**UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923.**

A Statute made by Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 24th February, 1950, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923".

In accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of the above mentioned Act, it is hereby notified that the Right Honourable Viscount Alexander of Hillsborough, C.H., was appointed Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster on the 2nd March, 1950, and remains a member of the Cabinet.
