"Whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-second day of January, 1920, Schedule B, the titles of certain Warrant Officers and Officers promoted from Warrant rank were revised:

"And whereas from time to time certain other alterations to Warrant Officer titles have been provided for by various subsequent Orders in Council:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that the title 'Warrant Officer' and the term 'Warrant List' in use in the Royal Navy and Royal Marines should no longer be used but be replaced by 'Branch Officer' and 'Branch List' respectively:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh of April, 1948, rates of pay were laid down for Warrant Officers and Officers promoted therefrom which we now wish to apply to Officers on the Branch List:

"And whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services

in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the proposals contained in the Schedule annexed hereto with effect from the 5th day of April, 1949, in substitution for the provisions previously authorised, which changes involve the appointment by commission of those Warrant Officers hitherto appointed by warrant but otherwise no change in rates of pay, uniform, or duties.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"TITLES OF WARRANT OFFICERS AND OFFICERS PROMOTED FROM WARRANT RANK.

"The term 'Warrant List' to be abolished and to be known in future as the 'Branch List'; the generic title for officers on this list to be 'Branch Officers'. All officers on the Branch List to be appointed by commission. Their rates of pay to be as laid down for corresponding Warrant Officers (Naval and Royal Marine) and officers promoted therefrom in Order in Council dated 27th April, 1948.

The Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949, relating to members of the naval forces as therein defined, shall be amended in the respects set out in the following Articles of this Order.

1. Article 22 of the Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949 (which provides for the award in certain cases of allowances for part-time treatment) shall be amended by substituting for the figures 21s. and 30s. the figures 25s. and 35s. respectively.

2. This Order shall be construed as one with the Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949, and shall come into operation on the 1st November, 1949.

The Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949, relating to officers, nurses and ratings as therein defined, shall be amended in the respects set out in the following Articles of this Order in Council.

1. Article 10 of the Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949, shall be amended by substituting for the figures 21s. and 30s. the figures 25s. and 35s. respectively.

2. Paragraph (3) of Article 22 of the Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949 shall be deleted and there shall be substituted therefor the following paragraph:—

"(3) (a) In the Table in the Second Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order for the figures £168

in column (3), £168 in column (4) and £126 in column (5) there shall be substituted the figures £170, £180 and £170 respectively; and for the figures £140, £120, £120 and £90 in columns (2), (3), (4) and (5) there shall be substituted—

(i) against the reference in column (1) to a Lieutenant, R.N. and Lieutenant, R.M. with over 4 years' commissioned service, the figures £165, £150, £165 and £150 respectively; and

(ii) against the reference in column (1) to a Sub-Lieutenant, R.N., Lieutenant, R.M. with less than 4 years' commissioned service, Second Lieutenant, R.M. and Quartermaster, R.M., the figures £150, £130, £150 and £130 respectively.

(b) In the Table in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, for the figures £105 and £90 in column (2) and £90 and £75 in column (3) there shall be substituted the figures £150, £125, £130 and £105 respectively."

3.—(1) This Order shall be construed as one with the Order in Council dated 29th September, 1949, and, subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this Article, shall come into operation on the 1st November, 1949.

(2) Article 2 of this Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st June, 1949.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

1. This Order amends the Order of the 29th September, 1949, concerning pensions and other grants for disablement and death due to naval service during the 1914 World War.

2. Article 1 provides for an increase in the allowances for part-time treatment.

3. Article 2 provides for an increase in the rates of the pensions payable to certain widows of officers to the rates payable to comparable widows of officers whose deaths occurred as the result of service after the 2nd September, 1939.

"We, the Church Commissioners for England, have prepared and now lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme pursuant to the Episcopal Endowments and Stipends Measure, 1943, for vesting in us, the said Church Commissioners, all endowments and other property belonging to or held in trust for the Bishopric of Norwich or the Bishop thereof and for securing to the said Bishop the reduced stipend deemed to us appropriate:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Percy Mark Bishop of Norwich was in occupation of the See at the date of the passing of the aforesaid Measure and has requested us, the said Church Commissioners, to prepare a Scheme with respect to the See:

"And whereas we have prepared this Scheme accordingly after consultation with the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese of Norwich who have offered no objection thereto:

"And whereas the said Percy Mark Bishop of Norwich has approved the Scheme and in testimony of such approval has appended his signature to the Scheme:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Clement Richard Attlee, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, has signified to us his consent to the preparation and submission of the Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas the endowments and property belonging to the See of Norwich or held in trust

therefor or for the Bishop thereof are described and referred to in the Schedule hereunder written:

"Now therefore, we the said Church Commissioners recommend and propose that upon and from the first day of July, 1949, all the endowments securities and other property described and referred to in the said Schedule and all other if any the endowments belonging to or held in trust for the said Bishopric shall vest in us the said Church Commissioners pursuant to the said Measure and that we shall be entitled absolutely to the benefit rents and profit thereof upon and from that date:

"And we further recommend and propose that we shall pay to the Bishop for the time being of the See by equal quarterly instalments in respect of the quarters ended on the first day of April the first day of July the first day of October and the first day of January in every year the first such instalment to be the full quarter's payment due for the quarter ended on the first day of October 1949 an annual stipend comprising the sum of £2,200 and also such sum, not exceeding £600 in any one year, as we shall have been duly satisfied has been expended by him in connection with the travelling required in and for the carrying out of his official duties and obligations as Bishop:

"THE SCHEDULE

"PART I.

"All that Episcopal Residence or Mansion House known as The Palace Norwich together with the garage cottages outbuildings and other buildings and the gardens pleasure grounds and other the appurtenances thereunto belonging and situate in the city of Norwich as the same premises are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and thereon verged red."

"PART II.

(1) 'All the lands and hereditaments described in the Table annexed hereto being the lands and hereditaments which by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the 9th day of July, 1864, and published in the London Gazette of the 12th day of July, 1864, were assigned as the endowment of the See of Norwich except such parts thereof as have since been disposed of by sale exchange or otherwise according to law.'

(2) 'The interest of the Bishop in any consideration money paid on the sale of any land comprised in the said Table completed prior to the date of the vesting of the Bishop's Estates in Us.'

"PART III.

"The following sums of stock representing the proceeds of sales of lands and tithe rent charges forming part of the endowment of the See and other transactions relating to such lands and tithe rent charges being redemption stock issued to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Bishop in respect of Tithe Rent Charges forming part of the endowment of the said See on the passing of the Tithe Act, 1936, and by the said Governors transferred to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England namely:—

(a) £146 12s. 11d. 3 per cent. Funding Stock (1959-69).

(b) £12,716 14s. 3d. 3 per cent. Redemption Stock (1986-96).

(c) £48,572 6s. 1d. 2½ per cent. Treasury Stock (1975-).

(d) £19,849 17s. 7d. 3½ per cent. Conversion Stock (1961-).

(e) £5,353 9s. 11d. London County 2½ per cent. Stock.

(f) £475 5s. 8d. 3 per cent. Savings Bonds (1960-70).

(g) £95 10s. 11d. British Transport 3 per cent. Guaranteed Stock (1978-88).

"All the Plate Pictures Furniture Ornaments Books and other goods and chattels belonging to the Bishop of Norwich in right of his dignity and not in his private capacity and being in the nature of heirlooms of the See which are described and set forth in an inventory to be deposited in the Diocesan Registry of the Diocese of Norwich."

"We the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Guy Vernon, Bishop of Leicester (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Lutterworth and the benefice of Cotesbach both situate in the diocese of Leicester.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Lutterworth and the benefice of Cotesbach shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Lutterworth with Cotesbach' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect in every four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice the patron of the benefice of Lutterworth shall have the first, the third and the fourth turns and the patron of the benefice of Cotesbach shall have the second turn.

"5. *Provision for Clerical or Lay Assistance.* (1) Upon the union taking effect a curate shall be employed by the incumbent to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, but in the event of the services of a whole-time curate not being available the incumbent shall employ such clerical or such lay assistance as the Bishop of Leicester may from time to time direct. (2) There shall be appropriated as a fund towards the cost of providing such assistance as aforesaid a part of the endowments of the united benefice, that is to say, so much of the money appropriated to the benefice of Cotesbach pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, as will produce £150 per annum and the said fund shall be paid by us to the Board of Finance of the diocese as trustees to apply the same accordingly."

The KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal (in Silver) to Frank Bradley and the Edward Medal (in Bronze) to Oswald George Simmonds and Thomas George Manwaring in recognition of their gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 30th June, 1949, the Arthur and Edward Colliery, Forest of Dean, was flooded by a sudden inrush of water.

Evacuation of the mine was ordered as soon as the water broke in, and the escape of the men who were underground was greatly helped by Frank Bradley, a man of 63, who took charge of the man-riding trolleys which ran up and down the long, steep main road leading to the shaft, and helped the escaping men to travel swiftly over part of their road to safety.

After many men had been helped in this way another official advised Bradley to escape at once, telling him that the rising flood would soon cut off the main shaft. Bradley, however, refused to leave the pit, saying that some of his men were still underground. He thereupon walked back into the inner working of the mine. At this point it should be emphasised that Bradley acted deliberately and without rashness, although he knew that once he was cut off from the main shaft he would have to stay below ground for a long time and that he might never reach the surface again. As an official of the mine he must have known also that blackdamp (carbon dioxide) was given off in the mine and that the stopping of ventilation by the flood made accumulations of this suffocating gas likely. He must also have known that there was an incalculable danger to be expected from the disturbance to roof supports caused by the flood.

While Bradley was helping with the evacuation another official of the mine, Oswald George Simmonds was showing great calmness in the face of danger. He went round his district ordering his men out of the pit and telling them how to reach the main shaft safely through the flooding roads. When he was himself about to leave he heard that two men, one old and feeble, were still left in the workings. He immediately returned to help them. When he found them, they were with a third man, Thomas George Manwaring, who had voluntarily stayed back to help them.

Simmonds and Manwaring, helping and sometimes carrying the old men along with them, made their way towards the main shaft, meeting Bradley on the way. At the first opportunity they telephoned to the surface and were told that the flood cut them off completely from the main shaft, but that they might be able to reach a second shaft through the workings of the mine.

Bradley, Simmonds and Manwaring set off, taking with them the other two men, of whom one was practically exhausted. The way to the second shaft was very hard, and the air in places very bad. The men had in some places to wade through torrents of water, and in others had to clamber over falls of ground. They never, however, abandoned their weaker comrades, one of whom at times was so exhausted that he had to be pushed along in a truck. Eventually, after spending nearly seven hours underground struggling through the flooded mine, the party reached the second shaft and were hauled to safety.

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to Margaret Vaughan and the late John Howard Davies for their gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On May 28th, 1949, a party of Scouts, aged between 11 and 15 years, visiting Sully Island were cut off by the rising tide from a causeway which led to the mainland. Most of the boys got safely

across, but two of them were forced off the causeway by the strong tide. The leader of the party returned to help the elder boy but in the struggle he too became exhausted. Margaret Vaughan (aged 14 years) saw from the beach the difficulties they were in. She undressed and swam towards them over a distance of some 30 yards in cold, rough water and against strong currents due to the rising tide. On reaching them she towed the boy to the shore while he supported himself by grasping the straps of her costume and his leader's coat. At about ten feet from the shore a life belt was thrown in which the boy was placed by the other two and the three reached the shore safely. Margaret Vaughan's action probably saved the life of the Scout leader as well as that of the elder boy.

Meanwhile, John Howard Davies (aged 13 years) had safely reached the mainland when he saw that his friend, who was unable to swim, was being forced away from the causeway into deep water. He stripped to the waist and went back along the causeway to help him. By swimming out he was able to grasp his friend and hold him up in the water. Both boys shouted for help and it was obvious that they would not get ashore unaided. By this time a rescue boat had put out from the shore but Davies became exhausted by his efforts and before the boat could reach them he was forced to release his hold on his friend and they drifted apart. The boat rescued the friend but no further sign of Davies was seen. His body was subsequently recovered. There is no doubt that in returning to the aid of his friend after he himself had reached safety Davies gave his life in this rescue attempt.
