On 19th August, 1949, a boy was stranded about 100 feet above the ground on the cliff face at the rear of the Drill Hall, Liverpool Street, Dover. R.S.M. Robert Charles Watt MITCHELL, at great personal risk, climbed the cliff face and, although in great danger of falling backwards, succeeded in reaching the boy and helping him to maintain his hold until help came. The boy was then hauled into safety and R.S.M. Mitchell was then, by the aid of a rope, lowered down the cliff face to the ground.
