, or an addition to service pension under column (5) or (6) in the First Schedule to the 1917 (Warrant Officers) Order, granted under Article 6 (a) of the 1921 (Officers) Order or, as the case may be, the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order; or

(b) a nurse is in receipt of a Pension under columns (3) to (5) in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order or an addition to service pension under column (6) in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order or under column (6) in the Third Schedule to the 1917 (Officers) Order, granted under Article 26 (a) of the 1921 (Officers) Order;

such retired pay or pension may be increased by whichever of the following amounts is appropriate, namely—

(i) if the officer or nurse is not eligible for any such benefit as is mentioned in paragraph (7) of this Article, 26s. a week;

(ii) if the officer or nurse is eligible for such benefit at a lower rate than 26s. a week, the amount of the difference between that lower rate and 26s. a week;

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to an officer or nurse who is in receipt of an allowance under Article 5 (2), or an officer or nurse who is receiving approved treatment in an institution and is not entitled to an allowance under the following provisions of this Article.

(2) Where, in respect of any period of approved treatment for a wound, injury or disease, a commissioned officer is in receipt of retired pay under columns (3) to (7) in Part I of the First Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, or additional retired pay under column (8) in Part I of the First Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, or an addition to half pay or retired pay under column (8) in the First Schedule to the 1917 (Officers) Order, or a warrant officer is in receipt of retired pay under column (3) or (4) in the First Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, or an addition to service retired pay, pension or gratuity under column (5) or (6) in the First Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, or an addition to service pension under column (5) or (6) in the First Schedule to the 1917 (Warrant Officers) Order, granted under Article 6 (a) of the 1921 (Officers) Order or, as the case may be, the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, he may be granted, as part of his award under that Article and subject to the conditions applicable to that award, an allowance in respect of his wife, child or adult dependant in accordance with the following provisions of this Article.

(3) Where, in respect of any period during which a nurse is receiving approved treatment for a wound, injury or disease, she is in receipt of a pension under columns (3) to (5) in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order or an addition to service pension under column (6) in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order or under column (6) in the Third Schedule to the 1917 (Officers) Order, granted under Article 26 (a) of the 1921 (Officers) Order, she may be granted, as part of her award under that Article and subject to the conditions applicable to that award, an allowance in respect of an adult dependant in accordance with the following provisions of this Article.

(4) An allowance awarded by virtue of paragraphs (2) or (3) of this Article—

(a) where it is awarded in respect of a wife, shall be at the rate of £36 a year and may be increased by £6 a year if the Minister thinks fit having regard to the financial circumstances of the wife;

(b) where it is awarded in respect of a child, shall be at whichever of the following rates is applicable, namely—

(i) where an allowance is in issue in respect of a wife, £30 a year for each child; or

(ii) where an allowance is not in issue in respect of a wife, £36 a year for the first child and £30 a year for each other child;

(c) where it is awarded in respect of an adult dependant, shall be at the rate of £42 a year if the Minister thinks fit having regard to the financial circumstances of that dependant:

Provided that—

(i) an allowance shall not be awarded under this subparagraph where an allowance is payable under subparagraph (a) of this paragraph;

(ii) an officer or nurse shall not be awarded more than one allowance under this subparagraph.

(5) Where an allowance is awarded under paragraph (4) (c) of this Article and an allowance is also payable under paragraph (4) (b) (ii) in respect of a first child, the aggregate of the allowances shall not exceed £72 a year.

(6) An allowance awarded by virtue of this Article, where it is awarded in respect of a wife, shall be subject to the same conditions as an allowance under Article 3 of this Order and shall be in lieu of any allowance under that Article and, where it is awarded in respect of a child, shall be subject to the same conditions as an allowance under Article 4 of this Order and shall be in lieu of any allowance under that Article.

(7) The benefit referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article is personal benefit by way of injury benefit under the National Insurance (Industrial Injuries) Act, 1946 (9 & 10 Geo. 6. c. 62), sickness benefit, retirement pension or contributory old age pension under the National Insurance Act, 1946 (9 & 10 Geo. 6. c. 67), or under any legislation in Northern Ireland corresponding to that legislation, or under the law of any place outside the United Kingdom which in the opinion of the Minister is analogous to that legislation.

(8) In this Article, in relation to an officer who is receiving approved treatment,—

(a) "child" includes any child who should, in the opinion of the Minister, having regard to the child's relationship to or connection with the officer and the other circumstances of the case, be treated as covered by the provisions of this Article.

(b) "adult dependant" means a person coming within paragraph (4) of Article 5 of this Order.

(9) In Articles 6 (a) and 26 (a) of the 1921 (Officers) Order and in Article 6 (a) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order the words "a deduction" to the end of the subparagraph shall be deleted and there shall be substituted the words "subject to such deductions or adjustments as the Minister may think appropriate having regard to all the circumstances of the case".

8. Allowances for disabled ratings receiving approved treatment.—(1) Where the conditions for the award to a rating of an allowance under paragraph (1) of Article 6 of the 1920 Order are fulfilled, the allowance under that paragraph shall consist of—

(a) a personal allowance in respect of himself and an additional allowance in respect of his wife, child, a person to whom the provisions of Article 1a (4) of the 1920 Order apply or an adult dependant in accordance with the following provisions of this Article; or

(b) where the rating has duly proved his pre-war earnings as provided by Article 3 of the 1920 Order, an allowance equal to the maximum pension which would be payable to him under that Article if he were without earning capacity; whichever is the greater.

(2) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, a personal allowance awarded in accordance with paragraph (1) (a) of this Article shall be, in the case of a rating other than a rating to whom Article 13 of this Order applies, at the rate of 45s.

a week with any additions for which he is eligible under Article 1 (4) of the 1920 Order.

(3) The allowance under paragraph (1) (a) of this Article may be increased by whichever of the following amounts is appropriate, namely—

(a) if the rating is not eligible for any such benefit as is mentioned in paragraph (9) of this Article, 26s. a week;

(b) if the rating is eligible for such benefit at a lower rate than 26s. a week, the amount of the difference between that lower rate and 26s. a week:

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to—

(i) a rating who is in receipt of an allowance under Article 5 (2); or

(ii) a rating who is receiving approved treatment in an institution and is not entitled to an allowance under the following provisions of this Article.

(4) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, an additional allowance awarded in accordance with paragraph (1) (a) of this Article—

(a) where it is in respect of a wife, shall be at the maximum rate under Article 3 of this Order, and where it is in respect of a person to whom the provisions of Article 1a (4) of the 1920 Order apply, shall be at the maximum rate under that Article, and in either case may be increased by 6s. a week if the Minister thinks fit having regard to the financial circumstances of the person in respect of whom the allowance has been awarded;

(b) where it is in respect of a child, shall be at whichever of the following rates is applicable, namely—

(i) where an allowance is in issue under subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, 7s. 6d. a week for each child; or

(ii) where an allowance is not in issue under subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, 10s. a week for the first child and 7s. 6d. for each other child;

(c) where it is in respect of an adult dependant, shall be at the rate of 16s. a week if the Minister thinks fit having regard to the financial circumstances of that dependant:

Provided that—

(i) an allowance shall not be awarded under this subparagraph where an allowance is in payment under subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, or under Article 6 (2) (ii) of the 1920 Order;

(ii) a rating shall not be awarded more than one allowance under this subparagraph.

(5) Where an allowance is awarded under paragraph (4) (c) of this Article and an allowance is also payable under paragraph (4) (b) (ii) in respect of a first child, the aggregate of the allowances shall not exceed 23s. 6d. a week.

(6) An allowance awarded by virtue of this Article, where it is awarded in respect of a wife, shall be subject to the same conditions as an allowance under Article 3 of this Order, where it is awarded in respect of a person to whom the provisions of Article 1a (4) of the 1920 Order apply, shall be subject to the same conditions as an allowance under that Article and, where it is awarded in respect of a child, shall be subject to the same conditions as an allowance under Article 4 of this Order.

(7) Where, in the case of a rating entitled to a service pension, or to a service allowance under Article 13 (2) or (4) of this Order, the conditions for the award of an allowance under paragraph (1) (a) of this Article are fulfilled, he may be awarded an allowance in accordance with that paragraph in addition to his service pension or service allowance at the rate in the following Table appropriate to the rating's rank:—

(8) A treatment allowance shall be subject to such deductions or adjustments as the Minister may think appropriate having regard to all the circumstances of the case.

(9) The benefit referred to in paragraph (3) of this Article is personal benefit by way of injury benefit under the National Insurance (Industrial Injuries) Act, 1946 (9 & 10 Geo. 6. c. 62), sickness benefit,

retirement pension or contributory old age pension under the National Insurance Act, 1946 (9 & 10 Geo. 6. c. 67), or under any legislation in Northern Ireland corresponding to that legislation, or under the law of any place outside the United Kingdom which in the opinion of the Minister is analogous to that legislation.

(10) In this Article, in relation to a rating who is receiving approved treatment—

(a) "child" includes any child who should, in the opinion of the Minister, having regard to the child's relationship to or connection with the rating and the other circumstances of the case, be treated as covered by the provisions of this Article;

(b) "adult dependant" means a person to whom the provisions of paragraph (4) of Article 5 of this Order apply.

(11) (a) The following words and provisions in Article 6 of the 1920 Order shall be deleted:—

(i) subparagraph (a) of paragraph (1) and subparagraph (b) of that paragraph down to and including the words "less 19s. whichever is the greater";

(ii) subparagraph (c) of paragraph (1);

(iii) subparagraph (i) of paragraph (2);

(iv) the words after "7s. 6d. a week" in subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (2).

(b) In the second proviso to paragraph (1) (b) of Article 6 of the 1920 Order the references to paragraphs (a) (i) or (a) (ii) shall be read as references respectively to paragraphs (1) (a) and (1) (b) of this Article.

9. Allowances where prolonged abstention from work is necessary following institutional treatment.—

(1) Where it is certified that an officer, nurse or rating should on completion of a course of approved treatment in an institution abstain from work for a prolonged period in consequence of the condition which necessitated that treatment, he may be treated as if he were eligible throughout that period for allowances under Article 7 or 8 whichever is appropriate.

(2) This Article shall not apply to an officer, nurse or rating who is in receipt of an allowance under Article 5 (2).

10. Allowances for part-time treatment.—Where the conditions for the award of an allowance under Article 6 (4) of the 1920 Order or Article 6 (b) or 26 (b) of the 1921 (Officers) Order or Article 6 (b) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order are fulfilled, the maximum rate of that allowance shall be 21s. in respect of any one day (subject to a maximum payment of 30s. in respect of any one week):

Provided that the rate of an allowance awarded to a person under any of those Articles in respect of any period of a week or less shall not exceed the amount by which the weekly value of that person's existing award (excluding any award under Article 6a of the 1920 Order, Article 7 or 27 of the 1921 (Officers) Order or Article 7 of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, Article 5 (2), 12 or 19 of this Order), falls short of the weekly value of the award which would have been appropriate in the case of that person under Article 8 of this Order, or under Article 6 (a) of the 1921 (Officers) Order reckoned with Article 7 of this Order, or under Article 26 (a) of the 1921 (Officers) Order reckoned with Article 7 of this Order or under Article 6 (a) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order reckoned with Article 7 of this Order, as the case may be, if he had been eligible for an award thereunder.

11. Allowances for constant attendance.—The following proviso shall be added to Articles 7 and 27 of the 1921 (Officers) Order, Article 7 of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order and Article 6a of the 1920 Order:

"Provided that in an exceptional case of very severe disablement the allowance may, subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine, be increased to a rate not exceeding 40s. a week."

12. Allowances for wear and tear of clothing.—

(1) Where an officer is in receipt of retired pay, or a nurse or a rating is in receipt of a pension, in respect of an amputation, and the officer, nurse or rating regularly wears an artificial limb, he may be awarded an allowance in respect of wear and tear of clothing at whichever of the following rates is applicable, namely—

(a) where he wears a single artificial limb (other than a tilting-table limb), £5 a year; or

(b) where he wears a tilting-table limb or more than one artificial limb, £8 a year.

(2) In any other case in which the Minister is satisfied that as a result of the pensioned disablement there is exceptional wear and tear of the officer's, nurse's or rating's clothing, an allowance not exceeding £8 a year may be awarded.

(3) In this Article the expression "retired pay" includes wounds pension under the Regulations in force before the 4th August, 1914, retired pay at the half-pay rate under proviso (1) (a) (iii) to Article 1 of the 1921 (Officers) Order and alternative retired pay under Article 3 of the 1921 (Officers) Order and Article 3 of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order; and the expression "pension", in relation to a nurse, includes an alternative pension under Article 23c of the 1921 (Officers) Order, and, in relation to a rating, an alternative pension under Article 3 of the 1920 Order.

13. Ratings entitled to awards in respect of service.

(1) Where, in the case of a rating entitled to a service pension, the conditions for the award of a disablement pension under Article 1 of the 1920 Order are fulfilled, he may be awarded, in addition to his service pension, a disablement pension under that Article at such proportion of the rate set out in the following Table in relation to his rank as corresponds to the degree of his disablement as assessed under that Order without any addition to his disablement pension under paragraph (4) of that Article.

(2) Where, in the case of a rating entitled to a service allowance under Article 1 of the 1924 Order, the conditions for the award of a disablement pension under Article 1 of the 1920 Order are fulfilled, he may be awarded a disablement pension under that Article (without any addition under paragraph (4) of that Article) at such proportion of the rate set out in paragraph (1) of this Article in relation to his rank as corresponds to the degree of his disablement under the 1920 Order, and the service allowance (which shall be in lieu of any service pension which might have been granted to him under the Order in Council of the 8th May, 1919 (S.R. & O. 1919 (No. 677) II, p. 95)) shall be at the rate set out in the following Table in relation to his service with appropriate additions (a) in respect of good conduct badges or medals, (b) in the case of Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers and Leading Ratings of the Royal Navy in respect of petty time, and (c) in the case of Non-commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines in respect of service above the rank of private, in accordance with the Regulations referred to in Article 1 (4) of the 1920 Order, and an addition, in any case, subject to good character as a pensioner, of 5d. a day on attaining the age of 55 years.

(3) Where the conditions are fulfilled for the award to a rating of a disablement pension:—

(a) under Article 2 (1) or 3 of the 1925 Order, the pension shall be at such proportion of the rate set out in paragraph (1) of this Article in relation to his pre-war rank as corresponds to the total degree of his disablement as assessed under the 1920 Order and if he attained higher substantive rank during the 1914 World War there may be added to such pension in respect of his 1914 World War disablement a proportionate addition for such higher rank;

(b) under Article 2 (2) of the 1925 Order, the pension shall be at such proportion of the rate set out in paragraph (1) of this Article in relation to his 1914 World War rank as corresponds to the total degree of his disablement as assessed under the 1920 Order;

(c) under Article 6 of the 1925 Order the pension shall be at such proportion of the rate set out in paragraph (1) of this Article in relation to his 1914 World War rank as corresponds to the degree of his 1914 World War disablement as assessed under the 1920 Order.

(4) Where the conditions for the award of a service allowance under Article 2 (1), 2 (2) or 6 of the 1925 Order are fulfilled, the allowance shall be at the rate set out in paragraph (2) of this Article in relation to the rating's service with appropriate additions (a) in respect of good conduct badges and medals, (b) in the case of Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers and Leading Ratings of the Royal Navy in respect of petty time, and (c) in the case of Non-commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines in respect of service above the rank of private, in accordance with the Regulations referred to in Article 1 (4) of the 1920 Order, and an addition, in any case, subject to good character as a pensioner, of 5d. a day on attaining the age of 55 years.

(5) Paragraph (4a) of Article 1 of the 1920 Order is hereby cancelled.

(6) The 1924 Order shall have effect as if for Article 2 thereof there were substituted paragraph (2) of this Article and Article 6 thereof shall cease to have effect in relation to a case coming within paragraph (2) of this Article and paragraph (b) of Article 8 thereof shall be deleted.

(7) The 1925 Order shall have effect subject to the provisions of paragraphs (3) and (4) of this Article and Article 5 and paragraph (2) of Article 10 thereof shall be deleted.

(8) For the purposes of this Article the Orders in Council of the 8th May, 1919, and the 27th June, 1927 (S.R. & O. 1927 (No. 627) p. 892) shall be construed as authorising the award of the service pensions therein referred to in addition to disablement pensions on any of the scales set out in paragraph (1) of this Article.

(9) "Service" in paragraph (2) of this Article means service which is allowed to reckon for Long Service pension under the conditions set forth in the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

14. *Awards to widows and children on the death of officers or ratings on or after the 3rd September, 1939.*—(1) Where an officer or a rating dies on or after the 3rd September, 1939, of the disablement in respect of which he was on the date of his death in receipt of retired pay or pension, there may be awarded subject to the following provisions of this Article, a pension to the widow, and a pension or allowance in respect of any child of the deceased officer or rating.

(2) A pension or allowance under this Article shall be at the rate and subject to the conditions which would have been appropriate under Article 16A or 16B of the 1921 (Officers) Order or, as the case may be, Article 16A or 16B of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order or Article 17A or 17B of the 1920 Order, if the widow or child had come within the definition contained, in relation to a commissioned officer, in Article 30 (2) or (3) of the 1921 (Officers) Order, or, in relation to a warrant officer, in Article 23 (2) or (3) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, or, in relation to a rating, in Article 24 (2) or (3) of the 1920 Order:

Provided that—

(a) any award under this Article shall be in lieu of any award under Article 16A or 16B of the 1921 (Officers) Order or, as the case may be, Article 16A or 16B of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, or Article 17A or 17B of the 1920 Order;

(b) a widow who is not over 40 years of age and is without children eligible for an allowance under this Article, but is incapable of self-support by reason of infirmity, may be awarded a pension under this Article at the rate which would be appropriate to her case if she were over 40 years of age and otherwise eligible under the provisions of this Order and of the 1921 (Officers) Order, the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order or the 1920 Order, as the case may be, for an award at that rate:

(c) in the case of a motherless child, the pension for each child shall be at the following rate:—

(i) in respect of a commissioned officer's child, £60 a year;

(ii) in respect of a warrant officer's child, £45 a year if the child has not attained the age of 15 years or £52 a year if the child has attained that age;

(iii) in respect of a rating's child, 13s. 6d. a week if the child has not attained the age of 15 years or 20s. a week if the child has attained that age;

(d) a pension or allowance to or in respect of a child under this Article shall terminate when the child of a deceased officer attains the age of 18 years or the child of a deceased rating attains the age of 16 years but, in either case, may be awarded or continued, subject to the following provisions of this Article, after the child has attained that age if the child—

(i) is an apprentice receiving not more than nominal wages or is receiving whole-time education at a secondary school, technical institute or university; or

(ii) is incapable of self-support by reason of infirmity which arose before he attained that age;

and the circumstances of the case are, in the opinion of the Minister, such as to justify the award or its continuance.

(3) Where a pension may be awarded or continued under proviso (d) to paragraph (2) of this Article to or in respect of a motherless child who has attained the age of 18 years and in respect of whom the condition in proviso (c) (ii) of that paragraph is fulfilled, the pension may be awarded at, or if already awarded increased to, a rate not exceeding £68 a year in the case of a child of a deceased officer or 26s. a week in the case of a child of a deceased rating.

(4) An award of a pension or allowance under this Article in the case of the child of a deceased officer or rating shall be subject to the conditions of Article 12 (5) of the 1921 (Officers) Order or Article 12 (3) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order or Article 2 (3) of the 1920 Order as the case may be, and shall be in lieu of any award under Article 12, 16A, 16B or 17 of the 1921 (Officers) Order or the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order or Article 12, 17A, 17B or 18 of the 1920 Order respectively.

(5) In this Article the expression "retired pay" includes wounds pension under the Regulations in force before the 4th August, 1914, retired pay at the half-pay rate under proviso (1) (a) (iii) to Article 1 of the 1921 (Officers) Order and alternative retired pay under Article 3 of the 1921 (Officers) Order and Article 3 of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order; and the expression "pension", in relation to a rating, includes an alternative pension under Article 3 of the 1920 Order.

(6) In Articles 12 and 18 of the 1920 Order, the figure "(2)," shall be deleted.

15. *Awards to or in respect of the children of officers and ratings whose death took place before the 3rd September, 1939.*—(1) An officer's widow who is in receipt of a pension under Article 11, 16A or 16B of the 1921 (Officers) Order or the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, may be awarded, subject to the following provisions of this Article, an allowance in respect of any child of the officer who is maintained by her at the rate of—

(a) in the case of a commissioned officer's child, £36 a year; or

(b) in the case of a warrant officer's child, £30 a year.

(2) Where the circumstances of an officer's death and the other conditions of the case are such that a child of the deceased officer would have been eligible for a pension as a motherless child under Article 16A, 16B or 17 of the 1921 (Officers) Order or the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order if he had come within the definition contained in Article 30 (3) of the 1921 (Officers) Order or, as the case may be, Article 23 (3) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, he may be awarded, subject to the following provisions of this Article, a pension of—

(a) in the case of a commissioned officer's child, £60 a year; or

(b) in the case of a warrant officer's child, £45 a year if the child has not attained the age of 15 years or £52 a year if the child has attained that age.

(3) a rating's widow who is in receipt of a pension under Article 11, 17A or 17B of the 1920 Order may be awarded, subject to the following provisions of this Article, an allowance at the rate of 11s. a week in respect of any child of the rating who is maintained by her.

(4) Where the circumstances of a rating's death and the other conditions of the case are such that a child of the deceased rating would have been eligible for a pension as a motherless child under Article 17A, 17B or 18 of the 1920 Order if he had come within the definition contained in Article 24 (3) of the 1920 Order, he may be awarded, subject to the following provisions of this Article, a pension at the rate of 13s. 6d. a week if he has not attained the age of 15 years or 20s. a week if he has attained that age.

(5) A pension or allowance under this Article shall terminate when the child of a deceased officer attains the age of 18 years or the child of a deceased rating attains the age of 16 years but, in either case, may be awarded or continued, subject to the following provisions of this Article, after the child has attained that age if the child—

(a) is an apprentice receiving not more than nominal wages or is receiving whole-time education at a secondary school, technical institute or university; or

(b) is incapable of self-support by reason of infirmity which arose before he attained that age; and the circumstances of the case are, in the opinion of the Minister, such as to justify the award or its continuance.

(6) Where a pension may be awarded or continued under paragraph (5) of this Article to or in respect of a motherless child who has attained the age of 18 years and in respect of whom the condition in subparagraph (b) of that paragraph is fulfilled, the pension may be awarded at, or if already awarded increased to, a rate not exceeding £68 a year in the case of a child of a deceased officer or 26s. a week in the case of a child of a deceased rating.

(7) An award of a pension or allowance under this Article in the case of the child of a deceased officer or rating shall be subject to the conditions of Article 12 (5) of the 1921 (Officers) Order, or Article 12 (3) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, or Article 2 (3) of the 1920 Order, as the case may be, and shall be in lieu of any award under Article 12, 16A, 16B or 17 of the 1921 (Officers) Order or the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, or Article 12, 17A, 17B or 18 of the 1920 Order respectively.

16. *Gratuities to widows on remarriage.*—(1) Article 16 of the 1920 Order shall be deleted and there shall be substituted the following Article:—

“(1) Any pension granted to the widow of a rating under Article 11 or 13 of this Order shall cease on her marriage. Allowances for children under Article 12 of this Order may be paid after marriage.

(2) On the marriage, after 4th July, 1948, of a widow in receipt of a pension under Article 11 or 13 of this Order, she may be awarded a gratuity equal to one year's pension at the rate appropriate under Article 11.

(3) On the marriage, after 4th July, 1948, of a widow in receipt of a pension under Article 17A or 17B of this Order, she may be awarded a gratuity equal to one year's pension under Article 17A or 17B, as the case may be.”

(2) In Article 23 of the 1920 Order there shall be substituted for the words “not exceeding the amount of 26 weeks' pension based on the corresponding Article of the 1919 Regulations”, in relation to a separated wife, the words “equal to one year's pension.”

17. *Suspension of pensions to officers' widows on remarriage.*—Article 15 of the 1921 (Officers) Order and of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order shall become 15 (1) and there shall be added thereto the following paragraph:—

“(2) Where the pension granted to the widow or separated widow of an officer under Article 16A or 16B of this Order ceased on her remarriage, the pension (subject to adjustment under Article 30A of the 1921 (Officers) Order and under Article 24 of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order) may, in the event of her again becoming a widow, be restored, wholly or in part, if she is otherwise qualified and if in the opinion of the Minister her pecuniary circumstances are such as to justify the restoration.”

18. *Awards to or in respect of children on the death of unemployable officers and ratings.*—(1) Where an officer or rating was at the date of his death in receipt of an allowance under Article 5 (3) (d) (ii) of this Order in respect of a child coming within paragraph (5) of that Article, and he dies of

the disablement in respect of which he was at that date in receipt of that allowance, there may be awarded in accordance with the following provisions of this Article a pension to or an allowance in respect of the child.

(2) A pension or allowance under this Article shall be at the rate and subject to the conditions which would have been appropriate under Article 14 of this Order if the child had come within the provisions of that Article.

19. *Education allowances.*—(1) Where a pension or allowance under this Order is payable to or in respect of a child of a disabled or deceased officer or rating, an allowance in respect of the child may be awarded for the purpose of the child's education if—

(a) the child has attained the age of 5 years; and

(b) the circumstances of the family are such as to require it; and

(c) the Minister is satisfied that the type of education which the child is receiving, or is to receive, is suitable for the child.

(2) The amount of an allowance under this Article shall be determined by the Minister, but the total payments made in respect of any period of twelve months shall not exceed £80 in respect of any one child.

20. *Rent allowances to ratings' widows who have children.*—(1) Where the widow of a rating is in receipt of a pension under Article 11, 17A or 17B of the 1920 Order, or under Article 14 of this Order, and her household includes a child, the widow may be awarded an allowance in accordance with the following provisions of this Article at such weekly rate not exceeding 15s. as the Minister may consider appropriate having regard to the amount by which her weekly rent and rates exceed 8s.

(2) Where the child has attained the age of 16 years, the award of an allowance under this Article shall not be made or continued unless the circumstances of the case are such, in the opinion of the Minister, as to justify the award or its continuance.

(3) Where an allowance under this Article would cease by reason of the death of a child before attaining the age of 16 years, the allowance shall be continued for the period of thirteen weeks from the date of the child's death.

(4) In this Article—

(a) “child” includes any child who should, in the opinion of the Minister, having regard to the child's relationship to or connection with the rating and the other circumstances of the case, be treated as covered by the provisions of this Article, being a child who has not attained the age of 16 years or who, having attained that age, fulfils either of the conditions set out in proviso (d) to paragraph (2) of Article 14 of this Order for the grant or continuance of a child's allowance;

(b) “weekly rent and rates” means such sum as the Minister may, after taking into account all relevant factors and making all necessary apportionments, consider to be the weekly amount which the widow is paying or providing either directly or indirectly in respect of rent, or the equivalent thereof, and rates for accommodation for the benefit of herself and the child;

(c) “accommodation” means living accommodation without any service or benefit not ordinarily provided by the landlord to the tenant of an unfurnished dwelling house, but may include accommodation reasonably required for the storage of furniture.

(5) This Article shall have effect as if any reference to a rating included reference to a warrant officer, Article 2 (2) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order being substituted in paragraph (4) (a) in the case of a warrant officer's child for Article 2 (2) of the 1920 Order and the age of 18 years being substituted therein in respect of that child for the age of 16 years, so, however, that the rate of an allowance under this Article to the widow of a warrant officer shall not exceed the amount by which the pension of which she is in receipt under Article 11, 16A or 16B of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, or under Article 14 of this Order, together with any allowances awarded to her under Article 14, 15, 18 or 19 of this Order in respect of children, falls short of the pension under Article 11, 16A or 16B of the 1921 (Officers) Order or under Article 14 of this Order, together with any allowances under

Article 14, 15, 18 or 19 of this Order in respect of children, of which she would be in receipt if the warrant officer had been a sub-lieutenant.

21. *Children whose maintenance is otherwise provided for.*—(1) A pension or allowance which may be or has been awarded to or in respect of a child may be withheld or reduced to such an extent as the Minister may think fit, where periodical payments out of public funds are being made to or in respect of the child or the child is being maintained in the Navy, Army or Air Force or in any institution wholly or mainly supported out of public funds.

(2) Article 2 (4) of the 1920 Order shall be deleted. There shall also be deleted the word and figure "and (4)" in Articles 6 (2) (iii), 12 and 18 of the 1920 Order.

22. *Amended rates of certain pensions and allowances.*—(1) (a) In the Table in Part I of the First Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order after column (5) relating to a Lieut.-Commander, R.N. and Captain, R.M. there shall be inserted a column (5) (a) relating to a Lieutenant, R.N., and to a Lieutenant, R.M. with four years' commissioned service or over, containing a figure of £240 for disablement assessed at 100 per cent. and the proportions of that figure which are appropriate to the lesser degrees of disablement, and in the heading to column (6) the reference to Lieutenants, R.N., shall be deleted and after Lieutenant, R.M. there shall be inserted the words "with less than four years' commissioned service".

(b) In the Table in the First Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order for the figures £180, £150, £120 and £90 for disablement assessed at 100 per cent. there shall be substituted the figures £210, £180, £150 and £150 respectively, and for the remaining figures there shall be substituted the proportions of the last mentioned figures which are appropriate to the lesser degrees of disablement.

(2) In the Table in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order for the figures £210, £180, £150 and £90 for disablement assessed at 100 per cent. there shall be substituted the figures £235, £205, £175 and £125 respectively, and for the remaining figures there shall be substituted the proportions of the last mentioned figures which are appropriate to the lesser degrees of disablement.

(3) (a) In the Table in the Second Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order for the figures £168 in columns (3) and (4) and for the figure £126 in column (5) there shall be substituted the figures £170 and £130 respectively; and for the figures £140, £120, £120 and £90 in columns (2), (3), (4) and (5) there shall be substituted—

(i) against the reference in column (1) to a Lieutenant, R.N., and Lieutenant, R.M., with over four years' commissioned service, the figures £165, £150, £150 and £120 respectively; and

(ii) against the reference in column (1) to a Sub-Lieutenant, R.N., Lieutenant, R.M. with less than four years' commissioned service, Second Lieutenant, R.M. and Quartermaster, R.M., the figures £150, £130, £130 and £110 respectively.

(b) In the Table in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order for the figures £105 and £90 in column (2) and £90 and £75 in column (3) there shall be substituted the figures £130, £110, £110 and £90 respectively.

(4) In column 2 of the Table in Article 11 of the 1920 Order, as amended by Article 12 (4) of the 1945 Order, for the figures 37s. Od., 36s. Od., 35s. Od., 34s. Od. and 32s. 6d., there shall be substituted the figures 39s. Od., 38s. Od., 37s. Od., 36s. Od. and 35s. Od. respectively.

(5) In Article 16A (1) of the 1921 (Officers) Order and of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order the words "which shall not exceed one-half of her husband's appropriate retired pay" shall be deleted and there shall be substituted the words "in accordance with the rates set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order".

(6) In Article 17A (1) of the 1920 Order the words "which shall not exceed one-half of the disablement pension granted to her deceased husband" shall be deleted and there shall be substituted the words "at the weekly rates set forth in Article 11".

(7) There shall be added at the end of Article 18 (1) of the 1920 Order, as amended by Article 12 (7) of the 1945 Order, the words "or, where the child has attained the age of 15 years, 20s. a week. When the child has attained the age of 18 years and is incapable of self-support by reason of an infirmity which arose

before the age of 16 years, the pension may be awarded at, or if already awarded increased to, a rate not exceeding 26s. a week."

(8) In the Table in Article 2 (1) of the 1920 Order for the figure 6s. Od. wherever the same occurs there shall be substituted the figure 7s. 6d.

(9) In Article 12 of the 1920 Order for each of the figures therein specified there shall be substituted the figure 11s. Od.

(10) In—

(a) Article 17 of the 1921 (Officers) Order the words in paragraph (1) "In the event of two or more children being maintained by one person in the same household, the amount will be reduced to £50 for each child after the first";

(b) Article 17 of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order the words in paragraph (1) "In the event of two or more children being maintained by one person in the same household, the amount will be reduced to £35 for each child after the first"; shall be deleted, and there shall be added at the end of each of those Articles the following paragraph:—

"(4) When the child has attained the age of 18 years and is incapable of self-support by reason of an infirmity which arose before that age, the pension may be awarded at, or if already awarded increased to, a rate not exceeding £68 a year."

(11) The First Schedule to the 1920 Order shall be deleted and there shall be substituted the Schedule to this Order.

23. *General provisions applicable.*—Any general provision contained in or applicable by virtue of the 1921 (Officers) Order, the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order or the 1920 Order shall apply to awards under this Order in all respects as if any provision in this Order relating to a commissioned officer or nurse were contained in the 1921 (Officers) Order, any provision relating to a warrant officer were contained in the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order and any provision relating to a rating were contained in the 1920 Order.

24. *Commencement of this Order and revocation of previous Orders.*—(1) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, this Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st June, 1949, in place of the Orders of the 29th November, 1946 (S.R. & O. 1946, No. 2020), and of the 3rd July, 1947, which shall cease to have effect from the 1st June, 1949, in respect of any period after that date.

(2) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, each of the provisions specified in the first column of the following Table shall be deemed to have come into operation on the commencing date specified in the second column of that Table in relation to that provision, so, however, that no payment shall be made by virtue of any of the said provisions in respect of any period before the commencing date as specified in relation to that provision.

(3) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, Article 6, with the words "was his regular occupation up to the 1st July, 1945" substituted for the words "was the most remunerative occupation which, in the opinion of the Minister, accounted for a substantial period of his employment during the period beginning with the 1st July, 1944, and ending with the 1st July, 1945," shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st May, 1948, and shall cease to have effect from the 1st June, 1949.

(4) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, Article 7 (1) shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st March, 1949, provided that, for the purposes of Article 9 and with the figure of 20s. substituted for 26s. wherever the latter appears,

the said Article 7 (1) shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st December, 1947, and to have ceased to have effect from the 1st March, 1949.

(5) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, Article 8 (3) shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st March, 1949:

Provided that—

(a) the said Article 8 (3), with the figure of 20s. substituted for the figure of 26s. wherever the latter appears, shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 18th August, 1948, and to have ceased to have effect from the 1st March, 1949;

(b) the said Article 8 (3), for the purposes of Article 9 and with the figure of 20s. substituted for the figure of 26s. wherever the latter appears, shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st December, 1947, and to have ceased to have effect from the 1st March, 1949.

(6) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, Article 22 (5), with the words "which shall not exceed £68 a year or one half of her husband's appropriate retired pay, whichever is the greater" substituted for the words "in accordance with the rates set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order", shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 5th July, 1948, and shall cease to have effect from the 1st June, 1949.

(7) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, Article 22 (6), with the words "which shall not exceed 26s. a week or one half of the disablement pension granted to her deceased husband, whichever is the greater" substituted for the words "in accordance with the rates set forth in Article 11", shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 5th July, 1948, and shall cease to have effect from the 1st June, 1949.

(8) In relation to any award payable weekly the foregoing references to the 1st December, 1947, the 1st February, 1948, the 1st March, 1948, the 1st April, 1948, and the 1st June, 1949, shall be construed as references to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following the 1st December, 1947, the 1st February, 1948, the 1st March, 1948, the 1st April, 1948, or the 1st June, 1949, as the case may be.

"And whereas by Order-in-Council dated 29th June, 1934, provision is made for the award of the Naval Long Service and Good Conduct Medal without gratuity to all Non-Continuous Service Petty Officers and men serving in Your Majesty's Naval Force on or after the first day of July, 1934, provided they are qualified by length of service and character:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that the Regulations above mentioned require amendment in certain respects:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order-in-Council to direct that all Non-Continuous Service Maltese Officers' Stewards and Cooks and other Non-

Continuous Service Maltese Naval Ratings serving in Your Majesty's Naval Force shall, provided they are qualified by length of service and character be eligible for the award of the Naval Long Service and Good Conduct Medal with gratuity, irrespective of the date of their entry into Your Majesty's Naval Force.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposals."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates 21st March, 1924 and 24th February, 1948, sanction was given, inter alia, to certain scales of gratuities for long service, or on invaliding for non-attributable causes, to Native Petty Officers and Men, other than Europeans, of Your Majesty's Naval Forces:

"And whereas we are of opinion that in so far as they affect Chinese and Malayan Petty Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Naval Forces, these scales of gratuities should be revised, and that provision should be made for the award of service pension in lieu thereof in certain circumstances and subject to certain conditions:

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the amendment of the regulations accordingly in accordance with the proposals set out in the annexed Schedule, with effect from 19th December, 1945.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

"The provisions of this schedule to apply to all Chinese and Malayan ratings of the Royal Navy who are discharged from the Naval Service after the 18th December, 1945. They do not apply to other R.N. Native ratings for whom special provision is or may hereafter be made.

" SECTION 'A.'

"1. *Service Pensions*.—Service pensions granted under this Section will consist of the sum of the elements for service and for rank, and will be assessed as follows:—

"2. A service pension assessed as in Clause 1 may be granted to a Chinese or Malayan R.N. rating who is:—

"(a) released on the termination of his war service, or discharged otherwise than for misconduct, or for inefficiency due to causes within his own control, if he has completed at least 30 years reckonable service;

"(b) invalided, provided he has completed at least 12 years reckonable service;

"(c) discharged on Reduction of Establishment with not less than 22 years reckonable service.

"3. In the case of a Chinese or Malayan R.N. rating discharged for inefficiency due to causes within his own control or for misconduct, or with ignominy, the grant of a pension, and its amount, will be discretionary, but a pension will not in any event be given unless the service which has been forfeited is restored, and the rating has total reckonable service of not less than 30 years.

"4. A Chinese or Malayan R.N. rating may, at Admiralty discretion, be allowed commutation, in whole or in part, of the pension for which he is eligible under Clause 1, the lump sum payment where such commutation is allowed, to be equal to ten times the amount of pension surrendered, provided his age does not exceed 60 years, or at a reduced rate if he is over that age.

"5. Reckonable service for the purpose both of determining entitlement to pension and of assessing the rate of pension will be as for Naval ratings generally.

"6. The provisions of Orders in Council of 28th September, 1944, and 2nd April, 1947, for the increase of certain pensions will not apply to pensions awarded under this Section.

" SECTION 'B.'

"7. *Service Gratuities*.—The provisions of this Section (except where otherwise stated) relate to Chinese and Malayan ratings who enter or re-enter the Service on normal regular engagements after 18th December, 1945, who are discharged without entitlement to pension.

"8. Subject to the following provisions, such a R.N. native rating who has 10 or more years continuous reckonable service immediately preceding his discharge will be granted a service gratuity assessed as follows:—

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"9. Reckonable service will be the same as for service pensions under Clause 5 and for Naval ratings generally.

"11. A service gratuity will not be admissible on re-engagement or on discharge for the purpose of giving further full pay service in the Armed Forces.

"12. If a R.N. native rating dies while serving, no gratuity will be payable under this Section.

A Chinese or Malayan R.N. rating serving on a normal regular engagement on the 19th December, 1945, will on discharge or release from full pay service, be eligible for gratuity under the above conditions but the amount of the gratuity will be calculated only on service given after the 18th December, 1945, as follows:—

"We, the Church Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts' and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, and of the Church Commissioners Measure, 1947, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Methley, in the County of York and Diocese of Ripon:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Methley has been improved under and by virtue of two leases dated the 7th day of May, 1936, and

the 23rd day of December, 1937, granted under the authority of the said Acts by a former incumbent of the said Benefice of glebe minerals belonging to such Benefice and by virtue of the payment of compensation under the Coal Act, 1938:

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 24th February, 1938, and published in the London Gazette on the 1st March, 1938, there was ratified a Scheme of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners under which there was to be appropriated to their Common Fund a portion of the improved income resulting from the said leases, which portion included the rents and royalties payable under the said leases after the interest or dividends arising from the investment by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners of such rents and royalties had amounted to an annual sum of £64:

"And whereas on the 1st day of July, 1942, being the vesting date under the Coal Act, 1938, the rents and royalties reserved by the said leases ceased to be payable to the incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Methley and the interest or dividends representing the investment of such rents and royalties received up to the said vesting date amounted to £61 9s. 4d. per annum only:

"And whereas by virtue of paragraph 21 (4) of the 3rd schedule (Part IV) of the Coal Act, 1938, the whole of the compensation under the Act was payable to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as if it had been money payable upon a sale under the Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts, subject only to the terms of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council in regard to the rents and royalties under the said leases and to the said sum of £64 per annum:

"And whereas a capital sum of £8,130 1s. 11d. was paid to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as such compensation and a further sum of £14 5s. 3d. was subsequently paid to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners in respect of a refund of income tax on rents and royalties reserved by the said leases and the total amount of £8,144 7s. 2d. was invested by them in sums of £2,007 7s. 2d. £3 per cent. Savings Bonds (1965-75) and £6,137 0s. 0d. £3 per cent. Savings Bonds (1960-70):

"And whereas there has been assigned to the said Benefice of Methley a sum of £84 8s. 11d. £3 per cent. Savings Bonds (1965-75), being part of the said sum of £2,007 7s. 2d. Bonds of that denomination, in order to provide the balance of the said sum of £64 per annum:

"And whereas the interest or dividends arising from the balance of £1,922 18s. 3d. £3 per cent. Savings Bonds (1965-75) and from the sum of £6,137 0s. 0d. £3 per cent. Savings Bonds (1960-70) represents a further improvement of the income of the benefice which is at present in excess of £600 per annum:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Methley is now vacant by the resignation thereof from the Right Reverend John Norman Bateman-Champain:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette, there shall be appropriated for the benefit of our General Fund the sums of £1,922 18s. 3d. £3 per cent. Savings Bonds (1965-75) and of £6,137 0s. 0d. £3 per cent. Savings Bonds (1960-70) to be applied as in the said Acts and Measures mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measures or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts and Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, the parish or cure of Ampfield shall be transferred from the rural deanery of Winchester to the rural deanery of Romsey and, secondly, the parish or cure of Nursling shall be transferred from the said rural deanery of Romsey to the rural deanery of Southampton all of which rural deaneries are in the archdeaconry of Winchester, and each of the said parishes or cures shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the rural dean of the rural deanery to which it is hereby transferred and shall not belong to or be a part of any other rural deanery, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other rural dean."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"Whereas we the Church Commissioners are satisfied (1) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parish of Saint Mark, Lakenham, and of the parish of Lakenham should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and as delineated on the map hereto annexed and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is within the area described in Part II of the said Schedule a consecrated church known as the church of Saint Alban, Lakenham, which has been approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish and of which the patronage belongs to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of The Holy and Undivided Trinity in Norwich by virtue of an agreement in writing dated the 28th day of April, 1949, and made pursuant to Section 9 of the New Parishes Measure, 1943:

"Now, therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme (a) the boundaries of the said parish of Saint Mark, Lakenham, and of the said parish of Lakenham shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the said Schedule and as delineated on the map annexed hereto and (b) the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map shall be a new parish.

"2. The church of Saint Alban, Lakenham, aforesaid shall be the parish church of the parish.

"3. The name of the parish shall be 'The Parish of Saint Alban, Lakenham'.

"4. The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Norwich and in the rural deanery of Norwich.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"Part I.

"The territory (shown by the blue colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Saint Mark, Lakenham:—

"All that portion of the parish of Lakenham which is bounded upon the south-east by the parish of Saint Mark, Lakenham, upon the north-east by the parish of All Saints, Norwich, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of All Saints, Norwich from the parish of Lakenham, opposite to the middle of the north-eastern end of Grove Road and continuing thence south-westwards along the middle of Grove Road to a point in the middle of the Norwich Goods Branch Line of the British Railways (Eastern Region) and continuing thence south-eastwards along the middle of the said railway line to the boundary which divides the parish of Lakenham from the parish of Saint Mark, Lakenham.

"Part II.

"The area comprising:—

"The extra parochial place known as the 'Liberty of the Town Close' (shown by the pink colour on the map) together with all those contiguous portions of the parish of Lakenham and of the parish of Saint Mark, Lakenham (shown by the brown and green colours respectively on the map) which taken together are bounded upon part of the north-west by the extra parochial place known as the 'Liberty of the Town Close', upon the remaining part of the north-west and upon the north-east by the parish of Saint Stephen, Norwich, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing

at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Stephen, Norwich, and the parish of All Saints, Norwich, from the parish of Lakenham, opposite to the middle of the north-eastern end of Grove Road and continuing thence south-westwards along the middle of Grove Road to a point in the middle of the Norwich Goods Branch Line of the British Railways (Eastern Region) and continuing thence south-eastwards along the middle of the said railway line to a point in the middle of the bridge which carries Hall Road over the said railway line and continuing thence south-westwards along the middle of Hall Road to a point opposite to the eastern end of the middle of Lakenham Road and continuing thence westwards along the middle of Lakenham Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Lakenham from the extra parochial place known as the 'Liberty of the Town Close'."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

Cambridge.—Forthwith and entirely in such portions of the Mill Road Burial Ground, Cambridge, as are assigned to the Parishes of All Saints, St. Clements, St. Edward, St. Mary the Great, St. Andrew the Great, Holy Trinity, St. Michael, St. Paul, Holy Sepulchre and St. Benedict.

Provided that—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portions of the said Burial Ground, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said portions of the said Burial Ground, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said portions of the said Burial Ground, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may

be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Cambridge) Order, 1949.

The KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal to Charles Wilcox in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On Tuesday, 23rd August, 1949, Mr. Charles Wilcox (aged 30), a painter employed by Birmingham Corporation, was engaged with other men in painting a Council House building in the centre of the city.

One of the other painters, Alfred Leslie Burrows (aged 21) mounted a ladder to begin painting an exterior window on the third floor of the building, and at the top of the ladder, about forty-five feet above the street, climbed on to an arched sill about eighteen inches in width which was sited below the window. He then found that the window was bricked up from the inside and that there was nothing for him to hold to enable him to retain his balance. He turned round to return to the ladder but could not see it, became frightened, and crouched down trying to retain his balance on the ledge.

The foreman painter saw Burrows' predicament and sent another painter to his assistance but this man returned to the ground after supporting Burrows for a few minutes. Charles Wilcox then climbed the ladder to assist Burrows and by kneeling on a flat piece of masonry, some eighteen inches square, at the end of the arch was able to support the other man who was suffering from severe shock. Mr. Wilcox stayed in this position for forty-five minutes until the Fire Brigade arrived and Burrows who had become unconscious was brought to the ground, by a fireman, in a safety belt which Wilcox strapped upon him.

During the period that Mr. Wilcox was on the ledge with Burrows he was in considerable danger of falling had the other man kicked out or made any violent movement.

RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS TO THE PROFESSIONAL ACCOUNTANT CLASS.

1. Age. Candidates must be at least 25 and under 35 years of age on 1st August, 1949. But—

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age;

(b) a candidate who has served or is serving voluntarily in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular or short service engagement or who has performed or is performing compulsory national service under the National Service Acts may deduct the period of such service from his actual age, up to a maximum of two years.

2. Sex and Marriage. (i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations, but women will not be eligible for appointment to the War Office.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who are widowed or

divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

3. *Nationality.* Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either:

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in His Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with His Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment under the Admiralty, War Office, or Ministry of Supply unless he or she is a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted to competition or appointment by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty, Secretary of State for War, or Minister of Supply, as the case may be.

4. *Qualifications.* Candidates are required to be members of one or more of the following bodies on the closing date for the receipt of applications:—

(a) Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.

(b) Society of Incorporated Accountants and Auditors.

(c) Society of Accountants in Edinburgh.

(d) Institute of Accountants and Actuaries in Glasgow.

(e) Society of Accountants in Aberdeen.

(f) Institute of Chartered Accountants in Ireland.

(g) Association of Certified and Corporate Accountants.

They should be capable of working without detailed supervision and are required to have had suitable experience, either before or after qualification, in a professional office.

5. *Health and Character.* Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. *Competition.* The Commissioners may summon to appear before a Selection Board all who are found to be prima facie eligible, or may, if they see fit, summon only those whose qualifications and experience are considered to be most suitable. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of education and experience, any recommendations from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above facts they will frame their recommendations. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

SPECIAL ROADS ACT, 1949.
