WHEREAS We consider it desirable that Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December next, should be observed as a holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland:

We do hereby appoint the said twenty-seventh day of December to be observed as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland and by this Our Royal Proclamation command the said day to be so observed and all Our loving subjects

day to be so observed and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly:

And We do further hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, appoint the said twenty-seventh day of December to be observed in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday under and in accordance with the said Acts.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this Twenty-fifth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, and in the Thirteenth year of Our Reign.

"Whereas by the Naval Knights of Windsor (Dissolution) Act, 1892, it was enacted, inter alia, that the Admiralty should after deducting the necessary and proper expenses of the management of the property transferred to the Admiralty by virtue of that Act apply the income of the property in granting such pensions to Retired Officers of the rank of Lieutenant in the Navy or to Officers of the Navy who have retired from the Active List of Lieutenants with the rank of Commander in the Navy and under such conditions as Her late Majesty might from time to time by Order in Council direct and that such pensions should be distinguished as Travers pensions.

"2. And whereas by Order in Council of 3rd March, 1894, we were authorised to establish such number of Travers pensions of £75 a year each as the available funds accruing from the income of the property transferred to the Admiralty under the said Act might admit of and to award them at our discretion to Officers of the rank of Lieutenant

in the Royal Navy or Officers of the Navy who have retired from the Active List of Lieutenants with the rank of Commander subject to the condition

with the rank of Commander subject to the condition that no Officer shall hold a Travers and Greenwich Hospital or Naval pension at the same time.

"3. And whereas we are of the opinion that it is expedient that the fixed rate of £75 a year for these pensions should be abolished and that we should be authorised instead at our discretion to apply the income of the said property after deducting the necessary and proper expenses of management as aforesaid in granting Travers pensions to Officers of the said ranks who are selected as most deserving of them on grounds of good service, need and compassion but at a rate of pension not exceeding £100 a year to any one Officer to be payable to them as we may think fit in addition to any pension or other allowance provided that no Officer shall hold a Travers Pension and a Greenwich Hospital Pension at the same time.

"4. We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction this proposal with effect from the 1st April, 1949, without prejudice to the continuance of Travers pensions awarded before that date under the former regulations."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"And whereas the said benefices of North Grimston and Wharram Percy with Wharram le Street now held in plurality by the Reverend Frederick John Costeloe:
