WHEREAS We have in Our Council thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, on Wednesday the First day of March next ensuing the date hereof: In order, therefore, to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, issue

forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at the Palace of Holyroodhouse, in Edin-burgh, on Tuesday the Twenty-first day of February instant at Twelve o'clock Noon to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the soid ensuine Parliament by one choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law); and the Lord Clerk Register or the Principal Clerk of Session or, in the absence of both these Officers from any cause, such person as may be designated for the purpose by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, is hereby required to attend such Meeting and to take the Votes of the said Peers and immediately after such Election made and duly examined to certify the names of the Sixteen Peers so elected and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said names of the Sixteen Peers so elected and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Lord Provost of Edin-burgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said City, to take especial care to preserve the Peace thereof during the time of the said Election, and to prevent all manner of Riots, Tumults, Disorders and Violence whatsoever: And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Ten Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such Election. WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 24th day of January, 1950 (C.W.3514/49), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 13th July, 1928, the 27th October, 1930, and the 21st July, 1932, regulations were laid down to govern the qualification of officers of Your Majesty's Navy and Royal Marines as Interpreters in certain modern foreign languages:

"And whereas we consider it desirable to modify and supplement the above regulations:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of the regulations shown in the attached Schedules, in substitution for those given in the Orders in Council above referred to.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE I.

"Requirements of officers with language qualifications to be met by selecting volunteers for training from officers of or below the actual or relative rank of Commander (except Medical and Dental Officers and Chaplains), and Royal Marine officers of or below the rank of Major, who are desirous of qualifying for Interpreter in any of the languages mentioned in Schedule II.

"2. Language study to be undertaken as a matter of Service duty and officers to be eligible, during periods of language study, for normal pay and allowance, including local overseas allowance (where applicable), as well as, when studying abroad, a monthly tuition allowance based on the costs in the countries concerned. Cost of tuition in the United Kingdom to be defrayed directly from Navy Votes.

"3. Awards to be payable to officers on qualifying as 1st Class Interpreter in the various languages specified according to the scale given in Schedule II, under such conditions as the Admiralty may specify from time to time. Officers qualifying as 2nd Class Interpreters not to be eligible for any award except that officers qualifying as 2nd Class Interpreters in Japanese, Mandarin and Cantonese, will receive half the amount referred to in Schedule II.

"4. Officers on the list of Interpreters to requalify after such periods and under such regulations as the Admiralty may specify, and prior to re-examination to be allowed, at Admiralty discretion, to study abroad at public expense under the conditions laid down in paragraph 2 of this Schedule for such periods as may at Admiralty discretion be considered necessary. Awards to be paid on requalification at one third of the full rate specified in Schedule II.

"5. Officers qualified for the instruction in foreign languages of Commissioned and Junior Officers on board H.M. Ships to receive five shillings for each lesson (of one hour's duration), the number of lessons for which payment is to be made to any individual not to exceed four a week.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the posthumous award of the Albert Medal to the undermentioned for gallantry in attempting to save life at sea:

Lieutenant Frederick Joseph HINDES, Royal Navy. On the 12th January 1950, H.M. Submarine TRUCULENT was in collision with the Swedish Tanker DIVINA in the Thames Estuary and sank almost immediately. Lieutenant Hindes, who was First Lieutenant of the submarine, was down below at the time of the collision. By his calm demeanour and clear orders he maintained perfect discipline and was able to ensure that the greater part of those on board moved safely to the engine room and after end of the vessel before she sank. He then divided the men, probably about sixty, between the two compartments and himself took charge of the escape arrangements in the after end. When all was ready he opened the escape hatch but, despite having told one hand to hold on to him, he was blown violently out of the boat and was not seen again. Yet the sense of order which Lieutenant Hindes had instilled survived him and it is probable that all those in the after end got clear of the submarine. clear orders he maintained perfect discipline and was after end got clear of the submarine.

Chief Engine Room Artificer Francis Walter HINE, D.S.M., P/MX 47321.

After the men had been divided and the water tight door between the after end and the engine room had been closed, Chief Engine Room Artificer Hine took charge of the escape arrangements for the men

in the engine room. This duty he performed fault-lessly, taking care that the limited number of escape sets were allotted to the weakest swimmers and ensuring that the least experienced men were care-fully reminded of the correct drill. Chief Engine Room Artificer Hine was the last man to leave the engine room and it is known that he reached the surface in safety but was not picked up.

The conduct of all who went down in the sub-marine was in full accord with the great traditions of the Royal Navy but the splendid example set by Lieutenant Hindes and Chief Engine Room Artificer Hine was beyond praise.
