PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865 (28 & 29 Vict. c. 73), it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in His Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient to make further provision concerning retired pay, pensions and other grants for officers, nurses and ratings disabled, and for the widows and children of officers and ratings deceased, in consequence of service during the 1914 World War, and to provide for the administration of this Order in Council by the Minister of Pensions:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Him thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949, relating to officers, nurses and ratings as therein defined, as amended by the Order in Council dated the 28th October, 1949, shall be amended in the respects set out in the following Articles of this Order in Council.

1. In paragraph (3) (a) of Article 22 of the Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949 (as so amended) there shall be inserted after the words "In the Table in the Second Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order" the words "for the figures £600, £450, £375, £300, £260, £220 and £200 in column (4) there shall be substituted the figures £700, £540, £440, £350, £290, £230 and £210 respectively; for the figures £600, £450, £375, £300, £240, £180 and £162 in column (5) there shall be substituted the figures £700, £540, £440, £350, £290, £230 and £210 respectively";

2. This Order shall be construed as one with the Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949, as amended by the Order in Council dated the 28th October, 1949, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st June, 1949.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Cran Measures Act, 1908 (8 Edw. 7. c. 17), it is provided that an Inspector of Weights and Measures may take in

respect of the verification and marking of a measure under the said Act such fees as may be specified by Order in Council and no others:

And Whereas the Board of Trade have represented to His Majesty that it would be expedient to specify new fees to be paid upon the verification and marking of a measure under the said Act in substitution for the fees specified in an Order in Council dated the 23rd day of January, 1911, specifying fees to be taken on verification and marking of measures under the said Act by inspectors of local authorities (S.R. & O. 1911 (No. 101) 451):

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of Section 4 of the said Act and of all other powers in that behalf enabling Him, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The fees which may be taken by an inspector of weights and measures in respect of the verification and marking of a measure under the said Act shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto in substitution for those specified in the said Order in Council which is hereby revoked.

2. This Order may be cited as the Weights and Measures (Cran Measures: Verification and Marking Fees) Order, 1950, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1950.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas there is within the said area a consecrated church known as Saint John the Evangelist which has been approved by us, the said Church
